

Can Any Good Come Out of Nazareth?

...I was passing through some trials that seemed most unbearable. Every way I would look I could see nothing but an ugly picture with shame and suffering; and the nature of some of these trials was

such that they were exposed out where everyone could behold them, which made the pricking all the sharper and more cutting. While suffering from day to day the Scripture kept coming to me, "Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth?" After several days of this ringing in my ears I began to meditate thereon and I gathered this little message, so I feel like passing it on. It helped me; maybe it will you.

We find that Nazareth was a very small town within the limits of the province of Galilee near Cana. There was nothing much that was desirable to behold. Above the town there were some rocky ledges over which a person could not be thrown without almost certain destruction. All the inhabitants of Galilee were looked upon with contempt by the people of Judea because they spoke a ruder dialect, were less cultivated and were more exposed by their position to contact with the heathen. But Nazareth labored under a special opprobrium, for it was a Galilean and not a southern Jew who asked the reproachful question whether any good thing could come out of Nazareth. (St. John 1:46.) The word opprobrium means the disgrace that follows from, or is attached to, conduct considered evil or wrong; reproach with disdain or contempt; scurrilous or abusive language.

Although Nazareth suffered under these shameful reproaches the best Jewel that earth beneath or heaven above could afford came out of Nazareth—Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the one who conquered death, hell, and the grave—came forth to resurrect our dead souls, and bring us to the place where we can daily walk and talk with God, and give us power over all the power of the wicked one.

God had a purpose in his Son: He was a Lamb slain from the foundation of the world, the one to fulfill the prophecy concerning the great plan of redemption. Although he came through the way of suffering, through shame and disgrace, was rejected by his own, persecuted, forsaken, nailed to the cross, shamefully treated right in the hours of death, yet death could not hold him. He came forth to give us life, life! Oh, eternal life! He was the only source for our salvation.

Look at Him there, dear friends, when He suffered the rebukes from a cold, cruel world. Look at Him suffering shame by being spit upon, by being scourged. Look at Him in the garden, weeping in agony for you and me. Look at Him bearing His cross to Calvary. Look at Him as He hung there when His disciples had fled and seemingly God had forsaken Him. Look at Him dying for you. Can we not say, all good came out of Nazareth? a power that causes men to tremble, a power that caused the rocks to rent, the graves to open, and I say a power that brought some of the dead saints out of their graves and they walked about in the city. And, yea, can we not see good flowing from His precious life to comfort the hearts of troubled souls, see His power to forgive men of their sins, see them walking in newness of life, see the dead raised to life again, mother's hearts comforted? See the lame walking, the blind seeing! Look at the many hearts that were made glad when their troubled souls were touched by divine power and their desires were granted. Yea, can we not say all good came out of the little city that was looked upon with shame and reproach?

Now let us turn the question around to our lives. Have we not many times when in severe trials, asked the question: "Can there any good come out of this?" knowing that the Scripture says, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose." Jesus was the called according to God's purpose, His suffering brought Him to the place where He is the one central character of human history, the pivot around which the events of ages revolve and the only regenerator of the human race. In Christ lay the whole plan of God.

Joseph was the called of God in his day. He was a life-saver to the people in his time. Can we take a look at Joseph for awhile? See him a lad with his father and his brethren. Look at him there telling his dream to the brothers, then look and see down in their hearts that envious spirit, a spirit of jealousness that was as cruel as the grave coming against the innocent lad.

See him there with the coat of many colors and the rage from his brothers that no doubt crushed his very soul. See the young lad walking over rocks and hills taking his brothers something to eat and as he came near them, see and hear one say the reproachful words: "Look, there comes that dreamer." See them put him down into the pit then afterward sell him. See the tender youth going farther and farther away from his home, among strangers where he would be without any parental love around him. See him in Potiphar's house and then after he won the confidence of Potiphar, see him fleeing from a sinful woman. See him suffering while she told her falsehood to her husband. See him in all humility of heart suffer the wrong rather than speak against the wife of one that was once his friend, but because of the lie that was told the friendship was broken. See him on his way to the prison and there suffering for years yet for no wrong he had done. Friends, he was the called according to God's purpose.

In his suffering there was no good in sight, yet one day there sprang forth a ray of light when he was called from the dark walls of the prison and in a short while he stood before the king telling the king the meaning of his dreams. See him suffering patiently all these years while under the weighty hand of trial, but finally he came out to a place of honor; yet he was just as humble in the king's court as he was behind the prison walls.

He fulfilled his calling and God blessed him and all his house. All things were working for God's glory and Joseph's good. He was a "Nazarethite" for God, suffering shame, reproach, and disgrace and good came out of his precious life. That good not only blessed him and the people in his time but also the good has reached thousands of precious hearts down through ages as they have gone through the dark hours of life, and even to us.

Through the many years in which he suffered he had plenty of time to think of his troubles and could have mourned over them and a gloom could have settled down over him had he not trusted in the God of heaven that is able to make the impossible things possible. There could no good be seen while he labored under shame, disgrace, and cruelity. But in God's own time, in his own way He brought good out of all the dark places Joseph went through; and I say that good is reaching us today and his faithful life feeds our souls and strengthens us in the dark hours we pursue.

Are we a "Nazarethite" for God? Have we been placed in a city of trial, exposed to the gaze of everyone that looks? Are we laboring under a special opprobrium, suffering shame, disgrace, and contemptious reproach? and as we look does the question arise in our minds, "Can there any good come out of this strange place in which I am?" While we suffer from the one outstanding trial, do we feel many sharp, cutting and pricking blows coming from every side thus causing the way to become more dark and the load heavier? And as you look, you see many dangerous places in which you could be killed spiritually if you would venture out to the rocky cliffs. As you think of the danger, do you feel the need of being very cautious? Are you walking very humble before the Lord and had you rather suffer any wrong than to suffer from a sin on your soul?

Oh, my friends, we meet with many rocky cliffs in the city of trial. We could be overthrown if we would loose our hold on the cord of love from the power house. But as we hold to this cord it lifts us away from every rocky cliff and causes us to come out without any hurt to our souls. One of the big rocky cliffs is an unforgiving spirit, and many others such as envy, jealousy, strife, and hatred. Any of these rocky cliffs, if we come near them, is almost sure destruction. How careful we must be not to be overthrown and tumble down, down, down.

Can we say we know things are working together for our good? Do we love God? Are we the called according to God's purpose? Are you, my brother

and sister, willing for God to work out His purpose in your life? God desires to see His image in us and for His image to be seen there is a process of suffering we all must go through. God wants us tender and mellow. As He permits us to go into the town of Nazareth suffering and laboring under heavy weights of different kinds, He will also cause us to come out (if we yield to Him) filled with a good that will feed many dear hearts even after our bodies are mouldering in the dust.

Remember, God wants His purpose worked out in our lives. We are not our own, we are bought with a price; and it will cost us something to be true to God to still be His friend no matter what He permits to come our way. To be a friend is to have solemn and tender education of soul from day to day. It takes a great soul to be a true friend. A friend will forgive much, forget much, and forbear much. It costs to be a friend; and if we are a true friend to souls we are the friend of God. God works with the souls for whom Christ died to bring us to the place where He is fully glorified in our lives. This ofttimes comes as He brings us through the weighty trials that come to us. God will test us.

He wants us to bear fruit for Him in the darkest hours of our lives. There are many little flowers that bloom all through the wintery days and are just as beautiful when spring comes as though they never went through the cold. One writer says God's providence is like nature: the sun never rises too late, the stars never too early. In providence everything comes in its set time. All wrongs done unto us, when touched by God's divine touch, are translated into blessing. In this we can say with Paul, "For we know that all things work together for good to them that love God. to them who are the called according to His purpose." But not until afterward will we see our disappointments, hardships, trials, misfortunes, and the wrongs done unto us by others are all made part of God's providence. But the afterward is sure if we keep our hand off. God works slowly, from a human standpoint, and we cannot hurry Him.

Dear child of God, if your life has been filled with burdens, look away to the One who can solve every problem. He can help you through. His strength is made perfect in weakness. He can bring you to a haven of bliss with a good that you will be able to be a saver of life to many hungry souls, and you will be made to rejoice that your Saviour did pilot you over and brought you to that shore. The One that has trod the way before us understands while we in our weakness only see the outside surface. Some day God will let us see His glory and beauties that He has in store for those that are faithful. He may call us to suffer with Him for awhile but the "God of all grace who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered awhile, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you." 1 Peter 5:10. "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." 2 Cor. 4:17. Then we hear Paul say in Rom. 8:18, "For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that shall be revealed in us."

Keep looking up, dear child of God, fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life. Forget the past that needs to be forgotten, and cling to the old rugged cross. Some day the cross will be exchanged for a crown. Keep this one thing in mind, that you are bearing a cross to wear a crown, and it won't be long till the exchange will come. My very soul leaps with joy to think of the eternal weight of glory at the end of life's journey. Be faithful!

EDITORIALS

It takes a lot of labor and sacrificing of means and time to carry on a campmeeting, but the effort is worth all, for one soul is worth more than if one had gained the whole world. We are expecting a multitude of souls to be saved this summer in the campmeetings and many of the saints encouraged and built up in God and settled down in the truth as never before. In James 1:22 we read, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves." All the saints everywhere should do all they can to further the true holiness gospel among men. It seems to me that the time is short and the angel of the Lord may soon be standing with one foot on the land and the other on sea and declaring that time shall be no more. Let us do what we can while it is yet day. The Bible tells us that the night cometh when no man can work.

The office force here is kept busy with the writing of letters, and the printing of tracts, papers, and books and the truth is going forth by the printed page in a steady stream to all parts of the world. Those who have been praying for the work and giving of their substance to get the gospel to these thousands of people will have a part in the reaping and in that day hear the Saviour say, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: .. enter thou into the joy of the Lord." God only accepts willing service so each one should give as the Lord puts the burden on his heart, not to be known of men. for we are taught in the Word not to let thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth. It is enough for the Lord to know what you are doing. The true saints are not laboring for rewards here in this world, but are running for the prize at the end of the race. The silent, secret giving of a true saint of God is precious in the sight of God. Our giving should always be as unto the Lord and that in a free manner

When Stephen was being stoned to death for Christ's sake, he looked up to heaven and the heavens were opened and he saw Jesus standing at the right hand of God. Jesus was so interested in the death of His child, Stephen, that He stood up to look upon the scene. Let each one of us draw strength from above and so live in humility of heart and mind that we will be ready to suffer for His name's sake and bear the cross and taste a little of the sufferings that is left for the innocent. Read in the Bible of the sufferings of the Apostle Paul and take note of his firmness, even before the rulers and governors of the land. He said in Col. 1:24, "Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the church." Those who have the welfare of the Church at heart are willing to suffer and bear the reproach of the world that souls might be saved and be ready for heaven and immortal glory.

Jesus says in Luke 13:24, "Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able." He goes on to say that the Master will rise up and shut the door and will say unto those who are knocking for an entrance, I know you not whence ye are and there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Oh, that sad time is coming for many that profess and yet do not His Word. Dear friends, you cannot serve God and mammon and at the same time be a doer of His Word. To

follow in the footsteps of Christ will cause you to be persecuted and even despised by seemingly pious people. Paul makes the statement after going through much afflictions that, "All that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." It is said of Paul that when he went into the city to preach he either had a revival or a riot. If your preaching and work for God does not stir the devil and his crowd against you, it is a pretty good sign that you are one of his number. The fact is that Satan has thousands of preachers in the world today to one of the Lord's ministers. According to Paul's testimony in 2 Cor. 11:13 we know that they are here in an abundant manner, for he says, "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel: for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works." The ministers of Satan preach many right things for the purpose of deceiving souls into error and bringing them to ruin and shame.

Brothers and sisters in the Lord, let us be as Paul exhorted us to be in Phil. 2:1-6, which reads, "If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the spirit, if any bowels and mercies, fulfill ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than themselves. Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. [See that your brother has things also.] Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God." Brethren, it is not robbery to be like Christ, for the more you are like him the more glory and honor He will receive and He will be lifted up in a greater measure. He says in His Word, "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me." John 12:32.

I feel it will be good for our readers and pleasing to the Lord if I would name some of the deceiving and poisonous doctrines that exist in the world which bring confusion and discouragement on many precious souls. The sin-you-must doctrine, the doctrine of "once saved, always saved, or eternal security," spiritualism, Christian Science, Jehovah Witness; the soul-sleeping "no hell" doctrine, water salvation in place of the blood of Christ, infant sprinkling or pouring for baptism, the anti-cleansing doctrine or "One work of grace"; millennialism, or the doctrine of a "thousand-year reign"; modern religion or liberal conscience, anti-ordiance doctrines, religions that conform to the world in adorning the body-women bobbing the hair and wearing abbreviated clothing; binding Old Testament doctrines on New Testament converts, endorsing adultery either physically or spiritually, the endorsing of pool-playing, going to theaters, shows, or favoring the T. V. sets in the homes, and the using of the new version of the Bible. These creeds and doctrines have been formed as a way to get into the Church rather than being born from above. The new birth in Christ Jesus puts one in the true Church of God. Jesus says, "I am the door." As children are born into a family by a physical birth, so also are we born into the Church, God's family by a spiritual birth. These and many other things are among the evils that Satan is using to deceive, decoy, or to blind souls so that they will meet the Lord in Judgment with only a profession and be disappointed and be turned into that place of torment prepared for the devil and his angels where the worm dieth not and the fire is never quenched.

Brethren, let us take heed unto ourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to feed the Church of God, which He hath purchased with His own blood. Rosa Belle Day, the daughter of Taylor and Ellen Loy, was born at or near Joplin, Mo., June 10, 1876. She left this world April 1, 1959 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Clarence Caughron of Webb City, Mo., at the age of 82 years, nine months, and 22 days. She was married June 12, 1892 to Stephen H. Day who preceded her in death in 1902.

Sister Day first heard the gospel of the Church of God in 1920 when a younger brother, Lewis Loy, embraced the truth on his dying bed and was gloriously saved ten months before going on to Glory. She had been confused in her mind for sometime, but we could hear her praying for God to make her what she ought to be.

She suffered a hip fracture Aug. 29, 1957 but recovered to the extent that she could walk a little. Later, though, she weakened and took her bed. Different ones of the saints helped to care for her. When Sister Day was asked about her soul, she replied that she was all right. She got so happy and later that evening was heard quoting the same Scriptures. She leaves another daughter, Mrs. S. E. Carroll of Chicago, Ill, three grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren. A son died in infancy.

Services were at the Hedge-Lewis Funeral Chapel, with Sister Ersa Carrick officiating, assisted by Bro. Merrill Williamson. James 4:14; Isa. 25:8; 1 Cor. 15:55.

Nora Zilpha Lightner was born in Crawford County, Indiana, May 23, 1881, and passed away at Los Angeles, Calif., May 11, 1959, age 77. Her maiden name was West. John G. Williams was born to Edward and Alice Williams Dec. 22, 1882 in Mashulaville, Miss., and departed this life April 26, 1959 at 7:45 a. m. He was united in holy matrimony to Mary Agnes Lee in Okeene, Okla. Aug. 9, 1909.

Knowing The Will of God

Everyone in life must make decisions. quently situations arise in which we must decide what we are going to do. Some decisions are more important than others and a mistake made may be far reaching and may effect our lives for many years. My heart is especially burdened for our dear young people that they may learn to seek God for instructions and guidance in making decisions. Solomon said, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. Be not wise in thine own eyes." Prov. 3:5-7. When we trust God with all our hearts and acknowledge to him that he knows best, then wait until he makes his will clear, we can please him and may save ourselves much grief and sorrow.

One young sister had yielded herself wholly to the Lord. A short time later she was asked to go with a family on a trip. She was young in the Lord and had never asked the Lord about matters before. The Lord impressed her with the thought that she needed to know God's will. She had a desire to do something else rather than go on this trip, but she began seeking God for instruction.

One morning God, by his Spirit, burdened her that he wanted her to go. Her mother thought she was mistaken and for a time the girl was greatly perplexed, for the mother had been saved for a number of years. She went again and again to the Lord but he only laid the conviction deeper that she was to go. Finally God cleared the way and the daughter was given the opportunity of making her decision. Later the mother realized that she had let some circumstances persuade her rather than the Lord. Before God made his will clear, the young sister became fully willing to give up her desire to carry out another plan. Our desires, not fully submitted to God, can hinder us from getting the mind of God in a matter.

Later the young sister made a mistake and moved out of the order of God in a matter. She soon realized her mistake and asked God to forgive her and to help her out. She humbly prayed day after day for God to somehow work and cause her to be released so she could go where God had first directed her. God did work in a wonderful way and she was only out of the will of God a week or two.

There are some steps in life where a mistake made can be far more serious than this one was. This mistake could be corrected in a short time but a mistake made in the matter of marriage cannot be undone so easily. I am especially burdened for our young people, and older saints, too, that they seek God until they know what he would have them do before taking this step in life. I fear that some of God's children ask God about this but never wait until he answers or perhaps never die out to their own desires enough so he can reveal his will, and go ahead supposing that it is God's will. Dear ones, before taking such an important step we need to know God's will. Many of God's children, I am sure, have been hindered in their usefulness in God's service by making a mistake in marriage. They may realize their mistake later but they cannot step out. They are bound by the marriage covenant. (Not speaking here of adulterous marriages.)

Dear young people, if you are considering such a step in life, seek God earnestly until you know beyond a doubt what his will is. You may reap a mistake made here for a life time. If older saints are advising you against it you had better be careful. Your love for that one may be hindering you from hearing God's voice—if you are seeking him about it. You may wish later that you hadn't been so hasty in going on in spite of warnings.

We would urge you that are looking forward to having a companion some day to lay the matter before the Lord, asking him if it is his will for you to have one, to choose one for you. Also, we would encourage you to settle down into God. Make a full consecration to God and serve him wholeheartedly. Put him first in your life. Let God have his way fully with you that he may make you what he wants you to be and worthy of a good companion. If you desire a good companion, then seek God earnestly to make yourself worthy of one. Remember, the most important thing to be adorned is the heart—both men and women. 1 Peter 3:4. There should not be striving one with another to gain the affections of a certain one. This

kind of striving (carnal) sometimes causes hard feelings and harms the soul. You seek to please God and trust God to take care of the matter of selecting a companion. Behind the attractive face may be an unattractive spirit.

In the world there is much stress given to love-making (kissing, petting, etc.) in courship. Young people are encouraged in this by movies, television, shows, and some magazines. Should saved young people engage in such? We believe not. Better leave that until after the marriage vow.

Should saved young people go with the unsaved? Here is a snare that Satan catches souls with. Satan will reason that you can win them to the Lord but often it happens the other way. God's children should not yoke up with unbelievers. Read Deut. 7:3, 4; Josh. 23:12, 13; 2 Cor. 6:14. Do not keep company with anyone having a living companion nor should you be seeking another if you have a living companion. If you have any reason to believe that the one you are keeping company with may have (although they deny it), investigate the matter. It is wrong to marry anyone who has a living companion (Luke 16:18) and is unwise to keep company with them.

Dear ones, our purpose has been to help and guide you into right paths and to help you avoid some of Satan's snares. May God bless and guide you according to his divine will. Then you can have the joy and satisfaction in looking back and saying, "I know I took that step in the order of God." We would spare you if possible from the sorrow of looking back and thinking, "I wonder if I made a mistake?" or "I surely made a mistake in that step."

Now we desire to encourage any who are bound by the marriage covenant but realize they have made a mistake. God will forgive you if you repent of it. Then live a faithful, obedient life to God. He may not be able to make the same vessel out of you that he would have made, but yield again to him and he will make another vessel as it seems good to him to make. (Jer. 18:4.) —Sister Fern Stubblefield.

Holy Spirit-Filled Life

"... after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise." Eph. 1.13.

Dear ones, God needs Holy Spirit-filled lives to-day to work in and through. If God cannot fill our whole life with His love and power He will not use us for His glory. Those who will not make an absolute surrender of their all cannot be His disciple. All who are not sanctified wholly—body, soul, mind and spirit, are in great danger of being overcome by the power of Satan. Many today are claiming to be saved while living careless lives for self. "And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus." Eph. 2:6. All who fall, fall a prey to Satan. In verse two we have "smoke" ascending from the pit of hell. "Smoke" is a symbol of delusive faith, or a delusive, confusing doctrine. In verse three the "smoke" (delusive doctrine) was accompanied by false spirits, symbolized by "locusts" that ascended from the pit with the "smoke" (false doctrines). But they were permitted to "hurt those men which have not the seal of God in their foreheads." Reason teaches us: that if they were to "hurt" those who did not have God's seal in their foreheads, that the ones that they were not to "hurt" (described as the "green things") were the ones that did have the seal of God in their foreheads, and that the only reason that they were not "hurting" them was because God was protecting them.

The true worshipers and the false are distinguished in the book of Revelation by a mark in the forehead, the true having the seal of God, and the false, the mark of the beast.

The sealing of God in the foreheads as described in chapter seven, is a symbol of being sealed "with the Holy Spirit of promise" (Eph. 1:13; 4:30; and 2 Cor. 1:21, 22). Dear ones, the only escape from deception is to have the seal of God in your forehead. Oh, are you filled with the Holy Spirit of promise, now?

The fallen ones of Chapter nine are those who fell in the awful compromise after continuing in this glorious truth of the Evening Light for several years. All compromisers have lost their God-given seal, and are being stung by the locusts, receiving delusive spirits that land them in a Devil's Hell.

It never dawned on me to go to my preacher and I never returned to the church services where I had formerly gone. The Holy Spirit knew. Well, He showed me I must repent. "Are you willing to wash feet" (these were things we never heard of in the sect I joined). "Oh, yes, Lord, anything, if you will save me."

I was to go to a little country store for something when before me came my hair style, which was in pompadour. Well, I put that up and down a few times till my hair went straight back. Well, praise His name, my ear rings, rings, jewelry and pride and the dance from my feet the Lord stripped for the race as plain as a saint. I prayed and wept for two weeks. Oh, praise His name for peace! He showed me His church so plainly that I never lost sight of it. I have no difficulty in knowing God has but one church. Babylon is playing church on the road to hell. Social religions are sweeping our youth into the very jaws of hell. I was about four years in finding the church (saints). God showed me that I had some measuring up to do which I did, gladly.

From that time till now I have never heard the Word too strong. If it hits me I seek to measure up. I have never taken my hands from that gospel plough or looked back for a desire for anything the Lord saved me from. My ploughing, many times, was not firmly straight because I looked too much at the rocks and chuckholes that would have swamped me had not my blessed Lord been watching near. In those days we were taught to trust the Lord for healing. He delivered me of seven dear children without an earthly physician. Six of those children never had any medical remedies. One eight-year-old girl had her skull cracked by a horse and I was censored for not taking her to the hospital, but the Lord healed her. I was afraid for man to experiment on her head. One time an automobile knocked me down, both wheels running over both of my limbs. The doctor said he could not understand why my legs were not broken as I was 70 years of age. I said, "Doctor, the Lord just raised that auto a little bit." I was in bed at home near five weeks.

One time my horse was running off and she kicked through the dash of the buggy and broke the shaft and single tree. So with the shaft only fastened on one side the buggy was swinging from one side of the road to the other. I thought if I jumped I might be killed and to stay in it might be the same. I crossed my hands on my breast and said, "Lord, help me!" and the horse could not have stopped more suddenly had she been shot. I always felt the angel that stopped Balaam's donkey stopped my horse. There can be no way to speak more deserving or more highly of Christ Jesus than as Paul speaks of Him. "Concerning his [God's] Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David, according to the flesh; and declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead," Rom, 1:3, 4. "And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and, lo, the heavens were opened unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lighting upon him: and lo, a voice from heaven saying, this is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Matt. 3:16, 17. So we can see very clearly how the scriptures declare Jesus to be the Son of God. It grants a great inheritance to all who will put their trust and faith in such a Saviour as he is. "But unto the Son he [God] saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom. Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows. And thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands." Heb. 1:8-10. This is spoken of Christ. He is a mighty deliverer and translater to those who will seek after Him, and gives redemption through His blood, also forgiveness of sins. He is also in the image of the Father. He had part with the Father in the creation of all things. "Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of His dear Son: in whom we have redemption through His blood, even the forgiveness of SINS: who is the image of the INVISIBLE GOD, the firstborn of every creature: for by Him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by Him, and for Him: and He is before all things, and by Him all things consist." Col. 1:13-17. We see by the next verse that He is the HEAD of the church, not churches or organizations, or sects with men at the head of them, and in authority. What man would be qualified to fill the place where Christ is the prominent ONE, one in whom all fullness dwells. "And he is the head of the

body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might HAVE the preeminence [be over all others]. For it pleased the Father that in him [Christ] should all fullness dwell." Yes, He made reconciliation, which makes peace: makes holy, unblamable and unreprovable in His sight. This makes you a friend of God where once you were an enemy. "If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be NOT moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven: whereof I Paul am made a minister." Col. 1:18-23. Let us now see what John has to say concerning Christ's power over sin. I John 1-7: "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the BLOOD of Jesus Christ his son cleanseth us from all sin." And he said again, "Ye know that he was manifested to take away our SINS; and in him is no SIN." I John 3:5. And more verification: "... Let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous. He that committeh SIN is of the devil: ... for this purpose the SON OF GOD was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil [SIN]." I John 3:7-8.

Our faith should not stand in the wisdom of man. The Holy Spirit and God's Word should be our guide. This is all that is needed to make us successful in the service of the Lord Jesus Christ. Paul says, "And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the spirit and of power; that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." 1 Cor 2:4, 5. Also verse 2 reads like this: "For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified." Man is very insignificant compared to God's power and wisdom. These can be attained from Christ: "Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God. Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men; and the weakness of God is stronger than men." 1 Cor. 1:24, 25. John knew that it was the anointing of the Spirit that gives men understanding in Christ and that they need not that any man teach them.

The necessary thing is to abide in Christ, for without Christ one can do nothing. He said, "I am the vine, and ye are the branches: he that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing. . . . If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples." John 15:5-8.

What can impart knowledge of God more than the Word and Spirit of God? It is most essential to man to know his God and His will. "But the anointing [Spirit] which ye have received of him abideth in you; and ye need NOT that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teaches you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him [Christ]." 1 John 2:27.

in the Word of God. "Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases." (Psa. 103:3).

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Greed is a close relative of covetousness. Sometimes we watch children playing on the floor. One little fellow has all the blocks but two and then cries because he can't take the other two from his playmate. We do not look upon the scene with pleasure but now the child needs teaching or trouble lies ahead. But how awful to see the same principle working in adults. Here is an example of an uncleansed heart and uncontrolled greed carried out to the end. Ahab had most of the blocks and wanted the two that Naboth had. He was not hardened enough to take the vineyard himself but he stood by and consented for his wife, who was vicious, to commit an awful crime and get it for him. Surely the city of Jezreel was shocked but fear caused them to carry out her wicked plans.

"Hast thou found me, O mine enemy?" King Ahab was well enough acquainted with Elijah through the famine and what followed that he had some respect for him. When he saw him his own conscience smote him and for what Elijah stood for. Because God's approval (1 Cor. 6:10) is never upon greed nor covetousness he called it his enemy. Ahab's wickedness stood uncovered before God. After the verdict was given Ahab humbled down and went into fasting instead of sulking. Because of this, the punishment was delayed; but it came at last. "We can't do wrong and get by."

Printed Portion: 2 Kings 5:1-3, 9-15b

- 1. Now Naaman, captain of the host of the king of Syria was a great man with his master, and honourable, because by him the Lord had given deliverance unto Syria: he was also a mighty man in valour, but he was a leper.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson today is a beautiful lesson. It is so touching to know how the faith of this little maid had not been shaken even though she had been taken a captive to another country where they did not worship God. Some mother had done her duty in training her to love God.

This little maid is an example for us. She did not fail to testify for God. She did not feel inferior to others or ashamed of God. She was not afraid to boldly declare that God heals. Oh, the same, simple, child-like faith must be ours today to receive from God. "Except ye be converted, and become as little children. ." Not many in the world today want to become as little children. They know too much. They have acquired too much; they feel, through their own strength. Oh, may we see more adults becoming children and looking to their heavenly parent with simple faith! Just thirty-five words tell us all we know about the little maid. What can be said about your faith in thirty-five words?

Twelve different people had a part in the healing of Naaman. The maid told the mistress, another told the king, the king sent a letter to the king of Israel and so on. God works through human instrumentality. Are we willing to be just a link in the chain through which He can work? All links are important to make the chain complete and strong.

- 11. And, behold, Amariah the chief priest is over you in all matters of the Lord; and Zebadiah the son of Ishmael, the ruler of the house of Judah, for all the king's matters: also the Levites shall be officers before you. Deal courageously, and the Lord shall be with the good.

Memory Verse: Take heed and do it: for there is no iniquity with the Lord our God, nor respect of persons, nor taking of gifts. 2 Chronicles 19:7.

Practical Truth: When rulers and judges are able and God-fearing men, righteousness on the part of citizens will be promoted.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jehoshaphat was the son of Asa. They both loved peace. Jehoshaphat "went out again through the people" and brought them back unto the Lord God. Today we have rulers who go out among the people for different motives but this king wanted a revival, a turning away from wickedness to God. Our country needs to be brought back to God. Wickedness is abounding more than in all the history of our nation. Every nation that has turned away from God has been punished. United States is fast turning away. We need to pray for our rulers as the Bible teaches us to.

Jehoshaphat appointed judges and gave them strict orders to give righteous judgment. They were not to take bribes nor to show respect of persons. They must feel the responsibility of judging for the Lord. They must be perfect in heart. He pointed out to them that God was unchangeable. Gifts cannot change God. Persons cannot change God. Neither can fair speeches nor flattery change him. Oh, how glad we are he is unchangeable. Others cannot turn God against us. He cannot be bought off. That is the kind of God we are serving and God wants us to be fair as he is fair. A righteous person who gives righteous judgment is one who has love in his heart for all and is able to separate the good from the bad regardless upon whom it might fall, even if it be your enemy.

Printed Portion 2 Kings 11:4, 9-12, 17-19, 21; 12:2

4. And the seventh year Jehoiada sent and fetched the rulers over hundreds, with the captains and the guard, and brought them to him into the house of the Lord, and made a covenant with them, and took an oath of them in the house of the Lord, and shewed them the king's son.

- 9. And the captains over the hundreds did according to all things that Jehoiada the priest commanded: and they took every man his men that were to come in on the sabbath, with them that should go out on the sabbath, and came to Jehoiada the priest.

- 19. And he took the rulers over hundreds, and the captains, and the guard, and all the people of the land; and they brought down the king from the house of the Lord, and came by the way of the gate of the guard to the king's house. And he sat on the throne of the kings.
- 21. Seven years old was Jehoash when he began to reign.
- 12:2. And Jehoash did that which was right in the sight of the Lord all his days wherein Jehoiada the priest instructed him.

Memory Verse: The priest's lips should seek the law at his mouth: for he is the messenger of the Lord of hosts, Malachi 2:7.

Practical Truth: Religious national leaders promote world welfare and peace.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Athaliah, who was the daughter of the pagan Jezebel and Ahab, had all the heirs of the throne killed after she found out her own son was dead so she could reign upon the throne. She did not know that her sister had taken Jehoash or Joash, then a baby, and hid him in her own house. Little Joash was brought up to love God by his aunt and uncle, who was Jehoiada, the high priest. Our lesson tells about when Jehoash was seven years old, and that at this age he was proclaimed king by his uncle at the changing of the guards and the wicked queen Athaliah killed.

Jehoiada was a religious leader, and the period of his rulership as the power behind the rule of Joash was righteous. We appreciate Jehoiada's bravery. It took courage to put Jehoash on the throne with such a wicked woman ruling. But Jehoiada had faith in God. He knew God was for the right and would stand by him. Today we need more God-fearing men and women who will stand up for right against wrong of all kinds. At the risk of our life we need to send forth the good news that Jesus saves.

Because Jehoiada dared to risk his life a whole nation turned back to God. The pagan religion was broken and a covenant made between God and the people of Israel. Today we are faced with the pagan power (communism) which is threatening our whole nation. Will we stand for right at the risk of our lives?
