She was a fragile, sensitive child, and entwined herself about the knotty and gnarled limbs of the oak. Consumption marked this fair girl for its own; and she wasted away day by day, until even the grasshopper became a burden.

One day her father came into her room and sat down by her bedside. He took her wan, ethereal hand in his. Looking her father squarely in the face, she said: "My dear father, I'm going to die."

"Oh, no, my child! Oh, no! The spring is coming and with the birds and breezes and the blooms, your pale cheeks will blush with health."

"No; the doctor was here today. I felt I was nearing the grave, and I asked him to tell me plainly what I had to expect. I told him that it was a great thing to exchange worlds; that I did not wish to be deceived about myself, and if I was going to die I had some preparations I wanted to make. He told me my disease was beyond human skill; that a few suns would rise and set, and then I would be borne to my burial. You will bury me, Father, by the side of my mother, for that was her dying request. But, Father, you and Mother did not agree on religion. Mother often spoke to me of the blessed Savior who died for us all. She used to pray for both you and me, that the Savior might be our friend, and that we might all see Him, our Savior, when He sits enthroned in His glory. I don't feel that I can go alone through the dark valley of the shadow of death. Now, tell me, Father, whom shall I follow, you or Mother? Shall I reject Christ, as you have taught me, or shall I accept Him, as He was my mother's friend in the hour of her great sorrow?"

There was an honest heart beneath that rough exterior. Though tears nearly choked his utterance, the old soldier said: "My child, cling to your mother's Savior; she was right. I'll try to follow you to that blessed abode."

God has not called us into uncleanness, but unto holiness—that is, to be clean, pure; the heart made clean, our mind filled with clean thoughts, our lips speak clean words, our bodies clean; clean morally. 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## **Editorials**

By the time this January, 1961, issue of the Faith and Victory paper reaches most of our readers, the day commemorating the birth of our Savior will have passed and the annual Oklahoma state assembly meeting here at Guthrie will be in progress. As usual, we are expecting great and precious blessings to be upon those assembled in this meeting which is scheduled to close on Sunday, the first day in the New Year of 1961.

The year of 1960, which will soon be a cycle of time in history, has been an exceedingly busy year here at the "Lord's Print Shop." The tracts, papers, booklets and books have been going out in all directions in a steady flow all the weeks of the year. The good that has been done and the souls who have been saved through this effort will never fully come to light until the crowning day which is awaiting all the saints. I surely do want to see all of our readers among "that number when the saints go marching in." We are doing our best to print the gospel in a plain and simple manner so that none need be in darkness as to how to live and keep unspotted from this old sinful world so they will have on a clean garment of righteousness from above when the great Judgment day rolls around. I surely do want to be among that number "when the roll is called up yonder." In order to do so. I must be faithful to speak or write, "Thus saith the Lord," and to give warnings both to the saint and the sinner-to the saint to keep ready, and to the sinner to get ready and then stay ready.

The Apostle John wrote in his day thus: "We know that we are of God and the whole world lieth in wickedness." I John 5:19. The world is certainly in that condition today. The sad part of it is that most people make a profession of following the Lord but according to the Scripture they do not love God. In 1 John 5:3 we read, "For this is the love of God that we keep his commandments; and his commandments are not grievous." In Titus 2:11 we read, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts we should live soberly, righteously and godly in this present world."

We find so many professors who revel in the things of this sinful world which is the enemy of God. In James 4:1-4 we find it plainly stated "that the friendship of the world is enmity with God: whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God."

Read the latter part of the 6th chapter of 2 Cor. and see the good promises that God gives to those who will separate themselves from all worldly religions. He tells us not to be "unequally yoked together with unbelievers." After enumerating some other things which defile the soul, he says: "Where-

fore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, [why do you not obey this scripture?] and touch not the unclean thing; [you should do this and receive the good promise that follows] and I will receive you, and will be a father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty."

Listen to what he says in the 7th chapter following this good promise: "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." A multitude of preachers in this world will tell their converts that one cannot live holy in this life but that one will sin more or less all the time. They will misconstrue the scriptures, wrest them from their proper meaning and make many believe it that way, so they go on acting like the devil has more power than God. Many will dress in the vulgar styles of the world. Women will bob their hair, paint their faces and finger nails, and wear pants like a man with a filthy cigarette in the mouth. Many have the television habit, and in many other ways they show themselves to be friends of the world.

In 1 Peter 2:11 we read, "Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul." The use of tobacco is a strong fleshly lust, and should not be indulged in by any one who loves the Lord and desires to keep His commandments. Can you picture the precious Lord Jesus Christ when upon the earth in a physical body going around with a cud of tobacco in His mouth and spitting the filthy stuff around, or the women that followed Him with the nasty cigarette in their mouths? Perish such a thought! I want to warn you in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, unless you abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul you will never have a welcome into God's clean, undefiled heaven. Please take the warning from one that loves your soul. Do not let the enemy deceive you any longer and make you think that Satan has more power than God has. The very purpose that God had in giving His Son as a sacrifice on Calvary's cross was to set you free from all the works of Satan, and keep you clean and ready for His pure and undefiled heaven.

"Heaven is a holy place,
Filled with glory and with grace—
Sin can never enter there;
So if at the judgment bar,
Sinful spots your soul shall mar—
You can never enter there."

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When Christ our Savior died upon the cross, was buried and rose again, He finished God's plan of salvation and deliverance from sin for every human being upon the earth at that time and for all who would be born into the world since that time. "For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him." 2 Cor. 5:21. Jesus, in dying on the cross as though He were a sinner, satisfied the divine justice of God

and effected reconciliation between God and man. When man through godly sorrow, confession and repentance accepts the blood of Christ as an atonement for his sins, it will mean peace for him with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. In Isaiah 53:5 we read, "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." All that come to God must come to Him through the acknowledgment of His Son and the blood sacrifice that He made for the saving of their souls. In Eph. 1:7 we read, "In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace."

In Ephesians 1:13, 14 we read, "In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also, after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise, which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory." We not only have the redemption of our soul through His blood but also the promise of the redemption of our bodies which have now become His purchased possession. According to the Apostle Paul's words found in Phil. 3:21 we are to be changed in that last great day from a decaying body to an immortal body, and are to be "fashioned like unto His glorious body." Again, in 1 Cor. 15: 52 he tells us of this glorious change: "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality." When this is done, then will be brought to pass to the saint that death is swallowed up in victory.

In Col. 1:13 the Apostle again writes of our redemption and deliverance through Christ: "Who has delivered us from the power of darkness [Satan's ruling force], and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son; in whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins."

By these scriptures we can plainly see that we not only have redemption of our souls here and are translated from the powers of darkness into the kingdom of His dear Son, but also we have the promise of this mortal body being changed at the resurrection day from a body that sees corruption to a body that is immortal and eternal with God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Just think, what a glorious ending is in store for all the faithful saints! Surely these earthly treasures should fade away and be counted as of very little value, yea, as of no value in comparison to the eternal reward with God. No wonder the Psalmist David said, "Great peace have they that love thy law, and nothing shall offend them."

In Psalms 119:103 we read, "How sweet are thy words unto my taste! Yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" There is nothing more comforting to the saint of God when in severe trials and tests than to have that blessed assurance that all is well between

God and his soul. For them to die would only mean the beginning of a greater and more blessed life with God in the endless ages. No wonder the Psalmist David said, "Let everything that hath breath, praise the Lord." As long as we have breath, let us praise and adore His holy name!

He has promised to keep that soul in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on the Lord. If we keep loving the Lord, all things that come to us in life to try and test us will work for our good and His glory. Oh, that we may always dwell in the secret place of the Most High and be hid away under His protective wings of love and compassion. Paul writes in 2 Cor. 4:17, 18: "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal." In Psalms 42:1 we read, "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God. My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall I come and appear before God?" When I'read the book "My Life Story and Healing" by Nellie Poulos, I was greatly blessed. # The Church That Jesus Built

That Jesus gathered material while in earth, while in a fleshly body, and built His Church, cannot be disputed, for we read in Matt. 16:16-18, "And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God. And Jesus answered and said, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven. And I say also unto thee, that thou art Peter; and upon this rock I will build my Church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against IT." Many look at this Scripture without taking much thought, or without the Spirit to guide and give understanding, and conclude that Jesus meant to build His Church on Peter, but this is decidedly a wrong interpretation of the Scripture. Jesus was referring to the solid rocklike truth that he had spoken, which was: "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God," and was given him by the Father in heaven, and all those that believe in the heart (Romans 10:9, 10) that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, become stones in the building, His Church, Christ being the Rock, the Chief cornerstone.

We find by the above Scriptures that His Church was to be so firm, so strong, and filled with such power that the gates of hell can not prevail against her onward march. We find that His Church was not many, but ONE, spoken of in the singular term: IT. The prophet Isaiah foreseeing things that would come to pass, spoke of the beginning of the Church in this manner, "Therefore, thus saith the Lord God, behold

I lay in Zion (a metaphor for the Church) for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste" (Isa. 28:16). The prophet here was speaking of Jesus as the precious tried stone and said He was a sure foundation. And Paul, speaking of this foundation, said, "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ." (1 Cor. 3:11).

Peter, in speaking to babes in Christ, said, "To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed of men, but chosen of God and precious. Ye also as lively stones (saved men) are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ. Wherefore, also I lay in Zion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on Him shall not be confounded" (1 Pet. 2:4-6). This living stone spoken of by Peter is Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God, for truly He was rejected of men, despised, abused, slain, placed in the tomb, and counted by men as fully defeated; but not so-the gates of hell did not prevail. There was mighty power with Him. The great stone at the mouth of the tomb could not keep its place, the governor's seal was not respected, the brave soldiers that were set to watch did shake and become as dead men. and Christ the Son of God came forth a living conqueror, and has become Head over all things to the church which is His body.

Paul, in writing of and to saved souls, said, "Now, therefore, ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and the household of God; and are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief corner stone: In whom all the building, fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: in whom Ye are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit" (Eph. 2:19-22). Paul is speaking here of the spiritual structure of the Church that Jesus built, and shows that He has reconciled us unto God in one body by the cross (verse 16). For all truly saved souls (those who believe from the heart that Jesus Christ is the Son of the living God) compose the spiritual body of Jesus Christ; and He, Christ, is our great High Priest (Heb. 4:14) with all power both in heaven and in earth (Matt. 8:18), and has become Head over all things to the Church (Eph. 1:22).

Moses was a type of Christ insomuch he was the head of the literal children of Israel. They are referred to in the 3rd chapter of Hebrews and the 2nd verse as Moses being faithful in all of his house, but the scripture goes on to say that Jesus was worthy of more glory than Moses, and that Moses was faithful in all of his house as a servant which testified of things which were to be spoken afterwards. The Word says, "But Christ as a son over his own house: whose house are we, (saved souls) if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end."

The material that Jesus gathered to build his house or Church was God-fearing men and women that received Christ and fully accepted his gospel. The apostles whom He chose were foundation stones, with

Christ himself as the chief corner stone. For three years and a half he was gathering souls together and building his spiritual house which Peter speaks of in 1 Peter 2:5 as being and are built up a spiritual house. by whom spiritual sacrifices are offered up which are acceptable to God by Jesus Christ. On the day of Pentecost they were all together in one place and constituted his spiritual house or Church he had built. In sending upon them the gift of the Holy Ghost with the cleansing fire of the Spirit, the Church of God was set in order with the various gifts of the Spirit functioning in and through each member or "lively stone" in the building. When this was done, the Church was a complete unit, built and occupied. The Spirit of God began to add to it such as were being saved (Acts 2: 47), and the number increased.

He was not building his Church new but was just merely adding to it such as should be saved or were born from above. The Church was built and was together in one accord on the day of Pentecost when it was occupied by the Holy Ghost, gifts were given and it was set in order and began to function as a complete unit. Thereafter, it was added to as souls repented and were born from above and thus it will be until Jesus comes and takes us all home to glory.

I see the Church of God today as a city set on a hill that cannot be hid, covered or destroyed. We could think of the Church today as likened to a man having 50 sheep, which was his complete flock of sheep. In the spring there are 25 lambs born, and then his complete flock of sheep would be 75 head. It could be likened to a city whose population is ten thousand souls. This city has all the officers it needs and is a complete city within itself. In ten years it grows to be a city of 100,000, and is still a complete city as it has all the officers it needs. Jesus built his Church, and on the day of Pentecost he occupied it by the Holy Ghost and set it in order, and there is no power on earth which can destroy it.

"Hell never can destroy the Church, built by the Savior's hands;

Upon the Rock, the solid Rock, Christ Jesus, still she stands.

Despite of persecution's flood and gates of hell, forsooth;

She's still the Kingdom of the Lord, the Pillar of the truth."

We have been considering who built the Church and on whom it was built and of what and whom it is composed, and now we shall proceed to find out the proper name of this church that Jesus built. We shall first turn to John 17:11 and read what Jesus says to do: "And now I am no more in the world, but these are in the world (speaking of His disciples) and I come to THEE HOLY FATHER, KEEP THROUGH THINE OWN NAME those whom Thou hast given Me that they may be one as we are." We find by these scriptures that it was the desire of Jesus that His followers should be kept in His Father's name and His name is God. Therefore the name would be "The Church of God." The word 'church' in the scriptures does not refer to a building as men apply it today, but

it has reference to an assembly of saved men and women which constitute "the Church of God" in that locality. In a broader sense, the Church of God would mean all saved people throughout the world.

God, our heavenly Father had the CHURCH PICTURED OUT in types and shadows long before Jesus was born of the Virgin Mary. Therefore, it was not strange that Jesus wanted the Church kept in His Father's name.

We find that men have built structures that they call "churches," and are holding them together the best they can under other names; but on examination, we find that they are built on sandy foundations and have become cisterns without living water. They have failed to honor the petition of the Son, "Holy Father, keep through Thine own name," therefore the storms and floods have left their houses desolate of real spiritual life and habitation of God is with those that are married to Christ and bring forth fruit unto God (Rom. 7:4). They honor the Son and call themselves by the Father's name. They are not tied nor bound by rules and regulations of men, but are set free by belief in Christ, Son of God (Rom. 8:14), are lively stones in the building of God that Jesus has built (1 Pet. 2:5).

"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end" (Isa. 9:6-7).

In the third chapter of Eph. 14th and 15th verses, we read what Paul said concerning the name of God's people: "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and in earth is named." Some of the family of God, people of God, or Church of God have gone on to heaven and the other part are yet alive in the earth, and Paul, speaking of the Father, said, "Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named," which would be the family of God, or the Church of God.

Men do not join "the Church of God" as they do man-made churches, but they are born into it by a spiritual birth just as children are born into our family by fleshly birth; and we bear the Father's name as our children bear ours. We will not dishonor the Father by taking some other name, but are satisfied and happy to abide free in Him (Psa. 87:5-6). "Marvel not that I said unto thee, ye must be born again" (John 3:7).

Paul, in writing to or of saved people, repeatedly called them "The Church of God." In Acts 20:28 he said to the overseers to "Feed the Church of God which He hath purchased with His own blood." In 1 Cor. 1:1, 2 he addresses the Church of God which is at Corinth, directing his letter to the local assembly of the Church. In 1 Cor. 10:32 he says to "give no offence to the Church of God." In 1 Cor. 15:9, "I am not meet to be called an apostle, for I persecuted the Church of God." In 1 Tim. 3:5, speaking of a bishop or elder, he says, "For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the Church of God?"

These are just a few of the places in Scriptures where saved men and women are called or referred to as "The Church of God."

#### THE GOSPEL OF THE SON OF GOD

Printed Portion ...... John 1:1-14; 20:30-31

- 1. In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
  - 2. The same was in the beginning with God.
- 3. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.
  - 4. In him was life; and the life was the light of men.
- 5. And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.
- 6. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- 7. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all men through him might believe.
- 8. He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.

Practical Truth: Through His Son God has made His most complete revelation of Himself to man.

## COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

John starts his gospel by referring to the Word, meaning Jesus, who was in the beginning with God in the creation of the world. (Notice Gen. 1:26. The Trinity worked together.) He points out that the pre-existent Word became flesh and dwelt among men. At times while Jesus was here his glory shone through Him, especially at the scene of transfiguration.

"In him was life." In him was eternal life and as others believed on him they also received eternal life. Christ is the author of life. That life is still shining in the world but so many "love darkness rather than light because their deeds are evil." Only those who will submit

to God can receive light and life.

John the Baptist came to tell others of that Light and Life that was coming. Jesus came to the Jews but they rejected him and did not receive him but thank God, "as many as received him" he gave them power to be "born again" not of the flesh but of God. Others cannot keep us out of heaven or from becoming sons of God. It is an individual matter with each one. No matter what others do, it is our privilege to open our hearts to the light and have the darkness completely dispelled and have joy and peace within.

#### January 8, 1961

#### **JESUS BRINGS JOY**

Printed Portion ...... John 2:1-11

- 1. And the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there:
- 2. And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.
- 3. And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus saith unto him, They have no wine.
- 4. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine hour is not yet come.
- 5. His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.
- 6. And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece.
- 7. Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim.

Practical Truth: Miracles were a sign that Jesus was what He professed to be.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Before our lesson today Jesus had been baptized and gone through the temptations of the wilderness, also had talked to five or six of his disciples. He was beginning his ministry and the Bible says this miracle was the first that "manifested his glory" and his disciples believed on him.

Verse five brings out the thought that obedience to God's Word will bring a blessing.

The Bible dictionary says a firkin is about ten gallons.

Much discussion has been made on the subject, "Did the wine that Jesus made contain alcohol?" In reading the description of the wine the Jews made we find it did contain alcohol. Yet, on the other hand, we have heard it stated that the wine Christ made must have been unfermented grape juice. In our lesson we read plainly that the drink which the ruler called "the good wine" was not the juice of anything but was made by Jesus, by the power of God entirely out of water. Today we have drinks on

the market that do not have any juice in them but through chemicals the scientists have produced a good, natural tasting drink. I do not doubt the power of God to produce a good flavored wine that did not have any alcohol in it, which is in harmony with the scriptures teaching against intoxicating drinks.

Jesus can change a despairing soul into a soul of joy, peace and satisfaction. Surely Jesus was a miracle-working savior.

#### January 15, 1961

#### YE MUST BE BORN AGAIN

- 1. There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews:
- 2. The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him.
- 3. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.
- 4. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?
- 5. Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.
- 6. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- 7. Marvel not that  $\hat{\mathbf{I}}$  said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

- 12. If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?
- 13. And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven.
- 14. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up:
- 15. That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life.
- 16. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Memory Verse: God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. John 3:17.

Practical Truth: It is the privilege of all to experience a new birth, wrought by the Spirit of God.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We have a very important lesson and truths are revealed in this lesson that cause the sin-sick, despairing soul to know what God will do for him. It is plainly taught that if we meet the conditions God will transform a person into a "new creature." To get to heaven means more than just trying to do right in a person's own strength. A person must be "born again." It means more than having a mere intellectual knowledge of Jesus dying for the sins of the world. There must be a living faith in the soul of man that when he confesses his sins with a godly sorrow and believes that Jesus forgives those sins he becomes a son of God. Bad men are made good. Selfish, evil-minded, pleasure-loving men are transformed. Those who have been slaves to habits that are sinful are delivered and set free. The power of habits is broken by the power of God. This salvation works deep down in the very innermost part of man. He is born of the Spirit. Condemnation is gone. A deep settled peace reigns in the soul.

Through Christ's death he was lifted up. The plan of salvation was completed when he died and ascended to heaven. Believing on Him brings eternal life to the soul.

#### January 22, 1961

#### WHO IS JESUS?

Printed Portion ...... John 4:21-30, 39-32

- 21. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father.
- 22. Ye worship ye know not what: we know what we worship: for salvation is of the Jews.
- 23. But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him.

Practical Truth: The blessings of the gospel are for all alike,

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In our lesson Jesus confesses that he is the Messias that is to come and is Christ. The prophets down through the ages prior to our lesson prophesied of his coming, through the Spirit that worked in them.

Jesus showed himself as an example of being a personal worker. Notice that he brought up a subject that was of common interest and then turned it into a spiritual lesson.

Jesus teaches the fact that he is the source of "living water." This water which is salvation, will satisfy, sustain and last forever. It is ever springing up into everlasting life.

Jesus brings out the fact that the woman should believe him. Today we must have confidence in Jesus and His words to be able to receive eternal life. "He that cometh to God must believe that he is and that he is the rewarder of them that diligently seek him." (Heb. 11:6)

Our lesson also brings out the fact that Jesus is a friend of all, regardless of race. The Jewish prejudices of that day did not stand in His way regarding women, Samaritans or other foreigners. God's people today that are filled with the Spirit are not prejudiced against any soul, but love every creature alike.

God only accepts that kind of worship that is done in the Spirit.

# WHY IS CHRIST OUR AUTHORITY?

Printed Portion ...... John 5:9c-24

- 9c. The same day was the sabbath.
- 10. The Jews therefore said unto him that was cured, It is the sabbath day: it is not lawful for thee to carry thy bed.
- 11. He answered them, He that made me whole, the same said unto me, Take up thy bed, and walk.

- 12. Then asked they him, What man is that which said unto thee, Take up thy bed, and walk?
- 13. And he that was healed wist not who it was: for Jesus had conveyed himself away, a multitude being in that place.
- 14. Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole: sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon thee.
- 15. The man departed, and told the Jews that it was Jesus, which had made him whole.
- 16. And therefore did the Jews persecute Jesus, and sought to slay him, because he had done these things on the sabbeth day.
- 17. But Jesus answered them, My Father worketh hitherto, and I work.
- 18. Therefore the Jews sought the more to kill him, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but said also that God was his Father, making himself equal to God.
- 19. Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise.
- 20. For the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel.
- 21. For as the Father riseth up the dead, and quickeneth them: even so the Son quickeneth whom he will.
- 22. For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son:
- 23. That all men should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him.
- 24. Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.

Memory Verse: Verily, verily I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life. John 5:24.

Practical Truth: Jesus has power to make men whole physically and spiritually.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

If a person will carefully and thoughtfully read the Book of John they can never be the same person in their responsibility to God. The precious Truths of what God requires of a person are so clearly taught.

To carry burdens on the Sabbath was forbidden in Jer. 17:21-22; but circumstances alter such cases. The rabbis were rigid literalists and recognized no exceptions. Of course, at that time they did not recognize Jesus as being the Sabbath himself, the rest-giver to the soul.

From the remark Jesus made after he healed the crippled man we take it to mean sin had been the cause of his affliction. But then the thought that there can be a punishment for sin worse than 38 years of helplessness and wretchedness makes one know in a small degree the punishment that awaits the sinner after the judgment.

God has given to the Son power to heal and to forgive sins. In verse 21 and 22 we see that as the Father quickens or gives life to whomsoever he wills, just so the Son does also. And then the Father has "committed all judgment unto the Son." We find this brought out in Matt. 25:31-46.

We are to honor the Son of God, Jesus Christ and believe on him for everlasting life. —Mrs. Marie Miles
