"Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels." Matt. 25: 41. To His disciples Jesus said, "In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you." John 14:2.

We read in John 3:16, 17: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have

everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." We see that God was—and still is—much concerned about the world to the extent that He gave his only begotten Son to die for fallen man, and to make an atonement for our sins. We should be as much concerned about ourselves as God and His only begotten Son are concerned about us. In Rom. 5:8 it reads, "... while we were yet sinners Christ died for us."

Sinner friend, this will be your eternal abode unless you repent and come to God through Christ. Remember the first text in this writing, "Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels." In Matt. 8:12 Jesus says that "... there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth." Do you want to be in a place like that in eternity? Prepare now for heaven while you have the opportunity. No doubt but that the four and twenty elders represent the twelve tribes of Israel and the twelve apostles of the Lamb. In order to represent the saints before the twelve tribes were formed, the four living creatures were added. Time is divided into four parts: the first age, before the flood; the second, flood to Abraham; third, Abraham to Christ; and the fourth, the day of Grace, from Christ to the end of time. Rev. 4:7 describes these creatures. "The first beast was like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had the face of a man, and the fourth beast was like a flying eagle." Notice it did not say that this beast was merely like an eagle, but like a "flying" eagle; not like an eagle in any position, but like an eagle in flight. Praise God, we live in the "flying eagle" age when we can mount the wings of faith and fly through and above the storms of life. Dear ones, do not let the trials of life get you down, but face them, setting the wings of faith toward the storm, and soar in the clear atmosphere of God's love and grace. "His Blood Be On Us"

When Jesus Christ, our Savior, was arrested and brought before the governor, Pilate asked the multitude of the Jews this question, "What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ? They all say unto him, Let him be crucified. When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing, but that rather a tumult was made, he took water, and washed his hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: see ye to it. Then answered all the people, and said, His blood be on us, and on our children." Matt. 27:22, 24, 25.

The Jews, Christ's own people, did not know or realize the miserable, unending train of torture and suffering to be visited upon them and their children in consequence of this request, "His blood be on us, and on our children." Jesus knew of the impending punishment and wrath which was to fall upon the people. As Jesus was being led to Mount Calvary to be crucified, "there followed him a great company of people, and of women, which also bewailed and lamented him. But Jesus turning unto them said, Daughters of Jerusalem, weep not for me, but weep for yourselves, and for your children." Luke 23:27, 28

When Jesus was preaching in the temple at Jerusalem He foretold of these days of vengeance. "As for these things which ye behold, the days will come, in the which there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down. And when

ye shall see Jerusalem compassed with armies, then know that the desolation thereof is nigh. For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled. But woe unto them that are with child, and to them that give suck, in those days! for there shall be great distress in the land, and wrath upon this people. And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations." Luke 21:6, 20, 22-24. "Behold, your house is left unto you desolate." Matt. 23:38. Jesus wept over the city of Jerusalem when He considered and thought of the unparalleled calamities which would come upon it.

Accordingly, in 70 A. D. the Roman army under Titus surrounded and besieged the city of Jerusalem. Food supplies ran out and the Jews faced starvation. History relates the account of a woman who killed, roasted and ate her own child because the famine was so great. The city was captured, the temple burned and completely destroyed, and the buildings and walls of the city were demolished. About one and a half million Jews perished within the city as a result of the famine, fire and sword. The Jews who escaped before the siege were dispersed among all nations. Since that time, through the centuries, their name has been a byword-a source of mockery and amusement. World history records that no nation has been so persecuted, tortured and ridiculed in so many foreign lands as the Jews - all in fulfillment of their own request.

Even now in the modern city of Jerusalem, a former German officer named Adolf Eichmann is being tried by an Israeli court on charges he was responsible for the murder of six million Jews in Eastern Europe during Hitler's regime in Nazi Germany. Their property confiscated, Jewish men, women and children were herded like cattle into box cars and hauled to the gas chambers, then buried in mass graves or cremated. Whether or not he is guilty is beside the point. God's decree of punishment of the Jews for Christ's blood upon their hands must and will be carried out, which conveys to the world the solemn lesson that no nation can reject the Son of God with impunity.

Editorials

We had just been getting along the best we could and praying with an expectation that the Lord would do something about it.

Thank God, He has answered prayer and given us more than we were praying for and expecting. Therefore, our souls do "magnify His Word above His name." He has proved to us that His promises are all "yea and amen" to them that trust and believe. He has proved this to us over and over, again and again. Bless His holy name! The office and stencil rooms are now finished and we have moved into them. It seems so good to be in these rooms and out of the close quarters where the work could not be handled conveniently. The wrapping and mailing room is now so much larger and everything arranged for more efficient handling of the work. We ask that our readers will magnify the name of the Lord with us and exalt His Word above all the gods of this world. Let the Word of the Lord be magnified greatly, for by it we shall be judged in that great and final judgment day. Let every thing that hath breath praise the Lord. We want every one to know who have helped with their prayers, labor and means that we appreciate what they have done and thank God that He put it into their hearts to show and manifest this interest in the work of God. May He reward you abundantly is our prayer.

Let us quote the first three verses of the 138th Psalm, "I will praise thee with my whole heart: before the gods will I sing praise unto thee. I will worship toward thy holy temple, and praise thy name for thy loving kindness and for thy truth: for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name. In the day when I cried thou answered me, and strengthenedst me with strength in my soul."

Let us look into the Word of God and see how greatly God has magnified the name of His Son Jesus Christ. In Matt. 28:18 we read what Jesus said the Father had given unto Him. "... All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth." Those who truly abide in Him have nothing to fear, for they know that there is no power greater in heaven and in earth than the power of Christ who has become their strength and life. When they give strict heed and observe His teaching in His Word and hearken

to His voice, they are living by faith and feel no alarm.

In the 5th verse of the 17th chapter of Matt. we read what God said to Peter and the two other disciples concerning His Son Jesus, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; HEAR YE HIM."

In Acts 4:12 we read what Peter says about Jesus, "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Men may believe in God and do many good works and make a big show of being religious, but if they reject Christ they cannot be saved.

In Phil. 2:9 we read, "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father." What a solemn truth we have given here to man from God to reverence and honor His Son! What man or woman would be so stiff-necked and proud in heart as to not bow and confess His Son who was scourged and shamefully handled by wicked men? He was finally crucified as though He were one accursed of God, yet He underwent all of this that we might through Him be saved from our sins. I ask, who would dare to stand out against our crucified and risen Christ who is now our High Priest before God, our heavenly Father?

Let us read some from the first chapter of John's gospel, "In the beginning was the Word; and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." At the 12th verse we read, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believed on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth." Certainly God hath greatly magnified the name of His Son.

But we have a scripture in the 138th Psalm, the 2nd verse, which brings a subject to our minds of deep thought. It is written thus, in part: "THOU HAST MAGNIFIED THY WORD ABOVE ALL THY NAME." Knowing this to be true, how careful we ought to be to see to it that we individually are keeping the teaching of His Word and in so doing we will be magnifying His Word above His name, which pleases God the Father.

It may not occur to some who are not careful about practicing the teachings of His Word and yet in many ways are magnifying His name, that they are deceiving their own souls and have become idol worshippers even as the heathen who worship their idol gods. For an example, let us read Matt. 7:20, "Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them. Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say

to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity." Many popular, big preachers in the world today are magnifying His name above His Word, doing miracles and wonders, but do not keep the teachings of His Word. It seems that most of the people in Christendom are following these false prophets who are deceiving and being deceived. Just because men are doing miracles is no sign that they are of God. We read in Revelation 16:13, "And I saw three unclean spirits like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon, and out of the mouth of the beast, and out of the mouth of the false prophet. For they are the spirits of devils, WORK-ING MIRACLES, which go forth unto the kings of the earth [not of heaven] and of the whole world. [what for] to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty." Every one of us should see to it that we personally and individually keep and observe the teachings of His Word and not follow after nor support the vain talkers and miracle workers who are not careful in keeping His Word.

These three unclean spirits like frogs are loose in the world today, deceiving the multitudes into fellowshipping and supporting unclean doctrines and practices. They are being gathered together against Christ and His saints IN LIGHT who "follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth." By their testimony and the blood of the Lamb the saints will overcome the unclean false prophets in the world today.

Jesus said that "many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?" Brethren and sisters, let us take heed to the Word of God. The New Testament is the VOICE of Christ to us.

In 1st John 2:15 we read, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him." The 17th verse says, "And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." In James 1:21 we read, "Wherefore lay apart [cease from] all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, [the dictionary says, 'uncleaness, unnecessary money and possessions with all wrong doing'] and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls. But be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

All those who claim to be followers of Jesus and dress in the ungodly worldly fashions and customs, wear gold and outward adornments, and the women who paint their face, lips and fingernails, bob their God-given hair, and wear trousers like a man are misrepresenting the Lord rather than representing Him as He is. No doubt you know of some who will get up before a crowd dressed in a worldly garb and sing the song entitled, "How Great Thou Art!" In the words of the song they magnify the Lord, but by their disobedience to His Word they contradict

the truth. God requires us to magnify His Word above His name.

Many today are falling into the snare and trap of Satan by putting television in their homes which brings the world, the enemy of God, right into the home and poisons their children's minds with the deepest impressions of sin and wickedness. If this practice is indulged in, it will sap the life of Christ out of the soul. I believe that I have the mind of Christ when I say that a television in a home that pretends to serve God is a curse to that home and it will take its toll of souls for Satan on down through the years to come. Parents who are praying for God to save their children and then put such a temptation as television before them, ought to be ashamed to treat God and their children in that way. We are taught in God's Word to bring the children up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Eph. 6:4. Putting temptations of a worldly nature before the children is far from bringing them up in the way they should go. Jesus says, "Why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" Luke 6:46. Those who know the Word of God and do not do it are building on a sandy foundation. Matt. 7:26. People that do not do the Word of God are proving to Him that they do not love Him. God requires us to prove our love for Him by keeping His commandments.

In Acts 3:23 we read, "And it shall come to pass, that every soul which will not hear that prophet [Jesus] shall be destroyed from among the people." In John 14:23 Jesus said, "If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him."

In John 12:48 we read again, "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." We are giving out this truth and instruction, not to condemn but to point souls in the way of righteousness that no one will be like the five foolish virgins in that day. We read in 2 Timothy 3:16, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." It is needful that all of His children be righteous, for it is written in 2 Cor. 5:20, "Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as thought God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God. For he hath made him [Christ] to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him." The love of Christ constraineth us to be true to God and to our fellowmen, and make the way plain to all those who have a deep desire to see the blissful ending of a Christian race.

REPORT FROM THE GOLDEN RULE HOME

To the dear saints scattered abroad:

We felt it well to inform you of the progress that is being made on the Golden Rule Home here at Shawnee, Okla. We feel much encouraged in this work and give God thanks for all the ways He is ordering and blessing. We have had much thought concerning the building to accommodate the aged, neglected and handicapped. The Scripture says that in the multitude of counsel there is safety, and we have confided in several of the brethren for advice and we feel God has wonderfully favored us to be able to reach some starting points. Plans have been drawn up for a permanent size kitchen, dining and living area, laundry and storage room. These rooms are planned large enough so that as the home residents increase in number they will still be able to meet the demand. Bedroom plans now are drawn to accommodate 18 beds. If we have an overflow, the house that is on the grounds now can serve to take care of them until we can add more onto the building which is underway.

By the time this writing reaches most of you, the footings for the building will be dug and perhaps poured. This is strictly a move of faith, but we know God honors such and we are moving right along. Faith is not always standing still but progressing into the unseen. After closing the deal on the land, making the down payment, and doing what repairs we have done on the house to get it in shape for the workers to live in, we have about \$1,800.00 in the fund to start the building—but we are starting and we are looking to God to supply as the days and needs arise. Let us each one listen to God and do what we can. Some said, "I wish I could do a lot," but that isn't necessarily the thing that counts. The question is, "Have we done what we could?" A little from each one will make a great sum.

Pray for us that God will give divine guidance and that this building program can go right on in the name of the Lord. Some of the brethren are here now and more are coming in to help with the labor. We will be glad to answer any questions that may be on your minds. Until further progress, we are yours in the work of the Lord.

Campmeeting Time

The time is drawing near for the campmeeting season. As preparations are being made for them in the material way, it is also vital to make preparations spiritually for such. For a campmeeting to be a success, each Christian should come with the proper preparation of heart and spirit, and must attend the meeting with the true, godly attitude of love and concern for the Lord and His cause.

Campmeeting is not a time to come and spend a leisurely vacation. Any one who comes for a good time for the flesh, and fails to realize the weight of eternal importance contained in such an event, will miss the blessing and benefit of such. It is a time for work. It is not just a time for visiting. It is a time to work for Jesus. Sometimes there is a lack of secret prayer—many are visiting and going places for a selfish, fleshly motive when it would be far better for themselves and the success of the meeting if they were somewhere in earnest prayer. Do not let the prayer burden rest only while in service. Carry it with you to the dining hall, to your tent, upon the grounds, and wherever you go. Let nothing be done

that will dampen your burden and concern for the meeting.

Be prepared to receive something from God and His preached Word that will benefit you and promote you in the Christian life. Do not come and feel that you do not need to learn anything. Regardless of your rank or age in the Christian life, there may be something for you to learn and experience. Take heed to your present condition. Let the Word of God search and probe into the deep parts of your life, and do not seek to justify yourself when the Word touches you. Remember that if you sit through several days of a Holy Ghost campmeeting, you are very likely to get exposed by the truth. If so, be honest and measure up in the heart and then you will grow.

Always keep in mind the spiritual necessity of listening to the Word of God. Don't rejoice just when the truth seems like honey, but rejoice when it falls like the hail stones also. If it crosses your understanding, humble your heart before God, remembering that it is not our understanding that is important, but rather the interpretation of God's Spirit. Do not regard the Word in a carnal sense, for that is easy to do if you fail to seek the Spirit. One prayed for the Church thus: "That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him; the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of his power to usward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power (Eph. 1:17-19). If we will attend campmeeting, or any other divine service, with this attitude and prayer of heart, then the blessings of God's revealed Word will have effect.

God hath ordained "by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe." And "the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved, it is the power of God." The effect of real gospel preaching is not to promote the human mind and ability. True gospel preaching is not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power. times a preacher is not considered under the anointing unless he is showing great bodily activity and excellent speech. Beware of such an attitude, my friend. Not every sermon in such manner is anointed of God. Some of the richest sermons I have ever listened to were from the lips of a man or woman who seemed to be in weakness, in fear, in trembling. and who seemed unable to speak in a proper way. The natural inclination at such a time is to get up and leave, go to sleep, or disregard it altogether. But as the heart intently listens and opens itself to the voice of God there will be rich spiritual food from a message that by human observation is not anointed.

There is but one true effect that the preached Word is meant to have upon the listener. "That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." (1 Cor. 2:5). Real gospel preaching will only tend to exalt your faith in the power of God. There will be no inclination to exalt the preacher if the listener receives the spiritual uplift given. A vital topic of true spiritual preaching is the cross of Christ—Jesus Christ and Him crucified. Beware lest the carnal mind be given room within the heart to work and thus hinder the soul from gaining the spiritual power and grace needed. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." 2 Tim. 3:16-17. —Leslie Busbee

"One Body in Christ"

The Church of God is one; hence in its normal condition it unites believers in "one body in Christ"; whereas sects scatter and divide.

To illustrate: Suppose that in a certain town a meeting is held and one hundred people are converted. In that place there are now one hundred members of the Church of God. God has set them in His Body. Their names are written in heaven. The Lord has joined them together in the bonds of love, peace, and perfect unity of the Spirit. The New Testament is their faith and discipline. They have one faith and one doctrine. They assemble and worship God, observe the ordinances, and have God's approval upon them. God will call some to the work of elders and deacons. After such have proved themselves worthy of these offices, they will be ordained by the laying on of hands. This, dear reader, is a perfectly organized body of believers, in harmony with the New Testament.

But suppose that, for want of better light, twenty join the Catholic sect, ten the Methodist, twenty the Baptist, five the Dunkard, five the Quaker, ten the Salvation Army, five the Lutheran, ten the Pentecost Band, five the Presbyterian, and ten the Mennonite. What does this effect? Sectarian teachers will tell you that this is organizing the church; but the fact is, it is disorganizing them. They now belong to ten sect bodies, whereas before they belonged to but one—the body of Christ, the true Church. Those one hundred saints now on Sunday morning meet in ten places of worship, whereas before they all assembled in one place. They now represent ten different faiths, while before they all had "one faith."

Any honest soul can see at a glance that the sects scatter and divide the children of God. If those hundred should receive light from God, come out of those ten sects, and abide only in the Church of God, their doing so would not tear down the Church, but would build it up and unite it.

Unanswered Prayers

Many people believe that God hears and answers prayer. But it's one thing to believe this, and quite another to experience it. One thing that concerns my heart is unanswered prayers! I'm convinced that if all our prayers were being answered, things would be quite different. Our unanswered prayers should shame and probe us out of our spiritual delinquency and backsliding! The Bible makes it unmistakably clear that when certain conditions are met the believer gets an answer to his prayer.

The church prays for peace, and there are wars and rumors of wars. We pray for revival, but there is not enough evidence of genuine Holy Ghost working. The sick are prayed for, but all too often wind up in the hospital or cemetery. We pray for unsaved loved ones and they grow harder each week. Now, I don't want to sound pessimistic, but let's face it, Christians. We are seeing too little results in our prayer life to allow us to live at ease with our conscience and still claim to be spiritual!

There are conditions for effective prayer. Unless we meet them we shall take our place with an unbelieving, apostate, castaway church. Let us see some of the things which make for effective prayer:

1. The New Birth. The unregenerated heart finds no promise anywhere in the Bible on which to base a faithful prayer. God's ear is not tuned to the cry of the sinner unless it be for pardon or purity. But when he turns from his sin by faith to Jesus Christ, is born of the Spirit of God and inducted into the true Church, he is an adopted son of God. We call this conversion, and only after this has happened to the sinner can he truly pray. "Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God." (Romans 8:26-27). What fellowship and communion the believing heart finds with God through prayer! I feel sorry for the multitudes who endeavor to pray in the flesh, having never experienced the spiritual transformation of the heart by the Holy Spirit.

- 2. Faith. "He that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." (Hebrews 11:6). Christians, our unbelief is costing us something. It is preventing our becoming spiritual millionaires! Let us search our hearts before God until He has cleansed us from the sin of unbelief. Someone has said, "If there should arise one utterly believing man, the history of the world might be changed!"
- 3. Holy Living. The Psalmist said, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me." Billy Sunday used to say, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord has his fingers in His ears!" Any known sin in our life will shut the gate of prayer. We had just as well get up from our praying and stop teasing God so long as we love any evil deed in our life. We cannot fool God. A reckless, careless, worldly, lustful, selfish life is the answer to thousands of unanswered prayers. If we do business with a holy God, we must let His Spirit make us holy. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9).
- 4. Obedience. Jesus said, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." (John 15:7). Disobedience kills faith, and without faith it is impossible to get an audience with God. Faithless praying is disgusting to God, disappointing to those about us, and defeat to our own hearts. At any point in the Christian journey that we decide to take our own way, at that moment faith goes dead. But constant submission maintains a fresh faith that grips the promises of God expecting definite results from His great Heart and Hand.
- 5. Humility. "And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men." (Matthew 6:5). Religious pride is an abomination to God. Someone has said that there are three kinds of pride—personal, social and spiritual. Personal pride is the pride of face; social pride is the pride of place; and spiritual pride is the pride of grace. Whatever our pride, God does not hear the cry of the proud. "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise." (Psalm 51:17).
- 6. Unselfishness. The Bible says, "Whoso stoppeth his ears at the cry of the poor, he also shall cry himself, but shall not be heard." A stingy, close-fisted, material-minded soul has no business making a request from an all-loving, ever merciful God unless it be for cleansing from the sin of selfishness. If we are unwilling to give, God will not give to us.

"Give" is the key word in the whole Christian theme. God gave His Son. The Son gave His life. From the very beginning of the early Church, God calls upon His children to Give!

He who is not willing to give piles up prayer after prayer that is never answered.

A Forgiving Spirit. Jesus said, "And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses. But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Mark 11:25-26).

The Negro educator, Booker T. Washington, said, "I refuse to allow any man to ruin my life by making me hate him!" It is true that hating a person is liable to harm him, but it is also true that he who does the hating is absolutely ruined!

We need a revival of prayer. It is prayer time around the world. The kind of praying that the Saviour engaged in cost Him time, toil, tears and blood. May God raise up prayer warriors! When He does, a revival will be brought down!

Our prayerlessness is showing up on us. One of the deadliest perils of twentieth century Christendom is a Social Gospel that is trying to substitute for a Spiritual one. This great evil is nothing else but a product of prayerlessness.

Our Nation needs prayer. America is the last stronghold of liberty. When she forfeits her freedom through liberal minded politicians the Iron Curtain is sure to drop on us. International problems, cold and hot wars have piled up problems too great for present day diplomats. Anti-Christ movements are being spear-headed by atheistic Communism. It is time for a call to prayer and fasting and repentance. We need a returning to the old paths of principle and righteousness.

Our youth need prayer. Teen-agers today live in almost an entirely different world than did their fathers and mothers when they were the same age. This age is Pagan in its standards and rotten in its morals. Our only hope for our sons and daughters is a personal knowledge of the saving grace of Jesus Christ!

Dear reader, if you are a Christian, will you give yourself to a deeper ministry of sacrificial, spiritual, scriptural prayer?

If you are unconverted, let me urge you to turn to Jesus Christ now, confessing and forsaking your sins, and by faith receive Him into your heart, to henceforth live a Christian, prayerful life.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The second portion brings out the fact that there is a time for everything. In our lives today we have a time for things to be done—a time to work and rest, laugh and weep, etc., but the solemn thought is to live so that when the time comes to die we will be ready to meet our Judge. In all the busy affairs of life it is most important to take time to get ready to live again with Jesus in eternity. In so doing we will not only save our own souls but help to save the souls of others.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We should not try to lean to human wisdom but to the wisdom of God. The Bible is right. If youth would listen to the Preacher as He urges them to "remember their Creator in the days of their youth," what a blessing their life would be to themselves, the world and to God. Children need to be taught the ways of God early in life. I have noticed that those who have a tender heart and have sought the Lord in their youth, receiving a touch of God upon their souls, can never get away from it completely. Even though they wander away in sin, it is a drawing to them to return. The logical ones to lead a child to the Lord is his parents. The Sunday school teacher, pastor, older brothers and sisters, and God's children should show interest in the salvation of the youth. Wrong decisions and habits formed in youth affect a person's whole life.

The infirmities of old age are real just as it is brought out in our lesson. It takes grace from God to grow old with His favor upon the individual. It takes grace to let others do the things you used to do or to have to wait for others to come to you and help you when you would much rather help others. God's grace is sufficient and everyone who will look to God can "bear fruit in old age."

How glad Paul was that he could leave a testimony at the end of his life that "I have fought, I have finished, I have kept the faith." We, too, can receive that "crown of righteousness" when we come to the end of life if we are true to God.

- 5. Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindleth!
- 6. And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.
- 7. For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind:
- 8. But the tongue can no man tame; it is an unruly evil full of deadly poison.
- 9. Therewith bless we God, even the Father; and therewith curse we men, which are made after the similitude of God.
- 10. Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be.
- 11. Doth a fountain send forth at the same place sweet water and bitter?
- 12. Can the fig tree, my brethren, bear olive berries? either a vine, figs? so can no fountain both yield salt water and fresh.

Memory Verse: A soft answer turneth away wrath, but grievous words stir up anger. Proverbs 15:1.

Practical Truth: Be sure to think twice before you speak.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The central admonition given by Bro. James is in verse 10, "My brethren, these things ought not so to be." How quickly the wrong words spoken can turn happiness into sorrow. There is enough sorrow in the world today and we do not want to add to it. Words spoken may be repented of and forgiveness sought, but the effect of them sometimes lingers for years. How careful God wants His children to be that their words be "seasoned with salt." (Col. 4:6). Salt seems to blend the flavors of foods and makes them more enjoyable to eat. The salt of love needs to flavor our words, even though admonition is given, so that it can be easily received. God can help us if we seek Him earnestly and be watchful.

In the world, scandals have been repeated again and again on an innocent party who eventually died brokenhearted. The one who started it might try to correct it, but he can never gather it up again. The lesson was given of how tales once told is like a bag of feathers emptied in the wind. Someone was told to gather up all of them. Some were never found.

The cure for gossip is to get the heart filled with divine love for every soul. Just as God was not willing that anyone should perish, neither are His children willing that they perish. This will cause a carefulness to be shown in God's children toward everyone regardless of their station in life.

James 2:8. If ye fulfil the royal law according to the

scripture, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself, ye do well-

- 11. Behold, we count them happy which endure. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy.

Practical Truth: A Christian proves the reality of his profession by the integrity of his life.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Only by faith are we justified. All the good works that we have ever done or ever can do will not merit salvation. No man can be justified in the sight of God by keeping the law. (Gal. 3:11). Works are the results of faith in God that justified. If we "walk in the Spirit" as Paul tells us to do, we shall obey the Spirit's prompting and perform the kind of good works which are commanded not only by James but by Christ and the apostles

When we have divine love in our hearts we will not be looking at the person's appearance, station in life, nationality, righteousness or unrighteousness, but at his soul. Every person has a soul and we have a responsibility to help that soul make it into heaven if we can.

We cannot pick out just parts of the Bible and live by it but we must keep all the Word of God. Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away but my word shall not pass away." It is a solemn thought that if we are guilty in one point we are guilty of all.

Complete trust and confidence in God will help His children to be patient. We are just vessels of the Lord and He can do with us as He pleases. Many down through the ages have been blessed by the patience of Job. God is waiting for the precious fruit of the earth, while we in patience wait for them to ripen in us.
