The Sin of Rebellion

We read in 1 Sam. 15:23: "For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry." Saul had disobeyed God. In other words, he rebelled against the command of God to have his own way. Did you ever know of a time when people wanted their own way as today? I believe we are living in the most rebellious age the world has ever known. From little children up to all ages, they are rebellious. Children are rebelling against their parents, when the Word of God says, "Children obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right." Eph. 6:1. But instead of obeying God's command they follow their own way. Many parents set the example before them.

Mothers and wives all over the land are rebelling against their God-given duties of the home, saying they "just don't like house-work and the children get on their nerves; they feel like a prisoner within four walls." So they go out and take a job, many of them, against their husbands' wishes, forsaking their children and home to have their liberty and own way. Yet the Word of God says, "Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands as unto the Lord." Eph. 5: 22. "That they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children, to be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands that the word of God be not blasphemed." Titus 2:4, 5.

Husbands likewise are rebelling against God and their duties of providing for the home, forgetting the vows they made to each other and before God and man. Eph. 5:25, 31, "Husbands, love your wives even as Christ also loved the Church and gave himself for it. For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother and shall be joined unto his wife and they two shall be one flesh." Homes are broken. Instead of love, the home is filled with rebellion. There would never be a divorce if rebellion did not

get into the heart. The dear children are neglected, and grow up without the training they should have, with no respect for the rules of home, schools, or the laws of the land, but rebel against authority of any kind. Crime is increasing day by day, all because of rebellion and the hardness of hearts. It is a sad picture indeed!

Many whose hearts were once tender and easily touched by the Word of God, today have little respect for it, because they have rebelled and wanted their own way, instead of God's way. Many say they can't live it, when in reality they have let a little rebellion into the heart.

The text compares rebellion to witchcraft. Why? Because it is so deceiving. Many have been deceived by witchcraft or fortune-tellers of our land making them believe they will receive great riches or honor and success, when it turns out the opposite. Satan deceives souls by making them think they can have their own way instead of taking God's Word and His way. They will be disappointed just like the one who believed the fortune-teller. Rebellion is the opposite of submission.

Dear reader, is it hard for you to obey God's Word on every line? Or do you want your way in some things? Satan will deceive you and make you think you don't have to be so careful to follow all the Word. We read in Deut. 5:29, "O that there were such a heart in them, that they would fear me, and keep ALL my commandments ALWAYS, that it might be well with them, and with their children for ever!" Oh, the blessings of submitting to God and His precious Word! But many fail to receive the blessings of the Lord by their rebellious attitude of heart.

Many rebel against the ministers who teach the Word, but we read in Heb. 13:17, "Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves; for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy and not grief; for that is unprofitable for you." Many refuse to take instruction, but take their own way. They become heady, highminded, exalted in themselves, lose their first love, become empty, critical of God's people and fault-finders, all because they let a little rebellion creep into their hearts. Surely, it is unprofitable for their souls.

Jesus is our perfect example, and He submitted Himself to His Father even though the cup was bitter, because He loved us so. Then He says to us, "If ye love me, ye will keep my commandments." It may be hard to measure to all the Word sometimes, but if we will go again and pray to God with a submissive heart, He will strengthen us and we can say, "Thy will be done." Then what joy we receive! If a misunderstanding arises, submit to your brother and to God. 1 Pet. 5:5, "Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea ALL of you be subject one to another and be clothed with humility; for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble."

Under the law it was the death penalty to refuse to obey the commands (Joshua 1:18). Today it will bring to us spiritual death if we refuse to obey God's Word to all the light we have. But if we yield our hearts to God, the Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth.

Let us be followers of God as "dear children" and let not the sin of rebellion keep us out of heaven.

The Better Church of God Under The New Testament

There are two great errors advanced in the ecclesiastical world in regard to the church question. One is that God had no organized church under the Old Testament, and the other is that Jesus Christ has not organized a new church under the New Testament, but has merely improved the church of Moses and extended it into the Gentile world.

I begin with Matt. 16:18: "And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." Jesus here represents himself as an organizer of a church; he plainly says, "I will build my church;" we would, therefore, be ignoring his words to say that he did not build a church.

We will turn next to the epistle unto the Hebrews: "And Moses verily was faithful in all his house, as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken after; but Christ as a son over his own house, whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope, firm unto the end." Heb. 3:5, 6. The two churches, that of the Old Testament and that of the New, are here spoken of in the figure of two houses. The Old Testament church is represented as the house of Moses, and that of the New Testament as the house of Christ. Moses is said to have been faithful as a servant of God in his house, and Christ is said to be faithful as a Son of God in his house. Christ's house or church, according to this text must be greater than Moses' church, inasmuch as the son is greater than the servant. That the term "house" in this text signifies a church is evident from Paul's first epistle to Timothy, in which he says the house of God is "the church of the living God." 1 Tim. 3:15. He is speaking here of Christ's house, and if Christ's house is the church of the New Testament, Moses' house must have been the church of the Old Testament.

We will notice the nature of Christ's church in comparison with the church of Moses. "Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ." 1 Pet. 2:5. Christ's church is here denominated a spiritual house; Moses' church was not a spiritual house, but merely of a secular nature; it was constituted by a literal nation of flesh and blood, while Jesus' church is constituted by a spiritual nation who are saved by grace—the genera body of true Christians. Paul defined the New Test

ament church as follows: "And have put all things under his feet, and gave him to be head over all things to the church which is his body." Again, in Col. 1:24 he says, "Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the church." These texts make the body of Christ and the church identical. This is the only universal signification the word church has in the New Testament. The body of Christ is composed of all the true members of Christ; hence we have in these scriptures a proof of my assertion that the church is constituted by all those who are saved by grace.

We have seen that Moses' church was a secular arrangement and had therefore literal doors by which men entered into it, and a literal door through which men passed out of it. So likewise we shall now see that inasmuch as Christ's church is of a spiritual nature, it has a spiritual door of admission into it and a spiritual door of expulsion from it.

The door of admission into Christ's church is explained in 1 Cor. 12:13, "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have all been made to drink into one Spirit." The one body mentioned here is the one body of Christ, which I have before shown to be the church of the New Testament. The baptism of the Spirit which makes us members of the church of Christ, is the same experience that is elsewhere in the New Testament denominated the birth of the Spirit. This is the only door through which men may enter the New Testament church. Natural birth made men members of the Jewish church, but a spiritual birth is required to make us members of the Christian church.

Let us now compare the door of excommunication from the New Testament church with the door of excommunication from the Old Testament church. Since natural birth made the Jews members of the Old Testament church, they were bound to retain their church membership as long as natural life continued, regardless of the multitude or heinousness of the sins they might commit; hence the only door through which a member of the Jewish church could have been expelled was that of natural death. Therefore none but those who committed capital sins could have been legally excommunicated, their excommunications having consisted of a stoning to death or execution by some other means. As spiritual birth is the door into the church of the New Testament, those who have been born of the Spirit retain their church membership as long as they retain their spiritual life. They can only retain their spiritual life so long as they refrain from committing sin, because we are told that "sin, when it is finished [committed] bringeth forth death." James 1:15.

As only natural death ended membership in the Old Testament church, and every member of the Jewish nation, no matter how wicked, continued in the church until death, the Jewish church was an unholy church. But not so with the church of the

New Testament. Since spiritual death ends our membership in the church of Christ, and it is brought about by a single sin against God, no human being with the condemnation of sin upon his soul can ever possess a membership in the New Testament church; hence it must be a holy church.

As the church of the Old Testament was merely human, or secular, in its nature, it was but a union of the bodies of the people, and with the death of its members it ceased to exist; but the New Testament church being spiritual in its nature binds together the souls of men into a perfect unity in Christ; hence we read of the members of the New Testament church that they are "of one heart and one soul." Acts 4:32. Physical death does not affect our membership in Christ's church, but we continue in it the same after death. God's church upon earth in the new dispensation is the same in its nature as his church in heaven, or in other words it is the same church that has come down from heaven. Well could the apostle Paul speak of "the whole family in heaven and earth." Eph. 3:15.

The government of the New Testament church, like its organization, is spiritual and divine. The officers are all appointed by God through the Holy Spirit. See 1 Cor. 12:28; Eph. 4:11; Acts 13:1-3; 20-28. The discipline of Christ's church is the New Testament; it is the only book of government that has been given by the Founder of the church; hence it is to be granted that he has not intended that we should have another, and I feel safe in saying that none who possess a membership in Christ's church alone will ever need another.

EDITORIALS

There will be no "Faith and Victory" paper issued for the month of August as is our usual custom. However there will be some of us here at the office all the time to take care of the mail, and to wrap and mail out the orders for tracts, books and papers. We shall also send out the rolls of Sunday School lessons for the month of August.

We certainly do appreciate the good Christian printshop workers whom the Lord has sent to help get the gospel to men by the printed page. The Lord does not fail to take care of His work and the Lord's Print Shop has been a very busy place all winter and this spring. Besides the regular work of printing the "Faith and Victory" paper each month and the many tracts to keep in stock. He has also enabled us to print a number of books which were written by some of the early ministers of this "evening light" truth which we all love. Truly, the truth of God's Word is still marching on and will shine brighter and more perfectly as we near the end of time and the Lord's coming. It will be flashing from east to west and from north to south, and will shine more and more unto the perfect day. Bless His name!

Our thoughts this morning are upon the prophecy of the prophets and upon Christ, His work and His Kingdom. In Exodus 19:6 we read what God said to the Hebrew nation through Moses: "And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests and an holy nation. . . ." In Luke 16:16 we read, "The law and the prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." The law and its rites were a shadow of the good things which we have in Christ. Now the kingdom of God is preached. The prophets prophesied of the good works that Jesus would do for us and of the sacrifice that He would make to bring us unto God.

In Matt. 5:17 we read the words of Jesus, "Think not that I am come to destroy the law or the prophets: I am not come to destroy but to fulfill." In the next verse he makes it plain that one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the Law, till all be fulfilled. According to the words of Christ all the foreshadowing of the law and all the prophecies of the prophets would be fulfilled in Christ or in this gospel dispensation. None of them were to reach beyond the destruction of the earth which will be burned up at His coming. 2 Peter 3:10.

Let us turn now and see what the prophets have to say about the great and mighty work that Jesus was to do for all mankind when He came into the world. The first prophecy we will notice is found in Genesis 49:10 and it reads thus, "The sceptre shall not depart from Judah nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh [Christ] come; and unto him shall the gathering of the people be." The sceptre is an emblem of sovereign authority. The Jewish nation had a house, temple or tabernacle where God. their Sovereign Ruler, met with them and the law of Moses was read or rehearsed. The Word says that He would not depart from them until Shiloh come. According to the words of Christ, the Sovereign Ruler did not depart from the Jewish nation until they crucified Christ, the Son of God. Jesus said unto them, "Behold, your house is left unto you desolate." In Matt. 8:12 we read what Jesus says, "But the children of the kingdom [Jewish people] shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth." Listen to what Jesus says to the Jews in His day, "There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out."

While the Jewish nation was in favor with God He met with them in their house or temple at Jerusalem and that was a heavenly place for them, but since they crucified Christ, their house was left unto them desolate, for God ceased to meet with them there. Since Christ has come and by His blood sacrifice has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel of salvation for our souls, we are made new creatures in Christ-old things of the law nature have passed away, and behold, all things are become new. The Jewish economy and their literal worship in a literal house, which is termed their heaven, all passed away and now we have a new heaven in our souls which is Christ in us, the hope of Glory. We read about this in Acts 7:47, "But Solomon built him an house. Howbeit the most High dwelleth not in temples made with hands; as saith the prophet, heaven is my throne and earth is my footstool: what house will ye build me? saith the Lord: or what is the place of my rest? Hath not my hands made all these things?" In John 4:23. Jesus said to the woman at the well, "But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. God is a spirit; and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth." Thus we learn from these scriptures that God is not confined to any literal house that man has built, but every one that is born again from above is His child and He inhabits him. All the born-again ones are His children, his wife, his temple, his family, his house, the Church of God, the pillar and ground of the truth and they become an habitation of God through the Spirit. In Eph. 2:21, we read, "In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: in whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit." Jesus did not patch up the law (Mark 21:22, 23) or the Jewish worship in the temple built at Jerusalem, but now we worship in New Jerusalem, a spiritual house not made with hands. Read in 1 Peter 2:5, "Ye also as lively stones are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God by Jesus Christ."

Let us see what the prophet says about this new house, new city, new temple or New Jerusalem which Jesus has built together as a spiritual people whom He inhabits. In the 28th chapter of Genesis we read about the dream that Jacob had concerning the house of God. He saw a ladder set up on the earth. and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold, the angels of God ascending and descending on it. The Lord stood above it, and said, "I am the God of Abraham, thy father, and the God of Isaac." When Jacob awakened out of his sleep he said, "Surely the Lord is in this place; and I knew it not." He said "How dreadful is this place! This is none other but the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven." Jacob got a vision of the new house of God that was to be set up on the earth by Christ Jesus. The ladder could represent Christ, and as we grow in grace and knowledge we climb up in Him to heaven. The angels could be ministering spirits ministering to the children of God who are His household of faith living in the earth. In Isaiah 2:3 we find these words. "Let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob." In the 9th chapter of Isaiah and the 6th verse we read of a child being born and a son given and "the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The Mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this."

Let us turn to the New Testament and see where the Lord brought these prophecies to pass. In Matt. 1:21 we read, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins." In Luke 1:30 we read, "And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favor with God. And behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: and he shall reign over the house of Jacob [His saved children] for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end." In Hebrews 3:6 we learn that we who are saved are the house of the Lord. Also read 1 Timothy 3:15. Let us read Luke 16:16, "The law and the prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." In Luke 12:32 we read, "Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." In Romans 14:17 we read, "For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink [literal things]; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost." Thanks be unto God who gives us victory over Satan and makes us able to reign with Him in this life in His kingdom.

The above editorial and the missionary exhortation on page 13 are the last writings for the paper of our beloved father and editor.

Truly, the family and the staff of co-workers are indeed saddened, but we sorrow not as those who have no hope. Perhaps even now we do not fully realize the loss we have sustained in the great battle against sin and Satan, but there is in our hearts a lively hope and bright anticipation of meeting him again with all the faithful of the ages around the eternal throne of God.

At the close of that warm June day when my father was so suddenly taken from us, I returned to my home from the office about 10 p.m. I was there alone in my grief, my wife, Maybelle, having gone on the previous Monday to the bedside of her mother in San Bernardino, Calif. where she had suffered a stroke. (Please pray for her and all the family in this trial of affliction.) As I lifted my heart to the Lord in prayer, I asked Him to give me a special scripture for my comfort and consolation. As I opened my Bible this is the first verse that came to my view: "I will call on the Lord, who is worthy to be praised: so shall I be saved from mine enemies." II Sam. 22:4. This was David's song of thanksgiving after he was delivered out of the hand of Saul, and this is the text I am resting upon. In calling on the Lord I am fully convinced there is a solution and a way to meet with victory every problem of life.

My father's desire and request was that my sister, Mrs. Anna Marie Miles, and myself should assume and continue the operation of this publishing work after his passing in accordance with the original aims and purposes for which it was established. Over the years he has communicated these policies to us.

Not only was this his request, but also the Lord has especially burdened each of us to labor for Him in this capacity. In obedience to this call we have been directly engaged in the work for a number of years. As a lad of 13 years I learned to operate the Linotype machine in this publishing work and helped most of the time in the shop until 1934 when I took a job as a printer operator in a local commercial printing plant and resigned from that position in 1958. Since then I have been engaged in this gospel printing work.

Some 36 years ago, in 1927, this writer as a boy of 16 years, was definitely converted at an old-fashioned campmeeting of the Church of God in Oklahoma City. Then and there I counted the cost, paid the price and made a decision to follow the Lord the remainder of my life. Later I sought and obtained the experience of sanctification, dedicating my life to the leadings of the Spirit of God. Up to this moment my faith has not failed, though tried many times, and the anchor holds firm to the solid Rock. Through all these years we have been intensely interested and closely connected with this gospel printing work which my father, mother and co-laborers were engaged in, and have aided in its advancement and progress in every way possible.

Now we believe that the Lord will help us in the much greater responsibility that has fallen upon us. By the special help and leadings of the Holy Spirit, and the earnest prayers of the saints we will endeavor to continue to proclaim the great truths of the Bible which brought forth this precious "evening light" reformation, free from compromise or fanaticism. To this end we so-

licit the earnest prayers and co-operation of the Church at large.

Our father left no written will, nor an earthly inheritance to his children, but did leave the greatest heritage—a godly life—that a parent could leave to his child. He did not need a will, as he had already placed what the Lord had given him into God's work. No real or personal property remained in his name excepting a little personal money in the total amount of \$50.56. Aside from this sum and a few small offerings received for this occasion, the funeral expenses will be paid from the funds of Faith Pub. House as the Lord supplies.

Mother Nettie Pruitt, his wife, and the six children of Fred Pruitt, who are his legal heirs, have willingly signed an agreement releasing the Faith Pub. House from any liability in the matter of the estate of Fred Pruitt since this is a non-profit religious institution, and all of them definitely expressed the desire that this work be carried on in the same manner and for the same purposes as it has in the past, according to our father's wishes.

In life our father and mother lived plain and simple lives in harmony with the teachings of God's Word, not wasting the Lord's money in extravagance. Likewise, to be consistent with their lives they desired that in death and burial this simplicity of Christ would be expressed. Their wishes were carried out. Their caskets were plain, but adequate for the occasion. The Lord's money was not "buried" in vaults and other unnecessary items. They are not in the grave, but there lies merely the houses in which they lived, and soon all will return to the dust from whence it came.

Words cannot express the love and appreciation we have for the children of God who have been so precious to stand by us in this time of sorrow. At times it seemed my heart would break but then the echo of words spoken directly to me, and over the phone, and those written in letters helped me to look up to God and He would ease the hurt and again I could see God's hand working and I could view my father's going as he did. He has talked to me in the last couple of years about his going as any person would talk about the trip they intended to take. He made me feel that this trip was to be the most glorious trip he would ever take. He instructed me about what he wanted done in this work which was so close to his heart. He knew the burden I had for it and he and Lawrence and I prayed together often about its progress in reaching more souls.

When I was still small, I sat at a table and folded tracts by hand as we did not have a tract folder in those days. As I grew older I learned to operate some of the machinery. When I was a child it was just work that had to be done to me but when I was older and was saved, a burden fell upon me to help others. Many times I would fold tracts, wrap papers, fill orders and pray the Lord to make that particular tract, booklet or paper a blessing to some soul. I helped here in the office until my marriage at the age of 22 years. Before I married I traveled in the gospel work with my father and we were in close communion with each other. When my husband asked for me, he told Carl that he could hardly give me up but felt it would only be selfishness to want to keep me from him. For 18 years I lived in California after marriage. During those years I learned many things. At the time I did not know that the Lord was preparing me for this work. I had some hard things to endure that has helped me to understand those who have troubles.

In October, 1954 I came to Guthrie and cared for my precious mother for two weeks before she was called to her reward. I returned to California with a burden upon my heart. I left my bereaved father who told me with tears that he did not know how he could carry on this printing work alone. He needed a man and his wife to move in here with him but who would that be? I requested prayer at the chapel in Pomona where I was pastor at that time, that God would fill the vacancy made here in the printing work, as I wanted to see it continue unhindered. One day in prayer the Lord made me know He wanted me to come here and help. What a mountain stood between me and a move to this place! The saints in Pomona didn't want me to leave them when I told them of my burden. Some, with tears, just told me they felt that surely someone else would come. Some in California wrote me that I was needed there more than here. But God had laid the burden and the mountain to be moved was His. After much prayer I was much surprised to find that my husband was somewhat favorable. He had a good job with seniority. Some at work plainly told him he was making a big mistake but God's big hand was in it all. My teen-age boys were willing. When I wrote my father about it he wrote me that God had answered prayer in a greater way than he ever expected. Soon our furniture was sold, our home redecorated and rented and we were on our way. The call to come was so definite and so plain. God had worked a miracle to bring me here. I have had some hard things to face because I was willing to be in this work and be in the front of the battle for God and I would be afraid to ever leave here until God makes it very plain to me. The burden is heavy upon my heart to see that souls still have a chance to read the plain gospel story that goes out through the literature from this place. So much false literature is dumped on the reading public that we must see that the Truth is sent forth. Dear ones, pray for me, my brother and the dear workers here that we ever keep that burden for souls upon us. Some might feel that we do not ever have any battles with the enemy here. But dear ones, the devil does not want truth to go forth and he would like to stop the flow of truth from here. But by the grace of God and your prayers we intend to work on until we, too, can lay down our armor as my precious father longed to do many times. God has made plain His will concerning me at this time and that is to help keep this work going until He makes me know differently. I feel that as God has definitely led me in the past, He will continue to do so in the future.

My father was here in the office and he told Lawrence that he had had a hurting in his chest for the past two days and he thought he would go down to his house and rest. Lawrence came into the press room and told me. As I started down to see about him, my nephew came running in and told me that Mother Nettie, my father's wife, was calling for me. I hurried down and my father was having a heart attack but we did not know at that time just exactly what the trouble was. We called Bro. and Sr. Stover, our pastor, to come. We and the workers prayed and he soon got relief. Later he got up and took the mail to town around five o'clock. Later in the evening he had another attack. The Lord again heard prayer. I stayed with him most of the night. He rested fairly well. Around nine o'clock the next morning on Thursday, June 6, he had another one and he asked us to pray the Lord to take him out of the suffering. We couldn't seem to realize he was so near the end. But at 10:45 he was gone to His Saviour, whom he loved so dearly. We could hardly believe it. But that is the way he wanted to go. He had told me many times that he

wanted to go quickly as he was keeping ready to go at any time. Lately he has talked much of heaven and that he was anxious to go there.

The next morning after he was gone I opened my Bible and it fell open to 1 Chron. 28:9. This verse I had underlined some time ago. It was like my father speaking to me. "And thou, Solomon my son, know thou the God of thy father, and serve him with a perfect heart and with a willing mind: for the Lord searcheth all hearts, and understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek him, he will be found of thee; but if thou forsake him, he will cast thee off forever. Take heed now; for the Lord hath chosen thee to build a house for the sanctuary: be strong and do it." Oh, how my heart was strengthened as I thought of the great responsibility that had fallen upon my brother and me. That responsibility is too big for us but we are serving the same God my father did, and if we keep serving him with a "perfect heart" and "a willing mind," he "will be found" of us.

I have been here working with my father now almost nine years. We had appointments nearly every Sunday at other towns in places where the saints did not have a pastor but did have a place of worship. I had been driving the car and taking him, his wife and others to these places. We would have two services and the Lord blessed us together in our labors for God. Many times I would ask him to tell me if I preached anything that would not be just as God's Word taught it because I valued the revelation that God had given him on the Word. Yet the same Holy Spirit was revealing the same word of truth to me. Our spiritual life together has been precious.

As I came into the office this morning rather early the tears flowed, as I didn't see my father here as he always was. We miss him and it seems we will miss him even more as the days bring the realization more and more that we will not see him again in this life, but thank God, we sorrow not as those who have no hope.

The flowers were beautiful that so many dear ones had sent to help ease the heartache. The cards with wonderful verses and written words of comfort were precious. We do not feel that we are able to answer individually each one, so please accept these few words as an answer. You have helped us so much! We appreciate all those who came from far and near to speak a word of comfort. We are grateful to those who were close and brought food and have done so much. May God bless and reward all of you.

It helped so much to have my brother and sister from California and my brother from Arizona to come and be with us three children here in our sorrow.

JESUS CHRIST HEALS TODAY

Colo.—Dear Bro. Pruitt and Co-workers: I hope this letter finds everyone well, and in good health. I have thought about sending in my testimony to the paper for some time, as I thought it would be to the glory of God.

In January, 1962 my right eye began to bother me. I was unsaved then, and didn't trust the Lord. I began going to doctors to see about it, and took treatment for it. But it continued to get worse. I had an ulcer on my eye pupil which finally dried up and left a scar which the doctor told me was permanent. In April the eye specialist told me there was nothing else he could do to my eye, and that there wasn't a chance of it ever getting clear again. In June the Lord saved me at home. The weight of my problems seemed to crush me down until I didn't have anywhere to turn but to the Lord. I started praying for the Lord to heal my eye, but it continued to get worse. By the last of July it was so bad I had to quit my good job and take another job where I could get by with the sight from only one eye. 'I couldn't see more than two or three feet in front of me, and the light hurt my eye constantly. I wore a bandage over it and the pupil was milky-looking. Then in Sept. Bro. Murphy Allen was holding a meeting in Guthrie, Okla. where we were living at that time. I was impressed to get him and Bro. Pruitt to pray for me. The devil really tried to hinder me from doing it, because I had already been prayed for at campmeeting for healing. But I was going by James 5:14, 15, and Hebrews 10:23. They anointed me and prayed the prayer of faith. From there on I took it by faith. My first test came the next morning. I hadn't been able to work without a patch, because I couldn't stand the light, but Jesus said, "Step out by faith," so I did, and my eye didn't hurt all day long, which was truly a miracle. I never wore another patch, and my eye continued to get better until I could get my old job back, and I witnessed to my boss, and all at the plant what God had done. It was a long fight of faith, but I never once gave up my complete healing, although I was sorely tried. At this writing, June 1, 1963, my eye is nearly as good as the other eye and doesn't bother me any more.

I'm in my C. O. work now in Denver and would appreciate hearing from any of the saints. I'm encouraged to go all the way with the Lord. I can never thank the Lord enough for what he has done for me.

Wayne Turner, age 27 years, was taken April 7, 1963 at the parish jail at Amite, La. where last year he received a definite experience of Bible salvation after hearing the gospel message. His account of his wonderful conversion has blessed many people far and near. (His testimony in tract form is available at this Office.)

The court granted a request that he be baptized. Accordingly, on April 24, 1963, with the saints from Hammond and Loranger, La. in attendance, Bro. Pinkerton baptized Bro. Turner near Loranger in a pond on the land of Byron and Clarice Pruitt, my son and daughter-in-law. It was a very touching as well as a joyous occasion. The Lord's presence witnessed to this scene of baptism by immersion.

Recently Bro. Turner's case came before the State Supreme Court, and it affirmed the decision and sentence of the lower court that he should die for the crime of murder. Subsequently, on May 17th, he was transferred to the State prison at Angola, La. where he is confined in a small cell. Up to this writing he has been

allowed very few visitors.

My son, Byron and his wife, who have been in close contact with Bro. Turner at the parish jail for about a year, requested on the phone that the saints pray that arrangements can be made with the officials so they and others will be privileged to contact him again personally and by letter. (Those who have written to him and not received an answer are informed that it is because he is not allowed to correspond with any except a very limited number approved by the officials.)

No date has been set for his execution. The final decision will rest with the Louisiana Governor and the recommendation of the Pardon and Parole Board.

Let us heed the admonition of the Apostle Paul: "Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body." Heb. 13:3. Our opinion is that he is in a very excellent position to render a great service to society if he were granted his freedom. Pray that fervent prayer for Bro. Turner—that God's will and purpose will be performed in his life, whether by life or by death. The Lord knows best, and Bro. Turner is saying in his heart, "Lord, not my will, but Thine be done!"

Printed Portion Genesis 1:1-13

Gen. 1:1 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.

- 2 And the earth was without form, and void; and the darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.
- 3 And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.
- 4 And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness.
- 5 And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.
- 6 And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.

Practical Truth: We do not need to figure out how it happened but just believe that God spoke and it came to pass.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We are going to study for a while in the book of Genesis. It is a great book. We read in it the origin of the heavens, earth, plants, animal life and man. The first words are, "In the beginning God..." If we believe these words then we believe the whole book. We notice in the second verse it says "the Spirit." Then in John 1:1 it says "In the beginning was the Word [Word was made flesh, the Son of God. John 1:14] and the Word was with God." "Without him was not anything made that was made." (John 1:3). God, the Father, the Holy Spirit, and the Word which became Jesus Christ, were all there in the beginning working as the Trinity in creating the world.

Translators now agree that the word "firmament" in Gen. 1:6 really tried to indicate an unfathomable space in the Hebrew language. (Ar. Com.)

Notice how orderly the story of the beginning takes place. The dry land was prepared before vegetations were called forth. The vegetation was ready for the lower animals when they were made, etc. God in action is so great and wonderful that it is hard to take it all in. A deep reverence and holy awe fills our hearts and minds for God. His creation is perfect. Everything continues on as God commanded it, but man. Today man is trying to overthrow faith in God's creating power.

Printed Portion Genesis 1:26-31, 2:1-7, 21-23

Gen. 1:26 And God said, Let us make man in our image after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

Memory Verse: What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him? For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour. Psa. 8:4, 5.

Central Thought: Man became the image of God when He "breathed into his nostrils the breath of life: and man became a living soul."

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Man today tries to get away from God. He tries to live his own life and shun any desire for God or any dependence upon him. He won't acknowledge him nor look to him, yet the very breath he draws is given to him of God. Man was made out of God's dust. He breathed life into man. He was made in God's own image. God has a claim on man whether he acknowledges it or not. Whether man wants to or not, he will have to give an account to God for all he has done while in this life.

God "breathed into his nostrils the breath of life and he became a living soul." God gave him a part of Himself. Adam was pure as God is pure and holy. As God is eternal and will live forever, so the soul that He put in man that day will live forever. As God worked so he caused man to desire to work and make things out of the things God gave him. As God is over all the world and all mankind, so man is over the things that are in the world as far as God allows him. As man needs companionship, so God wants love and fellowship. That is his reason for creating man. Man is morally like God.

God is holy, omniscient, eternal, creative, sovereign, and craves fellowship. Man was created holy, intelligent, immortal, industrious, charged with responsibility, and needs companionship. Surely there is God's image in man. It is Jesus Christ who has fully revealed to us the "express image of his person [God]."

Adam needed companionship so God put him to sleep and from close to his heart and the center of his affections and love, a rib was taken and a woman was made. She was to be by his side. He was to love her as

himself. All that God made was perfect.

REBELLION AGAINST GOD

Printed Portion Genesis 3:1-10, 15, 22-24

Gen. 3:1 Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?

2 And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

So far everything had been perfect. God had made a beautiful garden for Adam and Eve and had given them one commandment. By giving them this commandment and by them keeping it, He knew that they loved Him and wanted to do His will. There was a penalty given if they disobeyed this commandment. But a spirit came to them speaking through the serpent and beguiled Eve into disobeying God's commandment. His subtle attack was not only against Adam and Eve to bring them under his control but was also against God. He pictured God as being unkind and unreasonable and withholding something good from them. Eve fell for this and yielded to temptation. He worked through the "lust of the flesh," "the lust of the eye" and "the pride of life." (1 John 3:15). Compare this to the temptation of Jesus in Matt. 4:1-11. Eve took of the fruit and gave to Adam and he ate. Sin caused them to want to hide from God. They made themselves garments of fig leaves and fled to the depths of the garden to hide from God.

In verse 15 we find a promise that God would give them a spiritual garment, the robe of righteousness to cover their sin. It would come from the "seed of the woman," who was Jesus Christ. "She shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins." (Matt. 1:21). Through Jesus Christ today we have access to the Tree of Life and as long as we eat of that fruit we will live forever. But first we have to go through the flaming sword which is by the Word of God. (Heb. 4:12).

WHERE IS THY BROTHER?

Printed Portion Genesis 4:1-10

Gen. 4:1 And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the Lord.

- 2 And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground.
- 3 And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the Lord.
- 4 And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the Lord had respect unto Abel and to his offering:
- 5 But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.
- 6 And the Lord said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?
- 7 If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.
- 8 And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him.
- 9 And the Lord said unto Cain, Where is Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: Am I my brother's keeper?
- 10 And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground.

Memory Verse: Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. . . . Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. Matt. 22:37, 39.

Practical Truth: We must learn to love others as God loves them. God is not willing that any perish.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Sin had entered into the hearts of Adam and Eve. We read in Gen. 5:3 that Adam "begat a son in his own likeness after his image." His children were born with a disposition toward evil within them. It was easier for them to sin now than to do good. We also notice in our lesson that God will not let sin go unpunished, yet we note that he is quick to show mercy. Yet, if mercy is not accepted, judgment will fall even if it is delayed.

Two offerings were offered to God. The one was accepted, the other not. God would only accept a blood offering because that is a type of Jesus' blood that was shed for the remission of sins.

Cain was full of hatred. God tried to get Cain to control himself by talking to him. He told him that sin was at his door. Sin is like a lion, ready to spring in if the door is left open. It seems that Cain opened the door of his heart wide to jealousy, hatred, and then murder. Sin grew in the world until God was grieved that he had ever made man. He decided to destroy all mankind except righteous Noah and his family. But we find that after the flood, man continued to be evil. We are sure in this day and age God is grieved and it won't be long until he will destroy the world and everything by fire. We need to be ready.
