Faith Versus Feelings

We do not receive anything from God but what comes to us through faith. "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." In other words, faith assures us of the reality of God, the reality of His great power and that His word is true. Faith brings to the person a confidence and assurance that what God has promised, He will do, even if it is not manifested immediately before his eyes. Now faith does this, not feelings.

One time I had a problem that I desired the Lord to work out. In prayer it seemed my faith took it in that God would give me the desire of my heart and bring it to pass. I did not have any feelings

about it until my faith just seemed to make me know in my heart that God would do this for me. All seen circumstances were against this being worked out as I desired but I held my faith steady in what I just knew in my heart that God would and could do. It would be impossible for me to know that it was worked out before at least a month or so. When I told others that God was going to do this for me they tried to discourage me into thinking God would not do it. In my prayer I would thank the Lord that He was going to do this for me. Sometimes in the night I would awake and when I thought about it some feelings would come and I would just thank the Lord very much for what He was going to do for me. Some of my relatives told me that they felt sorry for me because I was going to be greatly disappointed. Others said that if the Lord showed me that it would come to pass they would believe it, too. I had no evidence that it was going to come to pass during that month only just through faith in the great power of God. I knew I was His child and I felt he would give me the desire of my heart. Finally the day came when it came to pass and I had the evidence before my eyes and of course there were great feelings and rejoicing. But the thought is that it came by faith and not by feelings. I had to have faith before I had any feelings.

A sinner who comes to the Lord must have faith in God through the hearing of His word. "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" Rom. 10:17. "For he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him" Heb. 11:6. He must believe that God will do what He says he will do. He must rely on the grace and mercy of God "for by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God" Eph. 2:8. He then must have faith to believe that when he diligently seeks God and confesses his sins with godly sorrow that God "is faithful and just to forgive us our sins" 1 John 1:9. Now there are no feelings up to this time but just naked faith. When this is done then the sinner is just to face facts and know in his heart that when he has met the conditions he is "justified by faith" (in the shed blood of Jesus who is his Saviour from sins) and "have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" Rom. 5:1. When faith has taken it in, then the feelings will come. "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God" Rom. 8:16. Those who are looking for feelings instead of just blindly trusting in the merits of the blood of Jesus and facing the facts that when we turn away from sin with all our heart that the work is done, will be disappointed. Feelings might be delayed in coming but they will come. We do not walk by feelings, but by faith. Read Heb. 2 Cor. 5:7.

We are justified by faith, sanctified by faith and live by faith each day for God. Anything we receive from the Lord comes by faith and not by feelings. Our feelings will go up and down but our faith will hold a steady, straight line. God showed this to Bro. D. S. Warner when he was going through a hard trial. I feel God needs to reveal this to all of his children.

We think about Paul and Silas, when they were beaten and put in prison, that their feelings must have been very low. As they looked to God, their faith saw God in it all. They knew that God knows best about what had happened to them. No doubt, feelings made them know that they had been mistreated, pains reminded them that their sufferings were great and that they were not being cared for. With their feet in stocks and feelings telling them that they were God's ministers and surely God had forsaken them, they resisted feelings and let their faith just know that God would take care of every detail of their life. Their faith, no doubt, reminded them of how God delivered Daniel out of the lions' den and could deliver them. Their faith, no doubt, brought to their minds how God had delivered the three Hebrew children out of the fiery furnace and how they resisted the king, being determined to trust God even if they were not delivered. Their faith was so built up by meditating on the word of God and His great power that feelings were resisted and crowded out and the keeper of the prison and the prisoners heard them praying and singing praises to God at midnight. They were thanking God for deliverance before it came. Through their resisting feelings and looking to God by faith, God opened the prison and the result was that the jailer and all of his house were saved. It pays to not walk by feelings but by faith. Praise the Lord.

Look at the facts, believe God and then God will give you feelings only when he sees you are trusting him and resting on his word and not trusting in feelings.

The Manner of Sheep

When I was young I helped my mother take care of our sheep and lambs. I would see my father oring a lamb to the slaughter house to be killed for our use. I would watch my father kill the lamb, and t never struggled, just died peacefully and quietly. I believe what it says in Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he opened not his mouth." When the sheep were brought to the shearers, they were submissive and quiet. Sometimes my mother would shear a little too close and cut the flesh, and it would bleed, but there was only a flench from the sheep.

Sheep are peculiar in their way, as much so as the saints of God. They never fight over their food. If it gets too crowded, they will back away and give room for another sheep to step up and eat out of the trough. Our sheep would not mix with strange The old ewe wore the bell and the entire flock would follow her. If strange sheep (with their bells) came within hearing of our herd, the sheep would know the strange sound and would all run home. In different ways they were peculiar, almost like human beings. In Titus 2:14 it says, "Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works." It took His life to redeem us and make us a peculiar people. Amen.

Mother was the shepherd of our sheep, so to speak. We had about a hundred in our flock. They knew her voice at all times when she would call them and would come to her. "And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not his voice" St. John 10:5.

Also, I notice in reading the Word that He is the Holy One and Just, Governor, Redeemer, Saviour, Prophet, Priest, and King, Creator, Emancipator, Liberator, God's own Son, our elder Brother, the Perfect Sacrifice for sin in that He is the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world. He is our conqueror over death, hell and the grave, the great Fisherman, great Teacher, Bread of Life, Light of the world, bright and morning Star, Prince of life, the great Physician, the Way, the Truth, the Resurrection and the Life, Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. He was humility, lowliness, and meekness personified. In Philippians 2:6-11 we read, "Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

The challenge in Mexico becomes greater each week as we continue to contact souls that have not heard this gospel and are hungry for it. Humanly, as we view the vast multitudes, see children coming and going in droves in the many pueblos, ejidos, and towns, we would be prone to shrink away in hopeless despair; but there comes an inner response of courage, faith, and hope that there is a way; it is possible, it must be done; because this is what Christ died for, arose again the third day and later ascended back to the Father that He might send the Holy Spirit to fill the souls of men and women that He might call out, qualify, and send forth to "teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost." And He said, "Lo, I am with you alway, even to the end of the world." AWAKEN thou that sleepeth, those that are at ease in Zion, let God stir you. Stir yourself; give an account of your stewardship in the light of the coming Judgment. If you say, "I'd like to do a lot for the work of God," then ask yourself, "Am I doing ALL that I CAN DO?" Doors are continuing to open to the gospel. Continue to pray "the Lord of the harvest to send forth laborers into the fields" which are already "white unto the harvest."

Sister Kelly and Sister Sheppard are much enthused and encouraged in their field of labor in El Alamo. Pray that they may speedily learn the Spanish language. This weekend, our latest convert, young Rudy Rodriguez who has just come to the states from Mexico, accepted an invitation to go to Rosarito to help conduct the service

as Bro. James Huskey and family went to Santa Catarina. He was genuinely saved during the meeting in Pomona when Brother Charles Smith was there and promises to be a real blessing to all and a praise unto our God.

Time and space will not permit more to be written now. We thank the Lord for the offerings received of late; also the letters of encouragement, and knowing that you are back of the work with your prayers.

MISSIONARY REPORT FROM NIGERIA. AFRICA

In a recent letter from Bro. B. U. Etuk, native missionary in Nigeria, Africa, he requests prayer of the church in the United States for their steadfastness in the spread of the gospel in Nigeria. Again he appeals for a resident missionary from the church here. Who will hear and heed this "Macedonian call"? Could it be that the Lord cannot find one consecrated and qualified man?

Enclosed in the letter was the October report of their mission activities written by the field secretary, F. F. Ekpo. Part of the report follows:

"As a result of our local preachers combing the surrounding areas in search of atheists to preach to particularly, and for holding open-air services in general, we came to a certain village about 10 miles from the headquarters. There at Ikot Ada Nkere we attracted such a crowd that I have had no opportunity of meeting yet. On a four-foot high table, Bro. Etuk began: 'The Gospel of Jesus Christ is brought to you today at no cost whatever. The world is fast coming to an end, and for this reason, I implore you all to repent, and admit Jesus Christ into your hearts as your only Savior.' He emphasized the three words I write in bold letters. He went on to say, 'He died not because he was old, sick, or tired of the world, but having seen the great gap that existed between us and God, He offered to give up His life to be that only bridge linking us and God. have you done to merit this great love?' he asked. 'By accepting Him as YOUR ONLY SAVIOR,' he answered for the crowd. Then was the singing of the chorus, 'Amen! Hallelujah, let us glorify Emmanuel.'

"Having dwelt for a long time on the topic of 'His Death—A Redemption To Us,' Bro. Etuk yielded the chance to Pastor S. U. Akpan who spoke on, 'Idolatry, A Recede on Spiritual Progress.' He quoted 1 Cor. 8:9, 10. Before he could finish, a man walked up to the table and invited us to come and lecture him at his home. Two days later, on 10-13-63, we went. And below, I give exactly what I recorded from him into my memo book on 10-13-63.

" 'I am a comparatively rich man and a polygamist [he has at present 11 wives]. Having assumed fame and exercised influence on my people, I began to think that some people were hating me and might plan my downfall. I used hundreds of pounds buying rings, talismans, building homes for these and other idols [he showed us numerous gods, goddesses, images, shrines, etc.], and up to now, have been sacrificing thousands of goats, fowls, rams, cows, and in days gone by, humans, for them to watch, keep and defend me whenever need arises. One festival period, I failed to sacrifice for them, and as a result my three children and two wives died.' (I for one do not believe that was the cause of the deathscould be epidemic disease-F. F. E.) 'But it was wonderful,' he went on, 'to hear you last Friday evening that a certain person's death has nullified the effectiveness of my sacrifices. Please, could I hear more of this man?'

"Bro. Etuk then prayed, some choruses followed, and then Bro. Etuk took his short sermon from Isaiah 2:20. 'In that day a man shall cast his idols of silver, and his idols of gold, which they made each one for himself to worship, to the moles and to the bats.' He pointed out to our hosts the unwise steps they took to be worshipping things that were made by human hands, and even went as far to sacrifice human beings for things that could neither talk nor see. After going far in his words, and was about to end his impressive sermon, this chief asked us to destroy his gods, etc. Amid powerful praying and rendering of choruses, it was a gruesome sight, and with FAITH to back us up, we removed these hundreds of pounds worth of idols, etc., and they formed a mountainous heap on his premises, and burned them. Oh! it was a sight! 'What ridiculous, stinking gods,' I commented. He led thousands to worship idols, now he is leading many to the Lord. The scene will not leave my memory."

TESTIMONIES

Calif.—Dear Bro. Lawrence, Sister Marie, and all the workers at the print shop: I send greetings of Christian love in the precious name of Jesus. He has done such great things for me whereof I am glad and I feel that I should glorify His name by testifying to these things. I felt led to send my testimony and greetings to all of the saints through the "Faith and Victory" paper.

First of all, I wish to give thanks and praise to God for the great plan of salvation and for the redemptive work of Christ in the earth; for saving my soul from sin and then leading me into this glorious "Evening Light" truth; for sanctifying my nature by His power with the blood of Christ; and for the wonderful things He has been working in my soul and in my spiritual life in recent weeks.

For a number of years—perhaps 15 or 18—I have been much afflicted in my body with severe swelling in my limbs and feet and with great pain much of the time. I also have had a numbness and much pain at times in my hands and arms. I have put in for healing at different times, been anointed and prayed for numbers of times and have received mercy and help from God temporarily at different times. But, somehow, I have not been able to exercise faith to receive and hold complete victory and healing in those times.

I have had to use two canes, when walking, for a long, long time and always with much pain. I have not been able to get on my knees to pray for seven or eight years, possibly longer.

On a Sunday morning a few weeks back, Sister Opal Wilson spoke in Sunday School about so many people just succumbing to their conditions in life such as sickness and pain and other unpleasant conditions as well as spiritual needs, etc., all because they found it easier to accept those things than they did to get down to business with God and lay aside food and water and fight for deliverance.

I tell you that struck like a dart in my very soul. I felt the Lord had chosen me in a furnace of affliction as in Isaiah 48:10. But, at the same time, I felt convinced in my soul that our Father had greater things for me if I would put in for them.

For several days after that, my affliction got so bad I could hardly walk at all and my pain grew worse. I had no doubt that if it continued as it was going, then I would soon be down where I could not go. So I decided to fast and pray (I mean really fast) and did. After fasting for two days, I got up the next morning and the

pain in my knees and the swelling was all gone out of both my limbs and my feet. They were really thin around my ankles and I could see my shin bones. In worship that morning I knelt in prayer which I had not been able to do for a long time. Praise the Lord. The pain was great in my knees when I knelt, but I kept on kneeling and am still doing it and the pain is almost gone. My leg muscles and joints are very stiff and bound up and I find it difficult to get up after kneeling during prayer but I know God is going to loosen and limber them up, too. I put down both of my canes at that time and have not used them since.

The next day after this I had a bad fall going into my bed room which set me back some as the pain in my knees began to hurt me as at first. But, bless the Lord, this morning I feel deep down in my soul that God is going to complete the work He has begun.

One day this week while the Wilsons were gone, I was crying, praying, and begging God to give me something to stand on. He said to me so sweetly while I was in tears, "You have My Word." Wasn't that sweet? I really did cry, then.

So, this morning, down deep in my soul, I do feel God is going to complete the work He has begun. I have severe pain at times even now and at times am severely tested in my faith and I desire your earnest prayers for me that my faith will not fail and that I will be able to stand firm on His Word until complete victory comes.

I still walk without my canes and still kneel when I pray. Oh, glory! Won't it be wonderful when I can leap like a hart? I do not expect to be like a young person but I do expect to be free in spirit and body to worship God. My soul is just bubbling over. Praise His dear Name!

Okla.—Dear workers at the print shop: I want to give thanks and praise to the Lord for His goodness and mercy to me. Several years ago I was almost deaf in both ears for some time. The Influence of One Tract

When we hand out a paper, a book, or a tract, we are never conscious of the good we are doingof its effects and influence. While it is true that many of these precious messages of light are destroyed and do no good whatever, yet, if we are careful to trust the Lord to guide us in the distribution of this holy literature, we may become much more effectual than if we were to go at it carelessly. But we must keep at work regardless of our feelings of discouragement, just as those of us must do who are called into other lines of the ministry. The literature work is truly one of the parts of the gospel ministry, and the beauty of it is that every saint in Zion may have a part in it. May the Lord stir up his saints to this golden opportunity of these last days. "He that observeth the wind shall not sow; and he that regardeth the cloud shall not reap. In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand: for thou knowest not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good" Eccl. 11:4, 6.

Following is one of the many instances of where one little tract finds its way into such circles that it sets in motion such influences as will keep on and on until they reach almost boundless proportions. It is a little pebble thrown into the great ocean of time, that starts the wave that keeps in motion until it reaches the shore of eternity, carrying with it influences that may never be known until we reach that shore and see the result of our labors.

A lady who had been in some of our meetings and who lives in one of the suburban cities of Oakland had taken some tracts that had probably been handed to her by some of the workers. She handed one of them to a young lady of her acquaintance, and she gave it to some one else. It finally came into the hands of the Methodist preacher of that city. The tract was "Babylon is Fallen," which is not a very agreeable subject to a sectarian. The preacher read it and became so exercised about such literature coming among his people that he felt it his duty to give it a public reading before his congregation. He spoke of it in such terms of denunciation that it aroused the curiosity of some of his people, and they decided they would investigate this literature. This one young lady felt that the tract contained the truth and felt grieved that the preacher took such a stand against it. She decided that she would send to the office for some tracts. That she did, and satisfied her own heart that this was the Bible way. She separated herself from the sect and began to distribute literature. Although she had not heard a sermon and had not seen a saint, yet she knew in her heart that this was truth and truly received it with all the light she had. Soon her mother also took the stand. The young lady went boldly out among the people, gladly bearing all the reproach and persecutions, and in a short time had distributed over fourteen hundred tracts. A month or two later she met one of the saints working in the cannery where she was at work. She was rejoiced to get acquainted with someone else in the faith. Soon there was a plan made to have public meetings in the dance-hall at the cannery. The workers went and preached the gospel, with the results that several souls became enlightened, and many confessed that they never heard before such preaching and acknowledged the truth. One young lady who lived in a city one hundred miles away was saved and went home to do what she could to save others. One Catholic lady heard something about the church of God and the foundation of the same. This was such a revelation of truth to her soul that she went home from the meeting in the evening, sat down in her chair, and became so concerned in deep meditation that the first to detract her mind was the break of day. In the solemn and silent hours of that night she promised God that by his grace she would take her stand. Later, she made her declaration that she was no longer a Catholic, and requested prayer that she might obey God in all things. Others were deeply interested in the truth, and only God knows what the end will be as one soul carries this truth to another and so on in years to come until we all meet in eternity.

Now, dear reader, this is only one more of the many instances where some one has done a little act for the gospel and where some of the results are made visible. However, we do not need to expect the visible results in this life in every case, but must leave it all with God. Oh, how glad we all should be that we can have such an important part in the gospel ministry.

THE GRACE OF GENEROSITY

Printed Portion 2 Cor. 9:6-15

2 Cor. 9:6 But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully.

7 Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.

8 And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:

9 (As it is written, He hath dispersed abroad; he hath given to the poor: his righteousness remaineth for

10 Now he that ministereth seed to the sower both minister bread for your food, and multiply your seed sown, and increase the fruits of your righteousness;)

11 Being enriched in every thing to all bountifulness, which causeth through us thanksgiving to God.

12 For the administration of this service not only supplieth the want of the saints, but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God;

13 Whiles by the experiment of this ministration they glorify God for your professed subjection unto the gospel of Christ, and for your liberal distribution unto them, and unto all men;

14 And by their prayer for you, which long after you for the exceeding grace of God in you.

15 Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.

Memory Verse: Therefore, as ye abound in every thing, in faith, and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also. 2 Cor. 8:7.

Practical Truth. The blessing and joy of giving cannot be taught; it can only be experienced.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The Jerusalem saints had been reduced to poverty through persecutions and famine. The Apostle Paul is encouraging the Corinthian brethren to help in this time of need. In the 8th and 9th chapters, Paul refers to this offering in terms such as "grace," "liberality," "gift," "service," and "bounty," which the margin says means "blessing." He also compares our giving to the Son of God giving his all; "Though rich, yet for your rolles he heaven near that we though his neverty wights sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich." (8:9) Paul also wanted them to "abound in this grace" of giving. He did not want them to miss a blessing.

We cannot out-give the Lord. Jesus said, "Give and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again" Luke 6:38. We

are commanded to give, with the promise of a blessing.
In the New Testament we do not see the teaching of tithing. Neither our Lord, nor his disciples commanded tithing. Our Lord and Paul taught that the ministers of the gospel should be supported by others (Matt. 10:10; Luke 10:8; 1 Cor. 9:13). Under the law, God required a tenth and under grace he requires our all. We are to ask the Lord how much we can have of what comes to our hands. Ask God to help you to be a good steward and a cheerful giver.

THE SOURCE OF CHRISTIAN COMMENDATION

Printed Portion 2 Cor. 10:7-18

2 Cor. 10:7 Do ye look on things after the outward appearance? If any man trust to himself that he is Christ's, let him of himself think this again, that, as he is Christ's, even so are we Christ's.

8 For though I should boast somewhat more of our authority, which the Lord hath given us for edification, and not for your destruction, I should not be ashamed:

9 That I may not seem as if I would terrify you by

10 For his letters, say they, are weighty and powerful; but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible.

11 Let such an one think this, that, such as we are in word by letters when we are absent, such will we be also in deed when we are present.

12 For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise.

13 But we will not boast of things without our measure, but according to the measure of the rule which God hath distributed to us, a measure to reach even unto you.

14 For we stretch not ourselves beyond our measure, as though we reached not unto you: for we are come as far as to you also in preaching the gospel of Christ:

15 Not boasting of things without measure, that is, of other men's labours; but having hope, when your faith is increased, that we shall be enlarged by you according to our rule abundantly,

16 To preach the gospel in the regions beyond you. and not to boast in another man's line of things made ready to our hand.

17 But he that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord.

18 For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth.

Memory Verse: For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth. 2 Corinthians 10:18.

Practical Truth: Only those who lose their life for Christ's sake will be commended of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson brings out part of the answers that Paul gives to the Corinthian church who were criticizing him. The last three chapters are answers from him of their criticism. He was rebuking the Corinthians for rejecting his leadership. He does not like to talk about himself but he feels he must tell of God's dealings with a very weak person as he feels he is.

They judged him because of his outward appearance. Paul speaks of his speech not being in man's wisdom. (1 Cor. 2:4) Tradition says that his personal appearance wasn't pleasing to most people. He says he came in the power of God to them. We know that Samuel would never have anointed David king if the outward appearance had counted (1 Sam. 16:17). God looks on the heart.

Paul was criticized because of his letters being 'weighty." But he assured them that he would say the same to their face.

People make a mistake today by saying in their heart, "I am as good as this or that person, so I am sure I will make it into heaven." They who measure themselves by themselves are not wise. This is an individual salvation. The most important thing is to have the approval

of God upon the soul. We are to know in our own heart that all is clear between us and our God. Then we are to give God all the glory for that knowledge and how He uses us.

ENTRUSTED WITH THE GOSPEL

Printed Portion Galatians 1:6-17

Gal. 1:6 I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel:

7 Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ.

8 But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed.

9 As we said before, so say I now again, If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed.

10 For do I now persuade men, or God? or do I seek to please men? for if I yet pleased men, I should not be the servant of Christ.

11 But I certify you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached of me is not after man.

12 For I neither received it of man, neither was I taught it, but by the revelation of Jesus Christ.

13 For ye have heard of my conversation in time past in the Jews' religion, how that beyond measure I persecuted the church of God, and wasted it:

14 And profited in the Jews' religion above many my

equals in mine own nation, being more exceedingly zealous of the traditions of my fathers.

15 But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb, and called me by his grace,

16 To reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him among the heathen; immediately I conferred not with flesh and blood;

17 Neither went I up to Jerusalem to them which were apostles before me; but I went into Arabia, and returned again unto Damascus.

Memory Verse: For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. Romans 1:16.

Practical Truth: When God saves someone. He expects them to serve Him; we are saved to tell others.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul established the church at Galatia when he was on his second missionary trip. Later, after leaving, he learned that some of them had followed after false teachers and left the truth. He then wrote them this letter and later visited them.

Paul states firmly, and even repeats, that they should not listen or follow after "another gospel which is not another." Some might come as "an angel of light" but are only wolves in sheep's clothing. Today we see this in the land. Many are being deceived. A false prophet will teach something that is not according to the Word of God. He will have a wrong spirit. The Word and the Spirit will agree when a prophet is a true prophet.

. It is remarkable to read how God got hold of a man like Paul who was one who persecuted the church of God. He rejoiced in the great change that took place in his heart and life. He defends his call to preach the gospel and the revelation that he got directly from God,

He did not get it from man. He went to work preaching to the heathen as the Lord directed him to and God blessed his labors. He boldly declared his faith in God and others were convinced also of their need of God.

Gal. 4:4 But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under

5 To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.

6 And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son unto your hearts, crying, Abba, Father.

7 Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

Luke 2:8 And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.

Practical Truth: The time came and God brought it to pass.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We notice the words in the beginning of our lesson, "when the fulness of the time was come." God does things in His own time. Our way of looking at the time things should be done is not God's way. Many centuries had passed from the time that God had told Abraham that "in thee shall all nations of the earth be blessed." God had different things he wanted worked out before He sent Jesus, who was born in Bethlehem. God gave the Mosiac law which was a "schoolmaster to bring them to Christ." Then, according to the prophecy given to Daniel, the world had to be under one rule, which was the Roman Empire. This was true when Jesus was born (Dan. 2). "In the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed." (verse 44). Another thing God wanted was for the Jews to be dispersed throughout the Roman Empire so they could herald the news of the Messiah who was to be born in Bethlehem.

The last part of our lesson tells the wonderful truth of the Babe that was born to this world to bring peace to the soul of everyone who will believe on Him. We can rejoice today with the angels in heaven that Jesus was born. Our hearts are filled with praise and thanksgiving for that peace that He gives to each one who accepts Him as his Saviour.

DIMENSIONS OF FREEDOM

Printed Portion Galatians 5:13-26

Gal. 5:13 For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

14 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

15 But if ye bite and devour one another, take heethat ye be not consumed one of another.

16 This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shar not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

17 For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would

18 But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.

19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these: Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,

20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-

suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.

25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

26 Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another.

Memory Verse: But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. Galatians 5:22, 23.

Practical Truth: By their fruits ye shall know if they have been liberated from sin (Matt. 7:20).

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The whole Mosaic law was fulfilled when Christ came, by giving those who had been liberated from sin, divine love in their hearts. Notice the words, "fruit of the Spirit." That fruit is love, joy, peace, etc. and it springs from the divine love of God.

Here are brief definitions of each one of the works that spring from the flesh: adultery-living with another's husband or wife; fornication-unmarried violating the marriage-bed; uncleanness-moral impurity; lasciviousness—lustful, loose; idolatry—paying divine honors to persons or things; witchcraft—intercourse with evil spirits, black magic; hatred-disliking intensely; variance -dispute, discord; emulations-striving to excel with a view of envious rivalry; wrath-violent anger or rage; strife-conflict, war, contention; seditions and heresiesexcitement over doctrines that are not held by certain groups; envyings—feelings of displeasure at the excellence of others; murder—taking of life; drunkenness state of being drunk with strong drink; revelry-boisterous festivity. Such like takes in all the other sins committed that are not mentioned.

What a wonderful and glorious freedom is given to the souls of those who have been delivered from all of these corrupt sins. It is glorious to be filled with divine love from God above. -Sister A. Marie Miles
