Busy Mothers

"As thy days, so shall thy strength be." Deut. 33:25

My heart goes out to the busy mother who has her hands, heart and time filled. She longs to have time to be alone with the Lord and pray as she did before she had her children. She will get the babies to bed at night and think, "Now, I will have time to sit down and read my Bible and study a little while." But when she sits down and relaxes she finds herself so tired and weary that she can scarcely keep her eyes open. Her mind seems so dull from an exhausted body because of the many, many duties that had to be done through the day. She finds that isn't the time to try to read the Bible so she resolves she will get up early in the morning and take her Bible to read before the children waken, but it seems they awake with her. She then tries to get them all in bed for a nap in the afternoon so she can have that time to be alone, but when she tries to read or pray, one awakes before the other, or one will be late going to sleep, and so many demands surround her or the phone rings. Perhaps someone will drop in for a visit or there are other interruptions. Then, of course, that basket of ironing never seems to disappear. It is always there to be done. She feels her spiritual life ebbing away and the many interruptions become a great burden to her. She begins to complain and murmur. She longs for a time for herself and God. Many a mother has said, "Oh, what shall I do? I don't seem to have time to do anything for the Lord or even to keep my spiritual life what it ought to be." Then, of course, the devil is right there to bring disappointment and discouragement.

Now my dear, there is a way out for you. First, you must have a right attitude about your position. Remember that your first obligation is to your God, and then your family comes next. First, be willing to follow the words of Jesus when He said that he "came not to be ministered unto, but to minister." Then in one place He said that the disciple was not above the master, Your place in the body of Christ is to minister. You are doing the service of the Lord when you are ministering unto your baby, your little children, older ones, and your husband. That is your life's work. You are working for the Lord when you do all those little things that are needful in caring for your home. When your family is grown, or older, you will then have plenty of time to do work outside the home. Many other times He did the same for me. I remember that at times I found time to pray in some very unusual places or positions as I went about my work. A busy mother with small children won't be able to read and pray at the same time every day alone. Of course, there must be that time when the family will get together and have family worship but we are talking about the times when a person needs to get alone with God. This is so necessary for the growth of every person spiritually.

Let those interruptions be opportunities to do good. Don't feel you are too busy to do for those who call at your home in person or over the phone. You will be surprised how much energy you are using up by worrying and fretting over your work and your worry over not being spiritual or being able to get out and do more for God as the enemy presses these things hard upon you. When you let the Lord change your attitude and do all you do to the glory of God, praying and praising the Lord as you go about your work, you will find that your soul will be overflowing with the love of God. Just verses instead of full chapters in the Bible will grow to be real spiritual food to your soul. You will be abounding in the good things of the Lord. Communism Is Conquering the World!

Communism now controls about one billion people in our world.

The Communist aim is no less than world conquest, with Moscow as the center of power. This is no unfounded boast, since they have grown to their present numbers from a mere 40,000 in 1917.

Communism Is Atheism!

Karl Marx, founder of Communism, described religion as "the opium of the people."

His great follower, Lenin, starts his pamphlet on religion with these words, "Atheism is a fundamental portion of Marxism, of the theory and practice of scientific socialism."

Nikita Khrushchev recently stated, "We remain the Atheists we have always been; we are doing as much as we can to liberate those people who are still under the spell of this religious opiate."

Wm. Z. Foster, former head of the Communist Party, USA, applies this principle by saying, "God will be banished from the laboratories as well as from the schools."

No matter what else you know about Communism, never forget that its fundamental premise is atheism!

Communism considers man a soulless animal!

Have you wondered how the Communists can so cruelly (and coolly) kill millions of people in nation after nation where they take control? (American Communists estimate it may be necessary to liquidate 50,000,000 Americans when they seize our country.)

They can murder millions without any pangs of conscience because they consider man only an animal, the highest in the scale of evolutionary development. In order to build the perfect Communist world, all persons tainted with the "disease" of religion or capitalism must be exterminated, just as diseased animals are.

Communists expect to conquer America soon.

Lenin said, "First we will take Eastern Europe [they already have], then the masses of Asia [this they are doing], then we will encircle the United States, which will be the last bastion of capitalism. We will not have to attack. It will fall like an overripe fruit into our hands."

The Communists confidently expect to conquer the United States in this generation. It is said that the year 1973 is tentatively set as the year of conquest.

If the Communists control America, your religious worship will be systematically suppressed, your family will likely be separated, your home and your children will belong to the state, your freedom will vanish with your present government, and your children will be taught in atheistic schools.

This is, at best, an optimistic estimate because as a Christian, you are quite likely to be one of the 50,000,000 Americans destined for death.

What should this mean to you?

If you are not a Christian, God sends you this warning, "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish!" The menace of Communism is just one more reminder from God that there may not be much time left to make your peace with Him. Whether or not the Communists conquer America and force you and your children to support atheism depends on whether or not you repent and believe in His Son now! If you are a Christian, God is reminding you that there is a terrible urgency about your Christian witness. As one door after another in our world closes to Christian missions, and as the Church is suppressed in one Christian country after another, He reminds us to May, 1965

wake up and bring the Gospel to the unsaved about us while we are still able. The Church you take for granted may not always be free to preach and teach as she is now. Whether or not the people of America repent and so avoid the wrath of God depends on whether or not you bring others the Gospel of Jesus Christ now! Christ's commission to you is, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations . . ." (Matt. 28:19)

Under Communism, you would be giving everything to support atheism . . . how much are you giving now to Christ's work? Under Communism, your life, time and talents will be controlled by the state . . . how much of your life, time and talents are you giving now to the cause of Christ?

God will triumph, you say? Yes, but He has not necessarily promised to do so while there is still an America left or while you are still alive and free to teach your children about the Savior! For an unrepentant America there is little hope! It's time to take God's Word and warning seriously! Jesus Christ is our only hope! Atheism is on the march!

Jericho, a Type of the World

(Joshua 6th and 7th chapters)

"Now Jericho was straitly shut up, because of the children of Israel: none went out and none came in. And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given unto thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valor." Joshua 6:1, 2.

How true this is! The world is "straitly shut up, and none went out and none came in." The world in general does not want the gospel today. They will not go out to get it. Very few indeed ever make an effort to come out to hear the truth. And if we carry it to them, they will turn a deaf ear unto it. They have built a great wall of false doctrines, ideas, and opinions of their own around themselves and are content to remain behind these walls, and hear nothing else.

Regardless of all this, it is the Father's will and plan that their walls of defense shall fall before the great onslaught of the pure Word of God as it is preached under the mighty influence of the Holy Spirit of God. This can be accomplished when all dross is removed out of the camp and God's army moves from victory unto victory, obeying every command, in complete harmony and unity of purpose, all seeing eye to eye, and all speaking the same thing.

"And ye shall compass the city, all ye men of war, and go round about the city once. Thus shalt thou do six days. And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets. And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long blast with the ram's horn and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat, and the people shall ascend up every man straight before him." Joshua 6:3-5.

God has a divine purpose in everything He does, and in all that He permits to come to pass. In the type before us of the world, and the gospel being preached to the people of the world we have seven days, seven priests blowing seven trumpets leading the people around Jericho for seven days, and around these walls seven times on the seventh day. The number "seven" is the numerical representative of perfection, being the most sacred number in the Scripture, and used more times than any other number. Seven priests were blowing seven trumpets continually (vs. 13), marching with the priests that bare the ark of the covenant which represents the New Covenant. The seven priests were to blow the seven trumpets continually, to continually preach the Word, as the people followed in perfect silence. "Ye shall not shout, nor make any noise with your voice, neither shall any word proceed out of your mouth, until the day I bid you shout; then ye shall shout." vs. 10. Here we have a wonderful type of the gospel being preached to all the world, beginning at Jerusalem, on down through the ages of the universal church. The faithful ministers proclaim the precious Word while the people listen in silence.

If all the priests and people from the days of Christ's personal ministry until now had obeyed the instructions given as these did when the walls of Jericho fell many walls that are standing today would have fallen long ago. But sad to say, many talk when they should be listening in perfect obedience. We do not learn when our mouths are running.

The watchmen blowing the trumpet to warn the people of coming danger is a symbol of the ministers preaching the gospel. Ezek. 33:1-9. "Blow ye the trumpet in Zion, and sound an alarm in my holy mountain:" Joel 2:1. ". . . and the Lord God shall blow the trumpet." Zech. 9:14.

In verse 18 the people were warned: "Keep yourselves from the accursed thing." God wants the walls (false doctrines) of sectism to fall under the mighty power of the preached Word, in order that the faithful (typified by the household of Rahab) may escape and come home to Zion. "She dwelleth in Israel even unto this day" vs. 25. But we must not be partakers of the "accursed thing" (Babylonish stones) or follow after them in their evil ways. "Be not conformed to this world." Rom. 12:2. If we partake of the things of the world, following after their sins, we will be condemned and suffer the same penalty that Achan suffered, and cause Israel to lose victory after victory until we shall be cast aside, becoming as weak and lifeless as the movements we pattern after.

"Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and I will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty." 2 Cor. 6:17, 18. 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EDITORIALS

Thinking of Mother's Day, my mind naturally turns to my own dear mother whose life and devotion to God and His cause, and to her family, stands as a monument in my life. She reared three daughters and three sons, bringing them up in the fear and admonition of the Lord. Impressed upon their lives were the virtues of obedience to authority, reverence for God and His Word, cleanliness, modesty, and honesty in every phase of life. I remember very distinctly when I was about five years old, living on the homestead on the plains of New Mexico, that my mother took me to visit a neighbor. While there I picked up a shiny doorknob, which appealed to my fancy, and brought it home unbeknown to Mother. As soon as she saw it, she inquired where I had gotten it. I told her the truth, and she said I must return it to the neighbor at once for it was not mine. I did, and that was one of my first lessons in making restitution for taking something that did not belong to me, as the Bible plainly teaches.

From my earliest recollection all the family gathered together morning and evening for family worship to God. This service consisted of singing the songs of Zion, reading the Bible, and offering prayer and praise to the Lord. The family altar was not neglected, but was considered more important than getting together for the family meal.

More than ten years have passed since the Lord called my dear mother to her Home on the eternal shore, but I still fondly cherish her memory and humbly acknowledge that it is through the grace of God, the prayers and godly example of my parents that I am what I am today. With the poet I pray:

> "God, hallow the holy impress Of the days that used to be, And keep me a pilgrim forever To the shrine at mother's knee!"

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The church, the spiritual Body of Christ, has never been involved and concerned with politics as such, but where the Scriptural principles of truth and right are concerned the church must not and cannot remain silent, passive, or "neutral." To do so is to invite or give comfort to the paganistic spirits which are eating at the vitals of Christian civilization today. The Apostle Paul declares, "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." Eph. 6:12. After Pentecost when the apostles were commanded by the Jewish Sanhedrin to be silent about Christ and His resurrection, they refused and said, "For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." Acts 4:20.

The world-wide movement of godless Communism is rapidly spreading its atheistic theories to every country on the globe. This is the revival of the same "great red dragon" power which opposed the apostolic church of the first century. Christianity then prevailed over paganism and the "dragon" was bound May, 1965

for a long period of time. John the Revelator tells us that "when the thousand years [long period of time] are expired, Satan [the dragon] shall be loosed out of his prison, and shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth ..." Rev. 20:7, 8. That deception is now in full swing.

The atheistic doctrines of Marxist Communism is infiltrating every phase of American life with the resultant rapid decay of moral principles, and contributing to the present increase in crime, riots and general disregard for law and order. Documentary evidence proves that communists or communist-sympathizers have infiltrated the government in high places, the religious denominations, the National Council of Churches, the schools, the mental health programs, the press, the radio, television and motion picture industries, the labor unions and national minority groups.

The terror tactics of communism is to pit class against class and race against race, for its ends and purposes are greatly advanced in the midst of confusion. Marches do not promote God's cause. Many are participating in these communist-inspired plots!

The youth of our land is the No. 1 target of the Communist conspiracy—the "great red dragon." In the schools the textbooks, the personality and psychological tests are slanted to raise doubts in the student's mind as to the existence of God; to resent parental and civil authority, and to disregard the Christian principles of right and wrong. No doubt this accounts for the current student riots and mob violence. When such a generation of students come to take the places of leadership, what kind of society can you expect?

The Bible prophecy has forewarned us of the loosing of the "dragon" which has gone into the four directions of the compass to deceive the nations. The final acts of this great conflict is the compassing of the "camp of the saints"—the church—by this combined "dragon" power and fire comes down from God out of heaven and devours the adversaries. The only safe place for your soul in this world of atheism is "the camp of the saints," and there dare to seal your testimony for Christ with your own blood! Nominal Christianity has already surrendered to the foe, and the Church is the only institution that will survive the final onslaught of Satanic forces. The spiritual body of Christ is of divine origin and "the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

MISSIONARY REPORT FROM NIGERIA

2 A It is already a known story that since Bro. Ostis Wilson returned from Nigeria to the States by early October last year, he has been sending us a lesson each week. These lessons are in the forms of sermons on particular subjects-a project he started since his arrival in August last year until he was forced to hold the last one on Sept. 15, 1964. Being responsible to translate these lessons, I have seen how far the Lord is using them to change the hearts of many folks and how more blessed we have become. I am more concerned with them than anything else. They are too precious to receive a second attention, and more to be desired than gold. I am particularly grateful to the Lord in the way He has led Bro. Wilson to prepare these lessons. The one on "Humility" followed up by the one on "Pride," have evoked applause not only from our members but also from the non-members, for I read them to anyone who would care to hear and that at any time. Apotheosis is dwindling as a result of the lesson on "Pride." From "Humility," I can see the ridiculous fantasies which need to be taken away from the minds of the so-called religious dignitaries who call themselves "his lordships," "right reverends," "bishops," etc. Maybe some day, somehow, sometime, this affront to our Almighty God will be a history for which posterity will be happy that they had not lived in this age. The tract, "Reverend is His Name," not only gave us a background to this realization but has been understood better through these lessons. Praise the Lord!

The language classes are in very good progress. The teachers concerned are not slack in the discharge of their duties. Though this season is the time which every lay farmer clears his bush, tills the soil, and plants foodcrops, yet I am happy that they leave their work to attend these classes. The classes are attended to the first thing in the mornings for two hours and then dismissed to allow the folks to attend to their personal duties. Our main objective here is to see that every one is able to read the Holy Bible in Efik—a problem that faces many congregations here, and by the grace of God we hope to overcome it.

Aside from going to different congregations to see about the progress of the work, we had two important occasions this month, one this side, and the other among the newly converted souls. The first was a Communion Service at Ukpom which took place on March 14, 1965. The second occasion for the month was a get-together service for the new converts, comprising Nduo Eduo, Ikot Obio Inyang, Obiokopk and Three Towns Ikono. It took place at Nduo Eduo. About 350 people attended, and 11 souls were converted.

The distance is far, but still, the next get-together service will bring all the congregations together—the old and the new ones. This will bring a sense of oneness and togetherness to the new converts. Praise the Lord!

On behalf of the whole field, I wish to express my thanks and gratitude to God for the speedy recovery He has brought to those of our members who fell victims to the recent outbreak of measles. But for the grace of God, many of us would not have been spared. We prayed, and all the saints there in the States took the request for prayer to the Throne of Grace leaving it there for the Lord to do as He pleases. The Lord heard the prayers and effected an immediate cure! Hallelujah! Praise His Name forever more! This reminds me of a song I was taught more than two decades ago:

"I feel like singing all the time,

My tears are wiped away;

For Jesus is a Friend of mine,

I'll serve Him every day.

I'll praise Him! Praise Him! Praise Him all the time! Praise Him! Praise Him! I'll praise Him all the time."

May His love and blessings abide with us all.

I am sure if it had not been for the prayers of those interested in me I would probably still be suffering, but now I have deliverance from it. Praise God!

At first I was not willing to help in the school, but later the Lord dealt with me, so we are in school, Sister Kelly and I, five days a week and six hours a day; then there are meetings and visits to be made as we are able to wedge in a few. We are not sorry for the way the Lord has led us and would not ask for another if we had our choice.

One of the little Indian girls was burned very badly on her thigh about a week ago and has suffered much from it, but the Lord has taken away all the pain and she is able to sleep well at nights and to run as she wishes in the day time. Mexico (March 15)—Greetings to all in the name of our dear Savior: I am so glad to be able to declare victory in the face of every foe. Truly God is reigning in my heart this morning.

Ruby Marken and I are teaching school together in Santa Catarina. She has a class of eight who are fairly well on the same level of learning, though having a sufficient amount of difference in some studies that it is needful for each one to recite separately. The same is true of the older group of eight which I am teaching. No two of them are in exactly the same place in their books which makes it needful to differentiate their reading and spelling time.

Last year at the end of school the Indian chief told Edith Cole that they would no longer need her services as a teacher as the government was going to send a teacher in, but when a census of school-age children was taken; the government didn't feel that there were enough children in Santa Catarina to warrant their sending a teacher, so for the first half of this school year they had no school. By the time we found that the government wouldn't send a teacher, Edith Cole already had an established place of labor in Patscuaro near Mexicali.

The Lord showed me while I was living in El Alamo that He wanted me to come to Santa Catarina and teach. I had never taught school in my life, even in English, and told the Lord I felt so inadequate. He showed me that was the very reason He wanted me to come for I would realize it wasn't any abilities I had that would make me a teacher but my complete dependence on Him was all I needed. He promised to go with me every step of the way and has surely kept His promise. How I do thank Him for His leadings and daily guidance in teaching these precious children. We feel that if the people in Santa Catarina are going to be reached with the gospel it will be through the children. The people here are not giving the attentive ear to the Word they once did and I don't know how much longer the Lord will permit us to labor in this place. We are just living one day at a time as nearly as we know how, according to His leadings.

Please pray for all the work in Mexico, for time is fast passing. Pray that we will continue to hear the voice of God and do His will continually with all our might and be all He would have us to be.

With its charming glitter and pretended innocency it has allured many unsuspecting souls from the exalted plane of sexual purity to the depths of sin and shame. By free love many happy homes have been broken up and brought to disgrace; the tender affections of man and wife have been turned into bitter hatred, and the music of their household into strains of sorrow. Before it we see the peaceful and joyous reign of Platonic love; behind it we see the confusion and sorrow of ten thousand broken hearts. Oh, the sorrow and sadness brought to the human heart by this vile enemy of peace! I trust by the help of God to be able to point out some of its worst features that the reader may know that there is such a spirit, and that it is earthly, sensual, and devilish.

Free love is not confined to any one class of people; young or old, married and unmarried, rich and poor, and people in almost every walk of life have by it been deceived and led astray. From cellar to garret of human habitation we can trace its licentious track, and those who do not believe me have but to read and be convinced. Julius Caesar, one of the world's greatest men, was tainted with free love; Cleopatra, the beautiful queen of Egypt, was under its influence; and Solomon, the wise man, was overtaken by this "outlandish" spirit, and by it led astray. Many others whose names glitter on the pages of history and decorate the world's literature could be pointed out as slaves of free love. Modern society in general is little or no better, for almost every daily paper records some disgraceful doings of free-lovers.

Before going further it may be well to define the term free love. Webster defines it as, "The doctrine or practice of consorting with the opposite sex at pleasure without marriage."

The spirit and doctrine of free love are of a much worse type than the simple perversion of the natural affections. A person may allow his affections to be perverted, and allow them to go out in a way they should not; but unless a person becomes under such an influence that he feels free to love different ones, it cannot properly be termed free love. A free-love spirit leads to what the doctrine of free love teaches, viz., consorting with the opposite sex at pleasure without marriage. Some have made use of the term free love in a very wrong way by applying it to almost every form of trouble with the affections. This we should not do. There is a difference in being for a short time slightly led astray by the influence of undue affection, and being under a free-love spirit. Allowing the affections to go uncontrolled, however, sometimes leads to free love, and those who would keep themselves pure and keep themselves out of the reach of free-love spirits should keep their affections under perfect control.

Under the cloak of religion the spirit of free love has destroyed many souls. The doctrines of many religious bodies afford many advantages to the devil on this line. If Satan can succeed in getting people under the influence of the spirit of free love, it matters little to him whether or not they publicly advocate the doctrine. Catholicism, Spiritualism, Shakerism, Mormonism, and many other like institutions afford an excellent harbor for spirits of free love. A profession of religion without salvation is also an excellent hiding place for all such spirits, for they can there carry on their unclean work for years without being even suspected by the most of people. Another suitable refuge for such spirits is society. Those who stand high in society, like those who are esteemed highly in religion, are often guilty of harboring many things of which they are not in the least suspected; consequently many society circles become nothing but a rendezvous of wicked and unclean spirits and yet pass as the best of society.

Causes of Free Love-The most potent cause of free love, and every other evil under the sun, is the influence of the devil and depraved human nature; therefore in all cases of free love we may assign the primary cause to an ungodly spirit and a depraved heart ; but there are different minor causes, or in other words, different circumstances, under which the soul is endangered to this vile spirit. Every man and woman has a weak place, and Satan is not unacquainted with this fact, so we must both watch and pray. Satan can get one person into trouble in a way which he dare not approach another; so he shifts his position to suit his subject; hence one falls a prey to free love, while another is led into some other trouble. Sometimes disappointment in marriage affords the proper soil in which the devil soon sows the seed of free love. Satan will come to the disappointed party and point out the admirable qualities in this one and that one and suggest that such would be a much more suitable companion than the one chosen. These suggestions are repeated until the tempted person loses all affection for the wedded companion and burns with illegal desire for first one and then another, till Satan has gotten the heart completely under control of a free-love spirit. The affections of the human heart require attention, and the man or woman who neglects to cultivate the affections of his or her companion neglects a thing of more value than silver or gold.

Undue familiarity also is a fertile field for the working of free-love spirits. This, of course, opens up the way for both married and single persons to be led astray. Every gentleman owes a certain respect to all ladies, in his manners, speech, etc.; and every lady owes to herself, as well as to God, a certain reserve in all of her actions toward the opposite sex. Long acquaintance, religious connections, or even kindred ties should never induce either sex to overstep the bounds of modesty. This reserve is not a false modesty. However, private matters and even things which are generally considered as improper, may be talked of in a modest, delicate way, without the slightest shadow of indecency or forwardness. The motive which fills the heart and finds its way into the manners and speech tells more than all else.

The approach of free love is often so stealthy that the person affected is not aware where Satan is leading until the vile spirit has almost gained control. Its first suggestions are so polished and so seemingly free from wrong that the unsuspecting are often led astray a step at a time. Sometimes it requires years of subtle and cunning work for Satan to accomplish his design; but Satan, unlike many people, is never discouraged; so if he is not detected and sternly rebuked he toils on inch by inch, step by step, till he gains the ground he desires.

The disgusting influence of a person controlled by a spirit of free love can be felt by others, and especially detected by the children of God that are taught on these lines. Conscientious souls have often been accused by the devil of being under a free-love spirit when they could feel this awful influence in some one else. Of all abominable things to a pure man or woman, the unclean looks and actions of a person under a free-love spirit are most obnoxious.

Effects of Free Love-If the spirit of free love is allowed to have its course it invariably leads to the depths of shame and disgrace and plunges the soul into despair. A person under a free-love spirit is like a drunkard, who at times longs for deliverance, but finds none. When in more considerate moments he views his condition it naturally brings remorse attended by despondency, and often it seems there is no way of escape. When a person has been captured by the spirit of free love one of four things generally occurs: the spirit and doctrine are renounced and deliverance is gained, prostitution is chosen, insanity ensues, or the despondent soul gives way to suicide. A great many cases of murder and suicide are caused directly or indirectly by the influence of free love. When a person has become bound by this spirit, a spirit of murder often accompanies it, and when its wishes are interfered with the passions of free love will often wade through blood to accomplish the desired end.

Remedy—The best and only sure remedy for free love, and every other work of the devil, is the blood of Jesus Christ. Resolution and reformation are insufficient in most cases, to deliver the soul from the doctrine and spirit of free love. The cleansing stream, which if applied purifies the heart and cleanses the perverted passions, is the only sure route to permanent victory. The devil will often try to intimidate persons in this condition by telling them that they are too weak on this point to withstand him if they are set free. This is the devil's "scarecrow," for well he knows that if Jesus undertakes the case he is defeated. It is true that some persons may be weaker on this line than others, but to such God will give more grace. Christ, who has the keys of death and hell, would lock the archfiend in his den before he would suffer the least and weakest one who trusts in Him to be overcome. —D. O. Teasley, 1903

GOD DEMANDS OBEDIENCE

1 Sam. 13:5 And the Philistines gathered themselves together to fight with Israel, thirty thousand chariots, and six thousand horsemen, and the people as the sand which is on the sea shore in multitude: and they came up, and pitched in Michmash, eastward from Bethavan.

6 When the men of Israel saw that they were in a strait, (for the people were distressed,) then the people did hide themselves in caves, and in thickets, and in rocks, and in high places, and in pits.

7 And some of the Hebrews went over Jordan to the land of Gad and Gilead. As for Saul, he was yet in Gilgal, and all the people followed him trembling.

8 And he tarried seven days, according to the set time that Samuel had appointed: but Samuel came not to Gilgal; and the people were scattered from him.

9 And Saul said, Bring hither a burnt offering to me, and peace offerings. And he offered the burnt offering.

10 And it came to pass, that as soon as he made an end of offering the burnt offering, behold, Samuel came; and Saul went out to meet him, that he might salute him.

11 And Samuel said, What hast thou done? And Saul said, Because I saw that the people were scattered from me, and that thou camest not within the days appointed, and that the Philistines gathered themselves together at Michmash;

12 Therefore said I, The Philistines will come down now upon me to Gilgal, and I have not made supplication unto the Lord; I forced myself therefore, and offered a burnt offering. 13 And Samuel said to Saul, Thou hast done foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the Lord thy God, which he commanded thee: for now would the Lord have established thy kingdom upon Israel for ever.

14 But now thy kingdom shall not continue: the Lord hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the Lord hath commanded him to be captain over his people, because thou hast not kept that which the Lord commanded thee.

Memory Verse: And Samuel said, Hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams. 1 Sam. 15:22

Practical Truth: A complete surrender and being filled with the Holy Spirit will give one power to obey God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Saul was chosen as king for the people. He had a good beginning. He, at first, felt so unworthy of such a high position. But soon he became lifted up. He lost the fear of God from his heart insomuch that he broke one of the commandments of God. God had said that only the high priest was to offer the sacrifices. When the enemy gathered together with such a big force, the people were trembling and even some leaving him, Saul took things into his own hands and offered the sacrifice. When Samuel arrived he gave the excuse that he "forced" himself to do this. Samuel told him that he had acted foolishly.

How many today start out for God with great capabilities but when the pressure is on and persecutions come from many sources they begin to let down and then disobey. Oh, how sad! Adam and Eve had everything in their favor, but they disobeyed. The rich young ruler had so many good qualities that "Jesus beholding him loved him" but he was not willing to obey. (Matt. 10:21) Judas was one of the disciples but he "did foolishly" and came to a tragic end. Disobedience will bring shame and disgrace to the child, the young person, and to the old person. Saul tried to excuse his disobedience. The only way to get forgiveness is to confess the disobedience, repent with godly sorrow and God will forgive. We need to all watch and pray or we will fall into the same snare. It is good to think about what causes disobedience so a person can guard against it.

ONE SIN LEADS TO ANOTHER

Printed Portion 1 Samuel 18:5-16

1 Sam. 18:5 And David went out whithersoever Saul sent him, and behaved himself wisely: and Saul set him over the men of war, and he was accepted in the sight of all the people, and also in the sight of Saul's servants.

6 And it came to pass as they came, when David was returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, that the women came out of all cities of Israel, singing and dancing, to meet King Saul, with tabrets, with joy, and with instruments of musick.

7 And the women answered one another as they played, and said, Saul hath slain his thousands, and David his ten thousands.

8 And Saul was very wroth, and the saying displeased him; and he said, They have ascribed unto David ten thousands: and what can he have more but the kingdom? 9 And Saul eyed David from that day forward.

10 And it came to pass on the morrow, that the evil spirit from God came upon Saul, and he prophesied in the

midst of the house: and David played with his hand, as at other times: and there was a javelin in Saul's hand.

11 And Saul cast the javelin; for he said, I will smite David even to the wall with it. And David avoided out of his presence twice.

12 And Saul was afraid of David, because the Lord was with him, and was departed from Saul.

13 Therefore Saul removed him from him, and made him his captain over a thousand; and he went out and came in before the people.

14 And David behaved himself wisely in all his ways; and the Lord was with him.

15 Wherefore when Saul saw that he behaved himself very wisely, he was afraid of him.

16 But all Israel and Judah loved David, because he went out and came in before them.

Memory Verse: Every one that is proud in heart is an abomination to the Lord: though hand join in hand, he shall not be unpunished. By mercy and truth iniquity is purged: and by the fear of the Lord men depart from evil. Proverbs 16:5, 6.

Practical Truth: We are only what we are because of the grace of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

It grieved Samuel because Saul the king had chosen to please himself instead of God. God told Samuel to anoint David as king, which was done privately. After David had killed the giant he lived at the palace and became a hero in the sight of the people. This displeased Saul and he "eyed David." Oh, that monster, jealousy, and also envy, which took control of Saul. How miserable Saul was as he thought of ways and means to get rid of David, yet he had a certain fear of the people. He knew that God was with David and this was a wall of protection to David. God did not permit Saul to kill David, although he tried many times.

I read recently of a little girl who threw an iron into the bassinette and killed her baby brother because someone told her that her mother would love the baby more than herself. Through grief the mother died. This girl grew to be a lonely woman, although she was rich. She very seldom smiled. These things are sad but there was a beginning of this jealousy and also of Saul's. It is the "I" that wants to be "it." The "I" can't endure for another to be praised. The "I" would not think of murdering anyone but what about murdering a person's influence with the tongue? Maybe not going that far, but just making slighting remarks or watching to see how they can make their good to be turned into having an evil motive behind it. God wants us to "esteem others better than ourselves." True glory and respect will be earned through humility.

A DEDICATED KING

2 Sam. 5:1 Then came all the tribes of Israel to David unto Hebron, and spake, saying, Behold, we are thy bone and thy flesh.

2 Also in time past, when Saul was king over us, thou wast he that leddest out and broughtest in Israel: and the Lord said to thee, Thou shalt feed my people Israel, and thou shalt be captain over Israel.

3 So all the elders of Israel came to the king to Hebron; and king David made a league with them in Hebron before the Lord: and they anointed David king over Israel. 4 David was thirty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned forty years.

5 In Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months: and in Jerusalem he reigned thirty and three years over all Israel and Judah.

6 And the king and his men went to Jerusalem unto the Jebusites, the inhabitants of the land: which spake unto David, saying, Except thou take away the blind and the lame, thou shalt not come in hither: thinking, David cannot come in hither.

7 Nevertheless David took the strong hold of Zion: the same is the city of David.

9 So David dwelt in the fort, and called it the city of David. And David built round about from Millo and inward.

10 And David went on, and grew great, and the Lord God of hosts was with him.

11 And Hiram king of Tyre sent messengers to David, and cedar trees, and carpenters, and masons: and they built David an house.

12 And David perceived that the Lord had established him king over Israel, and that he had exalted his kingdom for his people Israel's sake.

Memory Verse: I have set the Lord always before me: because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved. Psalm 16:8.

Practical Truth: When we know that we are in God's will we can face hard things.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Poor Saul came to an awful end. He was wounded in battle and begged his armor bearer to take his life but he would not. Saul then fell upon his own sword and killed himself. (1 Sam. 31:4) David mourned over the death of Saul and his friend Jonathan. David was made king of the tribe of Juda at Hebron. The son of Saul reigned for two years after Saul's death and then the people came to David and wanted him to be their king. Our lesson brings out the fact that the people had not forgotten the godly manner in which David had conducted himself while Saul tried to kill him. In the battle of reverses the devil would make one think they were not doing good but if one will continue faithful he will bear fruit. David, no doubt thought all were against him but our lesson shows us that the people wanted him to be their shepherd, to feed them and be their captain. He had proved himself to be God's man. A great person is one who does not see his own greatness but only recognizes God working through him. David did not say he killed the lion, the bear, and Goliath, but he said, "The Lord that delivered me out of the paw of the lion . . . the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine." 1 Sam. 17:37.

The last part of our lesson tells us that David began to build the city of David, Jerusalem. David then understood that for "his people's sake" God had established his kingdom.

Printed Portion 2 Samuel 6:12, 13, 17, 18; 7:1-3, 11b-13

2 Sam. 6:12 And it was told King David, saying, The Lord hath blessed the house of Obededom, and all that pertaineth unto him, because of the ark of God. So David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obededom into the city of David with gladness. 13 And it was so, that when they that bare the ark of the Lord had gone six paces, he sacrificed oxen and fatlings.

17 And they brought in the ark of the Lord, and set it in his place, in the midst of the tabernacle that David had pitched for it: and David offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before the Lord.

18 And as soon as David had made an end of offering burnt offerings and peace offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of hosts.

7:1 And it came to pass, when the king sat in his house, and the Lord had given him rest round about from all his enemies:

2 That the king said unto Nathan the prophet, See now, I dwell in an house of cedar, but the ark of God dwelleth within curtains.

3 And Nathan said to the king, Go, do all that is in thine heart; for the Lord is with thee.

11b Also the Lord telleth thee that he will make thee an house.

12 And when thy days be fulfilled, and thou shalt sleep with thy fathers, I will set up thy seed after thee, which shall proceed out of thy bowels, and I will establish his kingdom.

13 He shall build an house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom for ever.

Memory Verse: Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the Lord our God is holy. Psa. 99:9.

Practical Truth: Through Jesus the kingdom of David was set up forever.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

David had tried to bring the ark, which was the Ark of the Covenant that Moses had made, where the presence of the Lord dwelt, to Jerusalem one time. He put it on a cart, which was pulled by oxen. At one time the oxen stumbled and a man named Uzzah tried to steady the ark with his hand. It was the law of God that no one was to touch the ark but the priests. For this unlawful act he died instantly. David was afraid to proceed further in his attempt to bring the ark to Jerusalem. It stayed at the house of Obed-edom. Sometimes problems will arise among God's people. Someone feels that they must do some-thing about it. Unless they move according to God's will they will lose their souls. One time a person wrote my father that the church was going to pieces and he should do something about it. He wrote them back that the "government shall be upon his shoulder" (Isa. 9:6). God's church will never fall. The gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

The ark would stand for the presence of the Lord. Where his presence is there is joy, blessing and gladness. Inside the ark there is the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place. This is the type of justification and sanctification, the two works of grace in our hearts today.

David wanted to build a house for the Lord to dwell in. He got the materials together but God did not let him build the temple. Solomon, the son of David, built it.

CONSEQUENCES OF SIN

2 Sam. 12:1 And the Lord sent Nathan unto David. And he came unto him, and said unto him, There were two men in one city; the one rich, and the other poor. 2 The rich man had exceeding many flocks and herds:

3 But the poor man had nothing, save one little ewe lamb, which he had bought and nourished up: and it grew up together with him, and with his children; it did eat of his own meat, and drank of his own cup, and lay in his bosom, and was unto him as a daughter.

4 And there came a traveler unto the rich man, and he spared to take of his own flock and of his own herd, to dress for the wayfaring man that was come unto him; but took the poor man's lamb, and dressed it for the man that was come to him.

5 And David's anger was greatly kindled against the man; and he said to Nathan, As the Lord liveth, the man that hath done this thing shall surely die:

6 And he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity.

7 And Nathan said to David, Thou art the man. Thus saith the Lord God of Israel, I anointed thee king over Israel, and I delivered thee out of the hand of Saul;

8 And I gave thee thy master's house, and thy master's wives into thy bosom, and gave thee the house of Israel and of Judah; and if that had been too little, I would moreover have given unto thee such and such things.

9 Wherefore hast thou despised the commandment of the Lord, to do evil in his sight? thou hast killed Uriah the Hittite with the sword, and hast taken his wife to be thy wife, and has slain him with the sword of the children of Ammon.

10 Now therefore the sword shall never depart from thine house; because thou hast despised me, and hast taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be thy wife.

Memory Verse: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments. Ex. 20:5, 6.

Practical Truth: A life of sin means a life here and in eternity without God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

After Nathan, the prophet, told David a story which showed a terrible sin, David said the man who had done this wrong needed to be put to death. How shocked he was when he was told "Thou art the man." We can't do wrong and get by. You might think no one knows what you have done but God knows. You will have to deal with God. David thought he had his sin covered up. He was surprised when it was made known. In the 51st Psalm David bares his heart and cries unto the Lord. He realized how terrible was his sin. He knew it had cut him off from God. He said, "Wash me and I shall be whiter than snow. Create in me a clean heart, O God, renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from thy presence and take not thy Holy Spirit from me. Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation and uphold me with thy free Spirit." (verses 7-13). God heard his cry and saw the anguish of his spirit. He forgave him. "A broken and a contrite heart" God will not despise but will heal and forgive. Not only did David need to seek God's forgiveness but he needed to forgive himself and then forget his iniquity. Paul tells us that he forgot those things which were behind and pressed toward the mark of the high calling in Christ Jesus. (Phil. 3:13, 14)

Great trouble came to David's house because he sinned. His baby died. Later his son killed his brother and then his son tried to take David's throne. This was grievous to David. We reap what we sow. —Marie Miles
