He dressed. He wanted something to eat and he ate while I was there. He had not eaten since noon the day before. His side still looked red and puffed some, but he was dressed and was up and around. It has been tender for the last few days, but he has never cried again with pain. The Lord performed a miracle. He looks well now.

Last night (Dec. 8) Bertha called me and said that Don had come home from school crying with a (Don took the mumps the day before Thanksgiving. He didn't suffer much with them and had gone back to school.) She said that his neck was swollen on both sides and he was having a chill. His temperature was over 102. I went over and all of us knelt and had prayer. The children prayed, too. Later I talked to some of the saints and asked them to remember him. Within a couple hours I called her to see about him. She said the Lord had touched him and he wanted something to eat after I left, and ate well. He said his head had quit hurting. She had taken his temperature and it was normal. He had sat up and played a little game with his sister. His neck was still swollen some, but we did thank the Lord for all he had done so quickly. We know that a relapse of the mumps is a serious thing, but we know, too, that our "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and for ever." Thank God! We are expecting God to continue to take care of it all.

I count it a great privilege to trust God for the healing of my body. God has done miracles for me. He has been my healer all of my life. I have never even taken an aspirin in my life. Only God is to be praised because He has healed me of many, many things. He healed my boys of many diseases as we trusted Him to do so. He healed them of typhoid fever and all the children's diseases, as we didn't take them to a doctor. One of my sons had polio and couldn't walk for a few days, but God healed him. Now God is healing my grandchildren. My heart is filled with praise and adoration for my precious Jesus who is the same yesterday, today and forever.

The Land of the Living

In Psalm 116:9 we find this declaration of faith: "I will walk before the Lord in the land of the living." Certainly it is a wonderful state to be in the land of the living. In the verse before this we find the writer's testimony of being delivered from death. This was the cause of his partaking of life. The Lord had delivered his soul from death; therefore he could walk before Him in the land of the living. He also mentioned how the Lord had delivered his eyes from tears, and his feet from falling. Because his feet were thus delivered from falling, he could walk. Because his eyes were thus delivered from tears, He could walk before the Lord (his sorrow being because of separation from God). And because his soul had been delivered from death, he could walk before the Lord in the land of the living.

We would like to define the expression "the land of the living" as the realm of life and peace in the favor of God. "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Matt. 4:4. The land of the living is the state of one's heart in fellowship with the law and nature of Almighty God. "In Him we live, and move, and have our being." Acts 17:28. To be "in Him" we must be in accord with His precepts and commandments, and possess His Spirit within us. This is made possible through the sacrifice of His Son "who hath abolished death and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel." (2 Tim. 1:10.) His Son was Jesus of Nazareth, who said as recorded in John 6:57, "As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me." It was also spoken of him in Hebrews 5:7-9, "Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto Him [His Father, God] that was able to save Him from death, and was heard in that He feared [God heard Him and granted Him power over death because of His uprightness and integrity of heart and life]; though He were a Son, yet learned He obedience by the things which He suffered; and being made perfect, He became the author

of eternal salvation unto all them that obey Him." Jesus lived of the Father through obedience to the Father's will. We shall live also through obedience.

Jesus stated in Luke 20:38 "He [God] is not a God of the dead, but of the living: for all live unto Him." There is a thought in this saying worth much consideration. God is not a God of the dead. Death was not in the original plan of God for His creation. His initial design for mankind was life, and that eternal. But because of disobedience, and because that disobedience became an active principle in their offspring, the judgment of death was passed upon all men. God willed life for man, but this life was to be only in His favor. "All live unto Him." Disobedience turned man's life in a course apart from God's pleasure, thus meriting the sentence of death.

Apprehension of death should weigh upon the guilty soul. To view death as it is in the light of God will bring a guilty sinner to contrition and prayer. The god of this world has many vain attractions to occupy people's thoughts so as to keep them from viewing the sentence of death as it really is. This is true. Thereby he has caused millions of men and women to live out their days without making proper preparations for that great appointment. He has mankind achieving great things in this life, but hides from their notice the victory that they need to have over impending death. But to those who in the fear of God face the issue, and according to divine instruction lay hold of the precepts of life the message of eternal life brings great joy. "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined." Isa. 9:2. Jesus Christ was this light who took upon Himself flesh and blood that "through death He might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; and deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage." Heb. 2:14, 15. The gospel has its only appeal to those who feel the weight of sin and separation from God and the fear of death. What a joy it is to them to experience life from above and hope of living forever!

"For to this end Christ both died, and rose, and revived, that He might be Lord both of the dead and living." Romans 14:9. "For God hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, that, whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him." 1 Thess. 5:9, 10, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" Praise the Lord! Oh, wonderful life! "The meek shall eat and be satisfied [of the Bread of Life, Christ: they shall praise the Lord that seek Him: your heart shall live for ever!" Psalm 22:26. How precious that with the Psalmist we can sing: "For thou hast delivered my soul from death, mine eyes from tears, and my feet from falling. I will walk before the Lord in the land of the living."

A Message From Mexico Mission

La Mission, Baja Calif., Mexico. (Nov. 8) Dear saints and friends: "We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the Lord fulfill all thy petitions. Now know I that the Lord saveth his anointed; he will hear him from his holy heaven with the saving strength of his right hand. Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the Lord our God." Psalms 20:5-7.

Yes, we are thankful for this salvation and can say with David that we are trusting in the Lord our God. Some say, "Oh, it would be so hard to go where there would be no assurance of support and hardly possible with a family of seven." But we find it a real joy to trust the Lord for everything. If you testify that you are trusting the Lord for soul and body, why would it be any harder for the Lord to supply your needs for soul and body in Africa or Mexico or any place he might lead? You say, "Oh, we have worked so many years in fixing our home comfortably and now we want to enjoy it for awhile." Who said you had to enjoy your comfortable home? We fixed our home to where it would be comfortable, but we could not enjoy it because the call of lost souls came heavy on our hearts. Brethren, time is shorter than we think. Let's do all we can to seek out the lost sheep; then we will have more brethren to help us fight the battles that are to come shortly.

We thank the Lord for your prayers and concern as we have re-established our family on the field in Mexico. The Lord has blessed us and opened up doors for the gospel in this place. Here in this valley are many people who want to come to services, but now as the weather is getting cooler we can no longer have services out under the trees. But we believe the Lord will help us to have a chapel in His own good time. There is available about 1000 small cement blocks, a plot of land, and yesterday a Mexican brother from Rosarito said that he had some scrap lumber that could be used for the roof. Ernesto's wife has been sick so he has not been able to work on any of the building. Pray for them. Also pray for another poor family of eight children who have been very destitute. They have some land loaned to them to farm, which is a blessing, and they are going ahead to prepare the land with horses and equipment that were loaned to them, also. Of course, it will take a lot of work on their part and feed for the horses and seed for the ground and rain from heaven. Pray for this worthy project. They have asked us to help them in this and have asked us to invite other brothers to loan money for seed and things, if possible.

We thank the Lord for the opportunity to testify for Him through the dental work. I am running a free

dental clinic every Wednesday for the poor people and also for the 71 children of an orphanage. A partially equipped dental clinic was turned over to me at this orphanage. Also the Lord has blessed me with about \$250 worth of portable equipment of my own. We are also thankful to the Lord for the privilege of helping our fellow missionaries by taking care of some of their dental needs. We trust it will help them to be more effective in their field of labor. We have witnessed the healing hand of the Lord many times in the dental work and we do depend upon Him completely to do the healing and to direct our hand in the mechanics of the work. We pray with the patients before we start to work and testify to them and give them tracts. Pray for us in this, that the name of the Lord will always be glorified.

Pray that our native Christians will move out more under the leadership of the Holy Spirit. There are several who seem to be moving up all the time.



The rains are still pouring day and night. Days are gloomy. We are glad that our wells are swelling. Our fear of water scarcity is gone. Praise the Lord! Yes, the wells of salvation are full already that we may draw water with joy. Praise the Lord!

It is our lot to encounter the wily assaults of the enemy at this tender, initial stage of the work. But we are happy to see the work sprouting and growing despite the onslaughts of the enemy. Praise the Lord! We have the living Word, living Saviour, living Almighty God, the ever-abiding Spirit of love and the church of the living God. Hence, the truth marches on conquering and to conquer. We are receiving encouraging news and letters from different parts of this land. Praise the Lord! Pray for us.

I am glad that you wrote to Bro. —. I heard from them that they are going to arrange for a convention at which they are inviting me to preach. Soon

after the rains stop we start our conventions. We hope to hold our first convention at the new chapel promptly in December when the rainy season will surely pass.

I am in faith taking one more step of starting an "Evening Light" publishing center, perhaps issuing a monthly paper. I contacted the pressman and got his quotation. It is calculated that this monthly need is \$25.00 besides the usual expenses. Our brethren need very badly some means whereby they can contact each other and read monthly messages. I can edit the paper with translating choice articles and messages from "Faith and Victory." I can also publish in Malayalam the Bible Study and Scripture reading as produced in the "Faith and Victory." Hence, I pray for this and hope in the Lord that the saints in America and abroad will pray also that this need may be supplied. I have to approach the government officials for sanction of this publication. Kindly pray over this that I may start it by the new year.

The year-end meetings and the convention with the opening of the new chapel will, of course, cause an expense. I will have to feed the believers that come from distant places and stay here for at least three days. I look to God for all these. May God provide is our prayer. We plead to God with importunity to grant us enough means to get along with the work of spreading the "evening light" truth in this land. May He grant our petition. Our humble request to you is that you all pray that souls may be awakened here, sinners may

be convicted, backsliders may be restored and believers be well established.

May God awaken the minds of the saints in America that they may pray earnestly for the church of God in India. I am sure the Lord will speak to your hearts and give you correct discernment and judgment to consider and to be considerate of us and God's work here.

NIGERIAN MESION REPORT

Under the cover letter date of Nov. 5, Bro. B. U. Etuk, native minister in Nigeria, enclosed the typewritten report written by the secretary, Bro. Nse Umanah, outlining the activities of the Church of God missions for the month of October. Following is a summary of the report:

On Sunday, Oct. 2, the gospel workers worshipped at their respective congregations. Bros. Etuk and Umanah remained at the mission center. Seven sick folks knelt at the altar of prayer, then lifted their hands to the Lord as a sign of receiving answers to their prayers.

On Sunday, the 9th, a combined service was held at Minya Ntak where Pastors Stephen U. Akpan and Jeremiah A. Udo are the ministers. (This report reminds us that this mission is where the late Sister Opal B. Wilson preached her last sermon before her departure for the Glory World on Sept. 24, 1964. Her memory is held in high esteem by all who knew her.) Pastor B. E. Udoka conducted the service. Bro. Udo preached on the subject, "Lift up your holy hands," using many texts of Scripture. Fifteen congregations were represented. An offering was received to complete the roof on the new permanent chapel which they have erected there.

On Sunday, the 16th, the ordinances of the Church were observed at Nya Odiong, a congregation under the care of Bro. J. U. Etuk and Bro. J. T. Unwa. Bro. B. U. Udeme conducted the service. Bro. B. E. A. Inyang taught the Sunday school on the subject of the ordinances, commenting on various texts. Pastor B. E. Udoka delivered an exhortation on the text in Job 15:11, 12. Bro. J. U. Etuk administered the ordinances in which 48 believers took part.

On the 4th Sunday several ministers met with the congregation at Inen Abasi Atai where Bro. Friday J. Akpan is the preacher. Bro. Sampson B. Udo conducted the morning service. Bro. Brownson Inyang preached an inspiring message. The attendance numbered 93 on this occasion.

On the 5th Sunday a special meeting was held at Ikot Akpan Eda. Evangelist Okon B. Akpan and his congregation were the hosts. Several ministers from other stations were in attendance. Bro. J. J. Udo led the Sunday school and conducted the morning service. Evangelist Udoffia preached a soul-touching sermon on "Thy Great Name." About 300 were in attendance.

During the month of October there were seven sick or afflicted persons at the House of Prayer which was recently erected at Ukpom. Three of the number received sound health and returned home. The others are looking to the Lord for healing and complete restoration.

All the mission stations in Nigeria plan to hold a general campmeeting on Dec. 16, 17, and 18, 1966, and have solicited the prayers of the Church in America for its success. This concludes the summary.

Proposed Missionary Trip to Nigeria and India

The prayers and repeated pleas of the foreign native gospel workers will be answered, at least in a measure, if the present leadings of the Lord are fulfilled. Bro. Cecil Carver of Shreveport, La. has been praying and looking to the Lord about his going again to Nigeria and India. This will certainly be encouraging news to the believers in those countries in anticipation of his presence with them again. Bro. and Sister Carver were in Nigeria in the autumn of 1965. From there Bro. Carver flew on to India for a short stay in the interest of missions, and Sister Carver returned home by air.

Since Bro. Carver's son Vernon works for an airline, he can get reduced rates for his father on certain airlines. Tentative plans are that he will go just as soon as he can get his visas from the various countries, and provided that all other arrangements can be made. At this stage it is not known whether he will go to Nigeria or India first, but he would like to be in each country two or three months during the dry season when he would not be hindered from getting about on account of the tropical rains. Bro. Carver will certainly appreciate the prayers and encouragement of all the saints in this urgent missionary endeavor.

Needless to say, the round-trip fare by air plus the cost of living and traveling while doing missionary work in those countries, will not be a small sum, but the crying need of heathen souls is urgent and the Church can pay whatever the cost if each has a vision of his responsibility before God. The writer as president of Faith Pub. House, a corporate body, is signing a required statement guaranteeing to those countries that Bro. Carver will be financially supported through the Missionary Fund maintained at this office. Time is running out, and what we are going to do for the salvation of souls must be done now! We have voluntarily committed and involved ourselves for this one purpose, and we would entreat each child of God to ask the Lord what He would have you to do for this very timely missionary under--Lawrence D. Pruitt taking.

- 5 And the devil, taking him up into a high mountain, shewed unto him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.

 - 7 If thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine.

Practical Truth: We are only as strong as our weakest point.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We thank God for His precious Son, in whom He was well pleased. When we think of the gates to the Garden of Eden being closed to man and there being no access to the Tree of Life because of sin, then realize how Jesus opened those gates, letting us come into the presence of God again, our hearts are made to rejoice. Everlasting life is given to all those who will repent. We then are to follow Jesus' example and be baptized. Jesus said it was needful for Him to be baptized to "fulfill all righteousness." Just so it is needful for us to obey and follow in His steps.

The Emphatic Diaglott, a translated Greek New Testament says, "Go . . . all the nations, immersing them into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Matt. 28:19. Immerse means to submerge. That is the mode of baptizing. When Philip baptized the man they went down into the water and came up again.

(Acts 8:38, 39.)

No where does the Word tell us to baptize infants, only those who are capable of believing. "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." (Mark 16:15, 16)

Jesus was tempted in all points as we are. He knows how to help us. God had a great work for Jesus and He was prepared for it. We can't work for God unless we meet the devil and overcome him through the power of God. We are tempted through the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life. (1 John 3:15, 16) Compare this with the temptations of Jesus.

January 8, 1967

JESUS BEGINS HIS MINISTRY

Printed Portion Luke 4:16-19; 5:18-26

Luke 4:16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.

17 And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written,

18 The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised.

19 To preach the acceptable year of the Lord.

Luke 5:18 And, behold, men brought in a bed a man which was taken with a palsy: and they sought means to bring him in, and to lay him before him.

19 And when they could not find by what way they might bring him in because of the multitude, they went upon the housetop, and let him down through the tiling with his couch into the midst before Jesus.

20 And when he saw their faith, he said unto him, Man, thy sins are forgiven thee.

21 And the scribes and the Pharisees began to reason, saying, Who is this which speaketh blasphemies? Who can forgive sins, but God alone?

22 But when Jesus perceived their thoughts, he answering said unto them, What reason ye in your hearts?

23 Whether is easier, to say, Thy sins be forgiven

thee; or to say, Rise up and walk?

24 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power upon earth to forgive sins, (he said unto the sick of the palsy,) I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy couch, and go into thine house.

25 And immediately he rose up before them, and took up that whereon he lay, and departed to his own house,

glorifying God.

26 And they were all amazed, and they glorified God, and were filled with fear, saying, We have seen strange things today.

Memory Verse: Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father. John 14:12.

Practical Truth: Jesus will be all to you that you will let Him be.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We notice that it was the custom of Jesus to attend the services of God in that day. Is it our custom, or are we neglectful? Paul tells us that we should "not forsake the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Heb. 10:25) God has special blessings for those who worship the Lord at regular times when they are isolated and do not have others to meet with. But when we are close to a congregation, God expects us to worship with His people.

Jesus read about Himself in the book of Isaiah. Jesus read Isaiah 61:17, 18 just as we might today. Isn't that a wonderful thought? Jesus studied the same Old Testament that we have today. Jesus received His authority not only from God, but also from the written Word which prophesied of Him. Then He declares that this is the year to preach to you. He was the Messiah who was to come and fulfill the prophecies concerning Him. He begins by doing what He told them the Messiah would do.

When the man sick with palsy was brought to Him, He fulfilled His mission. He forgave him of his sins and healed him. Some questioned Him, but He said, "The Son of man hath power upon earth to forgive sins." He also healed him that they might know He had power to heal, to give deliverance to the captives and heal the brokenhearted. Oh, what a Savior!

January 15, 1967

THE MARKS OF A CHRISTIAN

Printed Portion Luke 6:20-23, 27-36

Luke 6:20 And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, Blessed be ye poor: for yours is the kingdom of God.

21 Blessed are ye that hunger now: for ye shall be filled. Blessed are ye that weep now: for ye shall laugh.

22 Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.

- 23 Rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets.
- 27 But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you.
- 28 Bless them that curse you, and pray for them which despitefully use you.
- 29 And unto him that smitch thee on the one cheek offer also the other; and him that taketh away thy cloak forbid not to take away thy coat also.

Memory Verse: And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?

Practical Truth: Others will know that we are Christians by the life we live.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson is part of the sermon on the mount by our blessed Lord and Savior. He not only teaches us how to live, but He also makes us know what kind of a Savior and person He is. Jesus is our example. He trod the way before us. He received the marks of the nail prints in His hands and feet. Are we better than our Lord? If we live Christlike we, too, will have some marks upon us. We will be pointed out as different and separate from the world. The world does not love us but they love their own. Jesus was not of this world and we are not of the world. One time there were those who took note of the disciples and said that they had been with Jesus. Can others see the marks of Jesus in our life and take note that we have been with Jesus?

Jesus tells us how to act when we stand for the "faith once delivered to the saints" and persecutions are heaped upon us. He did not tell us to go around with long faces seeking sympathy from others, but He told us to "rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy, for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets." (verse 23) Some may ask how can a person rejoice when persecutions come? By looking at the great reward that is awaiting all who prove faithful and true to the end. We are just pilgrims in this world, traveling to our eternal home. We are children of the Highest.

OUR RESPONSE TO CHRIST

Printed Portion Luke 8:9-21

Luke 8:9 And his disciples asked him, saying, What might this parable be?

10 And he said, Unto you it is given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God: but to others in parables;

that seeing they might not see, and hearing they might not understand.

- 11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.
- 12 Those by the way side are they that hear; then cometh the devil, and taketh away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.
- 13 They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for awhile believe, and in time of temptation fall away.
- 14 And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection.
- 15 But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience.
- 16 No man, when he hath lighted a candle, covereth it with a vessel, or putteth it under a bed; but setteth it on a candlestick, that they which enter in may see the light.
- 17 For nothing is secret, that shall not be made manifest; neither any thing hid, that shall not be known and come abroad.
- 18 Take heed therefore how ye hear: for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have.
- 19 Then came to him his mother and his brethren, and could not come at him for the press.
- 20 And it was told him by certain which said, Thy mother and thy brethren stand without, desiring to see thee.
- 21 And he answered and said unto them, My mother and my brethren are these which hear the word of God, and do it.

Memory Verse: Take heed therefore how ye hear: for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have. Luke 8:18.

Central Thought: Take heed how you hear the Word of God and obey it.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

God wants us to be workers for Him. He wants us to live the life and speak the word of eternal life to others. Our lesson lists the four kinds of hearers of the Word of God as it is sent forth. There are the way-side hearers, the rocky hearers, the thorny hearers, and the good-soil hearers.

The devil works on all of them but the good-soil hearers refuse to let anything hinder them or turn them away from God. They are different from those who "have no root." There are plenty of troubles and temptations that would uproot them if they were not rooted deep enough in Christ. Our decision and determination needs to be strong and firm. We need to be filled with the Holy Spirit and so yielded to Him that we will have the power of God working strong in our lives. We must be so cut loose from this world and have our faith so anchored in Christ that we can say like Job, "The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away, blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) I believe Job is a good example of one who was grounded and settled in his decision to live for God. The Apostle Paul also said, "None of these things move me." The cares of this life and riches did not sap their love for God. Cares of life have a way of coming in slowly and pushing out

God and His Spirit. We need to be on our guard and be watchful unto prayer.
