Christ, the Shepherd of our Souls

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"Jesus answered them and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Ye seek me, not because ye saw the miracles, but because ye did eat of the loaves, and were filled. Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed." John 6:37. There is great labor today for meat and substance that will perish, but very little effort exercised to eat of the divine grace and truth that Jesus came to bring. But, oh, how important it is to the hope of mankind that they eat of the Bread of Life! The great and deplorable condition of men today stems from a lack of the Bread of Life in their moral and spiritual diet. And because of rejecting the standard of Christ's word and life, sin and death still reign.

There is spiritual food to be given to us by the Son of Man. This spiritual food is the means of our obtaining eternal life. The prophets of old foresaw the Messiah as one who would feed God's people. "Yet out of thee [Bethlehem] shall He come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting ... And He shall stand and feed in the strength of the Lord, ... and they shall abide." Micah 5:2, 4. "He shall feed His flock like a shepherd: He shall gather the lambs with His arm, and carry them in His bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young." Isa. 40:11. "And I will set up one shepherd over them, and He shall feed them, even my servant David; he shall feed them, and he shall be their shepherd." Ezek. 34:23. Thus we see Christ pictured in prophecy as One who would feed God's sheep. The feeding of the Truth and the Holy Spirit to souls was to mean deliverance from sin and death. In the Song of Solomon we see a metaphor of this in 1:7, 8. "Tell me, O thou whom my soul loveth, where thou feedest, where thou makest thy flock to rest at noon: for why should I be as one that turneth aside by the flocks of thy companions? If thou know not, O thou fairest among women, go thy way forth by the footsteps of the flock, and feed thy kids beside the shepherds' tents." Here

inquiry is made by the hungry soul as to where the Shepherd feeds His sheep, and the answer given. Oh, that there would be more such hungry souls today who would diligently inquire as to the whereabouts of the true Shepherd and His pastures! "Go thy way forth by the footsteps of the flock." Seek the company and association of true Christians. The soul needs to eat of the food from the shepherds (true ministers of God's eternal truth) to receive help. There have been many souls won to the dear Shepherd in this way. Their association and contact with true spiritual people led them forth into the living pastures. And as they partake of the manna from above they find their lives transformed unto holiness. Oh, how the truth needs to be preached, but how the truth needs to be heeded by those who hear!

Jesus proceeded in the 6th chapter of John to explain His role as the Shepherd of souls. "Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven. bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world." Then said they unto Him, "Lord, evermore give us this bread. And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.... I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread. he shall live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world. ... Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day. . . . As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me." These words offended many of those who heard, and considered not His explanation: "It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." To eat Christ literally and to merely know Him after the flesh would not profit. His Word and His divine Spirit was the essence of Himself that He declared to be the food for the life of the world. This can only be eaten by true faith and obedience and submission and conformity to their holy standard and nature. Thus the meat and drink that He gives is His commandments and the Holy Spirit.

There is a difference in professing Christ and truly eating of His essence. There is a great difference in knowing Christ historically and knowing Him as the Present living reality in the heart and life. The knowledge and relationship that He desires that we have with Him is that of the Spirit according to His Word. "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" Luke 6:46. Many seek His favor and claim to be Christ's who disregard His holy statutes of life. Christ is no longer here in outward form. But He left us the Word and the Spirit. He is revealed to us through these. To claim faith in Christ and at the same time reject His Word is blasphemy. The only way that we can truly eat Christ is to receive His Word and be led by His Holy Spirit. In preparing the hearts of His disciples for His departure from them, He said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, even the Spirit of Truth." When asked further how that from His place in the heavens at the right hand of God he would reveal or manifest Himself to His people and not unto the world, Jesus answered simply, "If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love Him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him. He that loveth me not keepeth not my sayings: and the word which ye hear is not mine, but the Father's which sent me." John 14:15-24. You see, our entire relationship with the Saviour hinges upon our relationship with His Word and the Comforter which is the Holy Spirit. Thus to eat of Christ and to be fed of Him as the Shepherd is to conform ourselves to the standard of His holiness by the grace that He promises to give to those who are meek and lowly in heart like Himself. See Matt. 11:29.

Notice Paul's attitude toward His pursuit of life and the attainment of the resurrection of the dead. "That I may win [or gain, possess] Christ, and be found in Him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith: that I may know HIM, and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being made conformable unto His death; if by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead." Phil. 3:8-11. Paul realized that the only way that he was going to live was to partake of Christ, and possess Him. To know Him. His righteousness. the power of His resurrection, His sufferings, and His death was the ultimate goal of this man. To fail to reach this goal was to fail to gain eternal life and triumph over death. Nor did he suppose and presume upon attaining it. It was continually the endeavor and pressing of his soul.

Dear reader, if you would have hope of life to come; if you would live with Christ in the eternal world; if you would attain unto the resurrection of life; if you would stand before the Son of Man and escape the destruction of all things material, you must eat of Christ, and grow up unto Him in all things. If you will yield to Him and humble your heart from vanity and pride, He as the Great Shepherd of the sheep through the blood of the everlasting covenant will "make you perfect in every good work to do His will, working in you that which is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever." Heb. 13:20, 21. God will do this if we will feed on the essence of His Son. Many spiritual lacks and failings can be cured through proper spiritual feeding. This is true in natural eating also. Many prominent diseases of the present day stem from improper diet. Take heed to yourself and see to it that your spiritual diet is what it ought to be. Christ Jesus as the Food for the soul is to us what the tree of life was to Eden of old. The tree of life assured the one who ate thereof of Because of disobedience man lost living forever. access to this tree of life. But in the Lord Jesus Christ and the atoning victory over sin through obedience that He wrought we have access anew to the tree of life. Let us be diligent to faithfully eat of Christ and thus assure ourselves of living forever.

"Except Ye Repent, Ye Shall . . . Perish" (Luke 13:3)

Many preachers of our day are filling the minds of the people with the thought, "Accept the Lord Jesus and you shall be saved." Very seldom does one hear the message, "Repent, or ye shall all likewise perish." Repentance is left out of the easy way to heaven preached by the majority of the world's famous evangelists of these last days.

The lack of good sound preaching that brings conviction and makes it plain to all seekers, just how to get rid of their sins, has burdened the writer. Carrying such a burden has caused us to study and to seek the Lord for the answer to the text used by these "easy way" preachers. "As many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God." Using this text they instruct sinners just to receive Christ, and it will be well with their souls.

We can never come to a correct understanding of any Scripture without considering who the speaker is, and to whom he is speaking. We must also have a correct knowledge of the time, place, and conditions under which the speaker dwells, and to what age he refers.

Let us consider the words of St. John found in his gospel (John 1:10-13): "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

"He was in the world." He had come into the world and "the world knew him not"—the worldly-minded ones of the world did not know Him—did not recognize Him.

"He came unto his own." Who were "his own"? Were not they the people of Israel, the church which came through the wilderness? Acts 7:38. The gospel came first to the Jews. "And his own received him not," but, thank God for the next clause, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." Many times we find the Word of God speaking in a general sense. The Jews as a nation rejected Christ and His message. Therefore Jesus told them, "Behold, your house is left unto you desolate." Matt. 23:38. Yet three thousand of the Jews repented and were saved on the day of Pentecost. Here again the Scripture is speaking in a general sense. "His own received him not." But as many of "his own" as did receive Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God.

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, Zacharias, Elizabeth, Simeon, and Anna were in the number of those who did "receive Him." These and all the others who accepted Jesus while walking in all the light of the law "blameless" were given "power to become the sons of God." This power from on high, wrought within them, bringing them into the "born again" experience, which was necessary to enable them to "see" and enjoy the kingdom of God that was at hand. For Jesus had said, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." John 3:3. This change of heart, and receiving the Spirit of God within, (which constitutes the new birth) was promised to the children of Israel. "A new heart also will I give unto you, and a new spirit will I put within you: . . . And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them." Ezek. 36:26, 27. This was a promise to the house of Israel to be fulfilled at the coming of the Messiah.

All who were "walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless" as Zacharias and Elizabeth walked, needed no repentance, having no sin to repent of, as they were "blameless" before God. These had only to "receive him." And by so doing God gave them the power to become the sons of God in the new dispensation through the experience of the new birth.

But all sinners must repent before they can receive the born again experience. Jesus said, "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." John the Baptist and Christ Jesus came preaching repentance to all sinners. Peter, on the day of Pentecost, told the Jews who had rejected Christ to repent. The Apostle Paul taught that "godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." 2 Cor. 7:10. "And he [Jesus] called unto him the twelve, and began to send them forth by two and two; . . . And they went out and preached that men should repent." Mark 6:7-12. God's true Holy Spirit-filled ministers of today still preach that "men should repent."

Christ Reigning Now on David's Throne-

The Apostle Peter, preaching that memorable sermon on the day of Pentecost, quoted from the prophet David in Psalm 16 with reference to Christ's burial and resurrection. In Acts 2:25, 27, 29-31 we read from Peter's sermon: "For David speaketh concerning him [Christ], I foresaw the Lord always before my face, for he is on my right hand, that I should not be moved. . . . Because thou wilt not leave my soul in hell, neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption. . . . Men and brethren, let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David, that he is both dead and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day. Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne: he seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ, that his soul was not left in hell, neither his flesh did see corruption."

Peter states explicitly that David's prophecy that Christ would be raised up to sit on David's throne was fulfilled in the resurrection of Christ from the tomb. Subsequently, Christ ascended to His mediatorial throne at the right hand of the Father. All power in heaven and earth was given into His hands. He is now King of kings and Lord of lords, and reigns from His majestic throne through the agency of the Holy Spirit over all His glorious kingdom on earth—the Church of God in this dispensation. David's earthly throne under the Old Testament was merely a shadow or symbol of Christ's spiritual kingdom under the New Testament. Christ came to save His people from their sins—their greatest enemy. Christ did not come to save His people from the bondage of the Roman government. Therefore, because of the misconception of the nature of Christ's kingdom, the Jews as a whole rejected Christ as the promised Messiah.

Christ will never set up a literal temporal kingdom on earth. This is a vain hope cherished by millions. Although Christ has power and authority over all the kingdoms of earth, He stated clearly in Pilate's judgment hall, "My kingdom is not of this world." John 18:36. Christ's kingdom is not and never will be an earthly kingdom. What truth could be plainer?

When God shall declare that time is no longer at the end of this world, Christ will leave His mediatorial throne and return with the angels of heaven and the saints in paradise to judge the world of mankind. He will separate the sheep from the goats. The sheep are the saved in His glorious kingdom. Instead of setting up an earthly kingdom, He will "deliver up" His spiritual "kingdom to God, even the Father, . . . that God may be all in all." 1 Cor. 15:24, 28. "Then we [the saved] which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." 1 Thess. 4:17.

The world "hell" in Acts 2:27, 31, verses quoted above, does not refer to the grave, as some suppose. The Greek Diaglott translates the original Greek word as "Hades," instead of "hell." Hades is the general term for "the unseen world of departed spirits," which includes Paradise, the heavenly realm of rest, and the "lowest Hades," the place of torment and darkness. During the three days that Christ's body was in the tomb, His soul was in Hades-in Paradise. Jesus said to the converted thief on the cross, "Today shalt thou be with me in Paradise," meaning the intermediate abode of the righteous between death and the final rewards. Christ's body in the tomb for three days was not permitted to see corruption. It did not decompose one iota. In contrast, we note that Martha said to Jesus at the tomb of Lazarus, "Lord, by this time he stinketh, for he hath been dead four days." St. John 11:40. The punishment for sin-"dust thou art, and to dust thou shalt return"—did not apply to Jesus' body, for He had never committed sin. He did not "drop his robe of flesh and rise," but was "sown a natural body" and was "raised a spiritual body," even as the Apostle Paul taught. 1 Cor. 15:44.

Truly, Christ was born into the world, but the most important event in your life is when He is born in your heart. If He is not now living there and governing your life, He was born and died in vain as far as you are concerned. May He be crowned King in every heart!

The popular Christmas spirit is foreign to the true spirit of Christ. The real purpose and meaning of His birth is buried under the maze of commercialism, social pleasure, and debauchery.

Thinking of Christ's birthday, let us give a birthday offering more directly to Him and His great cause. It is nice to give gifts to friends and relatives, but what would be more fitting than to give a gift or offering in memory of our Lord to a very needy person, a special offering for literature evangelism, or to support home and foreign missionary work? Jesus said, "Verily, I say unto you; inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

Your Body Is the Temple of God

"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are." 1 Cor. 3:16, 17. "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." 1 Cor. 6:19, 20. "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." 1 Cor. 10:31.

The above Scriptures set forth God's plan for His people in regard to their responsibility to care for their bodies in which God dwells by His Spirit. The temple of God is holy and it must not be defiled or injured in any manner. Therefore, the Church abstains from the use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco, medicine, and drugs, as well as tea, coffee, and colas which contain caffeine—a drug stimulant.

Caffeine is also added to some other "soft drinks" which do not come under the "cola" name. Recently Bro. Arnett Carver, of Shreveport, La., sent us some official information which he had obtained on this point. Since we believe this material will be informative to our readers, we quote from it as follows:

From The American Soft Drink Journal of April, 1968, we read: "The soft drink industry in the United States is a \$3.4 billion market," Mahoney said. "Colas account for 60 per cent of that total. . . . Canada Dry market studies showed that most people are unaware that cola drinks contain caffeine, although there is a general awareness that caffeine is contained in tea and coffee.

"Mahoney said that the formulas of the early colas used sugar and added a much larger amount of caffeine than that naturally present in the flavoring extracted from the kola nut. . . . He pointed out that caffeine has a stimulant action.

"Dr. Hall said that each 12-ounce bottle of leading competitors' cola contains about 55 milligrams of caffeine. A minute quantity is contained in the kola nut; the remainder is added to the beverage by the manufacturer. A cup of coffee contains between 100 and 150 milligrams of caffeine and a cup of tea about half as much."

Bro. Arnett Carver writes: "When 'Mountain Dew' first came out I began drinking it because I saw no harm-

ful ingredients listed on the bottle. Later though, I saw caffeine was listed on the edge of the bottle cap in small print so of course I stopped dripking it"

print, so, of course, I stopped drinking it."

A letter dated Oct. 13, 1967, to Bro. Arnett from Charles P. Grier, Vice President of Manufacturing of Dr Pepper Co., Dallas, Texas, reads as follows: "In answer to your request regarding the similarity of ingredients in bottled Dr Pepper and Fountain Dr Pepper, we are pleased to report that they both contain the same materials, but the quantities differ slightly. The differences are small and are designed to meet the conditions under which the product is served. Attached is a label used on the fountain syrup containers which provides an ingredient list. [Caffeine is on the list.]"

On Oct. 27, 1967, Bro. Arnett wrote Mr. Grier of Dr Pepper Co., and asked him this question: "I have read that some of the more popular brands of 'cola' drinks contain 3 to 4.6 milligrams of caffeine per ounce and am wondering how does this compare with the caffeine content in the regular bottled Dr Pepper?"

In reply on Oct. 30, 1967, Mr. Grier stated: "The figures you quoted in your letter of October 27 are approximately correct and will apply to Dr Pepper as well as the other beverages you mentioned."

The foregoing official information should set the record straight that Dr Pepper beverage contains the caffeine drug. Perhaps numbers of the saints did not have these facts. When light comes it makes us responsible before God and His Word, so let us abstain from the use of all beverages which contain drugs. Saints in light are conscientious in obeying God's Word, for they know that they must give a strict account of their conduct in this world.

Was The Devil Ever in Heaven?

(Part Four, continued from last issue) Revelations, Chaper 12

A crown of twelve stars was upon this woman's head. She was exalted and crowned a queen. Her husband was the King of kings and Lord of lords (Christ) and she is exalted to the position of queen, reigning by His side through His power over all the powers of evil and Satan right here in the earth,

In the Scriptures "star" is used to symbolize ministers or spiritual rulers or luminaries. Let us look at Rev. 1:20, "The mystery of the seven stars which thou sawest in my right hand, and the seven golden candlesticks. The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches." Then in the 2nd chapter of Revelation, the messages to the seven churches begin and we note in verses 1, 8, 12, and 18, and in chapter 3, verses 1, 7, and 14 that the message to each individual church is addressed to the angel of that church. That would mean the minister or overseer there in that congregation. Perhaps the twelve stars in the woman's crown refer to the twelve apostles of Christ who were her first ministers and were co-workers with Christ Himself in establishing her in truth in the earth.

The moon was under her feet. The moon has no light of its own, but reflects the light of the sun. This is a proper symbolizing of the law and prophet age above which the church had just risen to receive the grace and truth which was brought by Christ Himself. The law with its various rituals and sacrifices and mode of worship typified Christ and the prophets prophesied of Him. In reality, all the light that the law and prophet age had was that which was reflected upon it by the Christ, the Sun of Righteousness, who was to come.

This woman (the church) was travailing in birth and pained to be delivered of a child. This properly symbolized the earnestness and zeal with which the early church labored and sacrificed all to win souls for Christ. And she brought forth a man child. This man child properly represents the multitude of souls who were brought to Christ, born again, in the early church. There were about three thousand in one day on the day of Pentecost, and soon afterward we read of five thousand, etc.

Some may question how a man child could represent such a multitude, but this is no mystery when we understand what the saving grace of God does for people and that those who are saved are of "One heart and one soul" (Acts 4:32), and that the whole church is the "Body of Christ" (Eph. 1:22, 23, Col. 1:18), and there is "ONE BODY" (Eph. 4:6, 1 Cor. 12:13, Rom. 12:5). Further in Eph. 2:13-15 we find that the entire multitude of saved people composed of both Jews and Gentiles who have been brought together in Christ are referred to as "ONE NEW MAN."

Now at this point when the woman was bringing forth this man child (multitudes of believers) the dragon appears and goes into action. He stood before the woman to devour her child as soon as it was born. So now we will turn our attention to the dragon, the second wonder mentioned in Rev. 12, and identify him in the Scriptures.

First, he is described as having seven heads and ten horns. Would we expect to see such a literal, physical monster as that? Certainly not! Then we know that he symbolizes something and the Scripture will help us in finding out what.

In the Bible horn stands as a symbol of power and authority. They stand for the same here in connection with the dragon. The head would more properly symbolize the ruler or system through which this power or authority was executed. The Scriptures make this perfectly plain concerning this dragon of Rev. 12 and the beast of Rev. 13 which had the same identical marks as the dragon—seven heads and ten horns.

Now, let us turn to Rev. 17:3, and we find here a scarlet-colored beast having seven heads and ten horns—the same identical marks as the dragon of Rev. 12 and the beast of Rev. 13. This time there is a woman riding on the beast, but she is a very different woman from the woman of Rev. 12 who was clothed with the sun, etc., and a pure woman. But this woman of Rev. 17 is declared to be a vile harlot. If the pure woman of Rev. 12 represented the true pure Church of God in the earth, which the Scripture clearly proves that she did, then a woman who was an impure, vile harlot, would properly represent a false church or religion. But this woman was riding

on the beast, therefore we are certain that in some way this beast which is identical with the beast of Rev. 13 together with the dragon which gave the beast its power and seat and authority and which is distinguished by the same marks—seven heads and ten horns—must be, or is closely connected with a false, impure system of religion.

Rev. 17:7 says, "I will tell thee the mystery of the woman, and of the beast that carrieth her, which hath the seven heads and ten horns." Then, in verse 9, it says, "The seven heads are seven mountains on which the woman sitteth." The city of Rome, which was at that time the governmental and political head of all the then-known world, is said to be situated on seven mountains. This is a geographical note of history concerning the city. This verse, then, helps to establish the location or place of the seat of authority of the dragon and beast.

But the seven heads also had a further meaning besides just the seven mountains on which the woman sat. Verse 10 says, "And there are seven kings." During the reign of the Roman Empire as a universal power there were seven different systems or forms of government through which her universal power was executed. They were: (1) The regal power, or kings. (2) Consuls or dictators. (3) Decemvirate, a government by ten men. (4) Military Tribunes or Consuls. (5) Triumvirate, a government by three men. (6) Imperial or emperors (under the Caesars). (7) The Exarchate or Patriciate (Exarch was the title of the ruler of this western kingdom under Charlemagne).

Then in verse 12 attention is turned to the horns instead of the heads, and it says, "And the ten horns which thou sawest are ten kings, which have received no kingdom as yet." This refers to the ten minor kingdoms which grew out of the Roman Empire during its decline and fall. History records such to have been the case and names these kingdoms as follows: Ostrogoths, Visigoths, Sueves, Vandals, Franks, Burgundians, Heruli, Saxons, Huns, and Lombards.

At the time the Revelation was given to the Apostle John about 96 A. D., the Roman Empire was in its unified form as a world power, and the ten horns had not yet come into existence. The Scripture says they are ten kings which have not yet received a kingdom. But at a later date the Roman Empire disintegrated and fell apart and was broken up into ten minor parts or kingdoms.

These are all merely identifying marks of the dragon and beast so that we might know where to locate them and not be deceived into thinking that this Scripture is teaching something which it is not, such as the devil being in heaven and there being war in heaven, etc.

Rome has been in her time the seat of two grossly false systems of religion. Hence, it was necessary to symbolize her in two forms—a dragon in one instance, and a beast in another—but the seven heads and ten horns of each definitely identifies both of them with Rome. The two false systems of religion of which Rome has been the seat are Paganism (heathenism.

idolatry) and Papalism. The dragon symbolizes Pagan Rome and the beast symbolizes Papal Rome.

Rome in its Pagan form with its heathenish and idolatrous worship was prevailing over all the world when Christ came to earth to bring salvation. This false system of religion with its worship and sacrifices to its idol gods stood in direct opposition to the worship of the true God as taught and practiced by Christ, His apostles, and the early church in general. He stood before the woman (true church) ready to devour her child as soon as it was born. History proves this to have been a literal reality. The opposition became so violent between them that it was finally declared to be a capital crime punishable by death to profess Christianity. When anyone would profess a faith in Christ he was subject to death as soon as he was apprehended. History gives an account of more than sixty millions who were put to death for the name of Christ and their testimony of faith in Him as their Saviour during the combined reign of both of these false systems of religion of which Rome was the seat—Paganism and Papalism.

This is what is meant by the war in heaven—the ecclesiastical or religious heaven. It is said that Michael (Christ) and His angels (ministers) fought and the dragon (the false religious system of Paganism which was dominated, permeated, and engineered by the spirit of the devil himself) and his angels (the priests or ministers or prophets of this false system of religion) fought.

A clear example that this was in the ecclesiastical heaven (the violent opposition between true and false idolatrous religion) is found in Acts 19:23 through the remainder of the chapter. On this occasion Paul and some companions had gone into Asia preaching the gospel of Christ. They came to Ephesus, which was much given to the idolatrous worship of the goddess, Diana. As they taught them that there were no gods which were made with hands, etc., a violent opposition developed against them and they were mistreated and man-handled, etc., and there was much confusion throughout the entire city, and the people of that city cried with one voice for about the space of two hours, "Great is Diana of the Ephesians." Other examples can be found in the New Testament and many, many such cases can be found in church history.

This is what is meant by the woman's child being caught up to God and to His throne. When the converts were born or brought forth, then they were put to death and their souls ascended to God. It also explains the statement in verse 11 that they loved not their lives unto death. They were willing to die for Jesus' sake. Paul, who was a martyr for the cause of Christ, said, "Neither count I my life dear unto me, that I might finish my course with joy." Acts 20:24.

The fact that this dragon is called Satan in the 9th verse merely shows the nature of his activity. Satan was more or less a general term applying to any individual or power that stood as an opposer. Jesus called Peter "Satan" on one occasion when he stood before Him and attempted to dissuade Him

from going up to Jerusalem because he knew He would suffer there. (Matt. 16:23). Therefore this false system of religion was called "Satan" because it stood in opposition to the true religion. This does not at all disannul the fact that the term "Satan" is applied to the devil in many instances in the Scriptures, but sufficient evidence has already been produced to show this is not talking about the devil himself in this chapter, but the agent or system through which he operated.

Verse 9 says the dragon and his angels were cast out. As the truth of God with its enlightening and regenerating power continued to spread through the earth through the efforts and work of Christ, His apostles and then the great company of the early church, the deceptions of the devil in this false system of idolatrous worship were more and more uncovered and exposed until the people were able to see the truth and the condition they were in, and as they did, they threw down the false worship and that idolatrous worship, through which the devil had been successful so long in deceiving their darkened souls and causing them to hold it in high esteem in their hearts, was exposed by the light of truth, and was then cast out of the high esteem and allegiance of the people and cast down to a low plane of ill-repute and was looked on with disdain and contempt by the people as they discovered its errors and turned unto the truth. Therefore it is said to have been cast out of heaven (the high and exalted place it had in the hearts of the people).

Bear in mind that it is talking about the dragon all the time, and we have already seen clearly by the Scriptures what the dragon symbolized.
