

Perfect Submission

We are living in such a fast-paced age, and feel so many pressures in life. Situations arise and decisions have to be made. We may not realize how desperately we need God, but our decisions can affect us, and also our loved ones, for a lifetime.

The tempter is always present when it is time to make a choice. He is so beguiling. How can we really know the Lord's voice? Jesus said He was our Shepherd and we are His sheep. "...he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice." John 10:4.

In our busy world, it is very easy to get ahead of our Shepherd instead of following, but Jesus has a very important lesson for us to learn follow Him. When we are following our Shepherd, we know His voice, as it is so calm and soothing to our soul, and we feel so at rest and submissive to Him. One song writer so beautifully expressed it:

"Perfect submission, all is at rest, I in my Savior am happy and blest, Watching and waiting, looking above, Filled with His goodness, lost in His love."

If we get ahead of our Shepherd, our mind will be filled with doubts and fears, confusion and unrest. However, the Great Shepherd of our souls is always faithful to deal with us. Here are His loving words to the care-laden heart. "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." Matthew 11:28-29.

The lesson Christ wants us to learn is "perfect submission." When we have learned that God's ways are so much higher and better than our ways, and then we willingly yield to God, we experience a deep quietness, sweet peacefulness, and fullness of joy that will flood our innermost being.

Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." John 14:27.

So our peace doesn't depend on how well things are going for us; it depends upon our submission to God. Some of the verses of this familiar song say so well the way to follow our Shepherd. "He leadeth true; I will not question, Tho' thro' the valley I shall go, Tho' I should pass thro' clouds of trial, And drink the cup of human woe.

"God's way is best; heart, cease thy struggling To see and know and understand; Forsake thy fears and doubts, but trusting, Submit thyself into his hand.

> "Thy way is best, so lead me on-ward, My all I give to thy control; Thy loving hand will truly guide me, And safe to glory bring my soul."

How can we sing a song like that from the depths of our being? We can if we obey the words of our Shepherd. "...Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." Matt. 22:37.

What do you think about? This will be the determining factor of whether you are choosing your own way or God's way. When we can get to the place where we cease our own struggling "to see and know and understand," and it doesn't matter how God chooses to work something out for us, we have begun to learn about "perfect submission." When you have totally submitted, you don't feel the hurt or burden nearly as much, for Jesus is leading the way.

Instead of focusing on our own sufferings, focus in on the sufferings of Christ. It will most certainly make your own sufferings look small in comparison, and help you learn "perfect submission."

When Jesus willingly came to the earth in the most humble manner possible, He came with the purpose of healing the brokenhearted and setting the captives free. He comprehended the depths of His sufferings before He even came. In Psalms 22:1-19 we can read one of the prophesies made about Christ. "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? why art thou so far from helping me?... But I am a worm, and no man; a reproach of men, and despised of the people. All they that see me laugh me to scorn: they shoot out the lip, they shake the head... They gaped upon me with their mouths, as a ravening and a roaring lion. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint... My strength is dried up like a potsherd; and my tongue cleaveth to my jaws; and thou hast brought me into the dust of death... They pierced my hands and my feet... They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture."

Surely we can trust and be in perfect submission to the one who died for us. "...It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:34, 38-39.

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Editorials

"And the multitude cometh together again, so that they could not so much as eat bread. And when his friends heard of it, they went out to lay hold on him: for they said, He is beside himself." Mark 3:20, 21. The previous verses to this text tell about how Christ chose out twelve apostles from the ones who had answered the call to follow Him. This was the ministry being put into action, and immediately gaining momentum. The scene described would be an inspiring sight to behold. The people were so enthusiastic about hearing the words of life that they gave Christ and His apostles no time to take refreshment. This enthusiasm was not generated by the crowd alone, but it was undoubtedly a reflection of Christ and the apostles. They were convicted by, and convinced of this gospel, and it was presented in such a way that it caught fire. When Christ's friends heard about what was going on they judged that Jesus was simply carried away with Himself, and they went out to restore calm. If Christ and the disciples had been carried away with themselves, which it is even possible for religious people today to do, the course of history would have been drastically altered. The truth of the matter is, they were carried away with the power of the gospel.

Enthusiasm is, and always has been, an integral means of sharing the gospel, and it goes farther than just a salesmanship job. This enthusiasm is a heart-felt joy. It has been related that one Chinese convert of many years ago said, "We want red-hot hearts to tell us of the love of Christ." In reading biographies of successful Christians, such as Luther, Wesley, Finney, Moody, and many others, it is noted that enthusiasm was a powerfully motivating force. Therefore, it is important for us to know the source of this enthusiasm; how to keep it, and what its effects are.

True religious enthusiasm has its foundation in faith. Have you ever seen a salesman who didn't have total faith in his product? The Christian who finds he can't wholeheartedly recommend his salvation needs to either get a new and deeper experience, or at least take a refresher course at the feet of Jesus. An inventor's persistence in creating is his faith in the workability and usefulness of the product. It was Columbus' faith in discovering his goal that maintained his passion. So it is in Christianity; enthusiasm is founded on faith. Enthusiasm must be fed or it dries up. In simple terms, a car that doesn't continually have gas put into it, is of no better purpose than a storage container. It is impossible for us to keep up enthusiasm unless enthusiasm has something to feed on. A showy, emotional enthusiasm won't last long. This is the rock that whole movements can make shipwreck on. But there is such a thing as a sustained, rational, responsible enthusiasm. The thing which sound enthusiasm feeds on is lucid truth. It is when the mind feeds upon such things as God's grace and mercy, God's omnipotence, the kingdom of God, the resurrection and heaven, that enthusiasm is spawned and fed.

Anything with power, must of its own destructibility be watched. We have alluded to the revival that enthusiasm genders, but if unwatched, it makes fanatical, out of balance people. It can create prejudices, hatred and gross injustice. History shows us the inequities in religious and racial realms warped enthusiasm has wrought. There are safeguards for this. One is to have contact and fellowship with healthy, stable Christians. Be wary of anyone who has a hobby horse to ride. This particular kind of enthusiasm can very possibly be created by personal ambition, and/or grievances. Interrelate to those who have a balanced, complete diet; who aren't mesmerized with any one particular doctrine so much that they can speak of nothing else. Be careful of the attitude that forges ahead at the total abandonment of those with age and experience. We recognize that all of us must work out our own salvation, but an absolute and irresponsible disregard to how God has worked through others is not a healthy enthusiasm.

Enthusiasm is a very contagious attitude. If the Church is to operate at its optimum, it needs to be filled and overflowing with the enthusiasm of salvation. Let us each one strive to be a properly governed power plant of this most desirable quality.

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Mexico Report

January 9—Dear Bro. Wayne: Greetings of love. I trust you are all keeping warm. In California we have had bad weather. It was too cold. Now it is too wet.

The Lord gave us about two tons of clothes the day before the big rain this week. I was going to call Goodwill to come and get it, but then I heard Tijuana was requesting help. So after visiting the mayor of Tijuana, they gave me a letter to get by customs, and I was able to take three big loads in my pickup. The last load, last night, I took to Bro. Humberto's. But due to their road being impassable, we put the clothes in a house close to the road, and they will distribute it later. I also put some in my storage.

One man and his wife were swept into the water with their bed in the night, just down the hill from Bro. Humberto's. They have not found the bodies. At least 14 have been counted dead. I heard on the Tijuana news that some areas are in much need of food and water. Roads are gone, and some houses have been swept down the canyon. The ones in the Tijuana congregation are all fine, but they had no electricity last night. They are alright in Ensenada also.

Pray for the officials of Tijuana and Ensenada, as the big problem now is repairing the streets. There is danger of sickness from all the filth in the streets. The mayor of Tijuana is requesting help from the States in way of earth-moving equipment, dump trucks, pumps, food, clothes, blankets, etc.... —Bro. James Huskey


IN MEMORIAM

Elmo Smith was born in Richwood, WV, on February 3, 1927.

In 1939 he moved to Seattle, WA, and worked for the city of Seattle for 30 years. He started attending all the camp and assembly meetings at Jefferson, OR, in 1959, while his aunt, Beatrice Spaur, was there.

On January 3, he called and said, "My friends here think I have heart trouble. So I guess I must be pretty bad off, but I don't have any pain. I'm trusting the Lord. No one is with me here, only you folks there." Four or five days later he passed peacefully in his sleep.

He leaves to mourn his passing, brothers, Leslie, Joe and Bill of the Seattle area. His parents, two brothers and one sister preceded him in death.



In the last few articles we have been considering some of the difficult stumbling blocks to the two works of grace doctrine of justification and sanctification. We will here consider another important scripture that has been a major stumbling block to some in understanding this wonderful truth.

Romans 8:9 says, "...Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." The reason this has proven a stumbling block to some, is that they have interpreted this scripture as referring to the Holy Spirit, and consequently conclude that one could not be saved without possessing the Holy Spirit. Hence the conclusion is, that a complete salvation is obtained at one time. But I do not interpret this text that way and for the following reasons:

We would certainly agree that Christ's spirit was holy. There's no argument there. He knew no sin. (II Corinthians 5:21). "Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth." I Peter 2:22. He was tempted in all points as we are, yet without sin. (Hebrews 4:15). Hence He was holy and possessed the spirit of holiness.

Christ also possessed the Holy Spirit within Him, (He came upon Him in the bodily form of a dove at His baptism) the same as we possess Him when we are sanctified or baptized with the Holy Spirit. But the Holy Spirit is a distinct, definite personage, and is always identified in His own person, the same as Jesus, the Son, and God, the Father.

The Holy Spirit is a member of the triune Godhead and is co-existent with God, the Father, and Jesus Christ, the Son. In Hebrews 9:14, He is called the eternal Spirit. And He is as distinct a person as either of the other two. Therefore, it would be no more proper to refer to the Spirit of Christ, meaning the Holy Spirit, than it would be to turn it around and say the Christ of Holy Spirit. In either case, we would be failing to observe the proper distinction between distinct persons.

Now let us notice some other scriptures which use the term "spirit of." In the one referred to above, (Romans 8:9) we read of the Spirit of God and the Spirit of Christ. But let us look closely at this as we pass. It is said in the first part of this verse that, "Ye are not in the

flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of Goddwellinyou." I agree this could refer to the Holy Spirit because that is the name of the entire Godhead. But there is a period at this point,

making the sentence complete. It expressed the complete thought. Then the verse goes on to say, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, (not the Spirit of God this time) he is none of his." Then the next verse goes on to say, "And if Christ be in you," etc. Here it seems to me that the Spirit of Christ in the last part of verse nine and Christ Himself in the first part of verse ten, are used interchangeably.

This seems to me to correspond quite well with a couple of texts in the third chapter of II Corinthians, verse six, that say God has "made us able ministers of the new testament; not of the letter, but of the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life." Verse 17 says, "Now the Lord is that Spirit..." Here it is declared the Lord is that Spirit, and it is clear that it is not the Spirit of Christ, but Christ Himself is the spirit, or heart, or life, of the gospel message. Surely there would be no question in anyone's mind but that the Spirit and the Lord are used interchangeably in these two texts.

But let us go further in considering texts

which make reference to the "**spirit of**." In Ephesians 4:23 it says, "And be renewed in the **spirit of** your mind." In I Corinthians 2:11 it says, "For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the **spirit of** man which is in him?" I Corinthians 2:12 says, "Now we have received, not the **spirit of** the world," etc. Revelations 16:14 says, "For they are the **spirits of** devils, working miracles," etc.

In all the foregoing texts we read of the spirit of **God**, spirit of **Christ**, spirit of **man**, the **world**, **the devil** and spirit of your **mind**, but nowhere do we read of the spirit of Holy Spirit. Again I say that He is a definite personage, and is always identified in His own person. This distinction must be maintained to produce proper sense.

It would, no doubt, be easy for us to understand that the "spirit of your mind" would refer to the tendencies, disposition, nature, actions and controlling influences of one's mind. The "spirit of the world" would refer to the natural tendencies, dispositions, controlling influences and behavior of the world. Then the "Spirit of

Christ" would refer to the nature, disposition, tendencies and behavior of Christ.

In I Corinthians 6:17 it says, "But he that is joined unto the Lord is one spirit."

This corresponds with Romans 8:9 which says, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." Surely all who are saved and joined unto Christ are made a partaker of His Spirit, which, as has already been observed, is His nature, disposition and characteristics of life and behavior

In II Corinthians 3:17, the Spirit of Christ is declared to be a spirit of liberty. It is a spirit of obedience, as stated in Philippians 2:8, where it is said that He became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Hebrews 10:9 says, "Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God." Matthew 26:39 says, "And he went a little farther, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt." Matthew 26:42 says, "He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done." John 4:34 says, "Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his

work." John 8:29 says, "And he that sent me is with me: the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him."

We receive that same spirit of obedience when we get saved. John 14:15 says, "If ye love me, keep my commandments." And John 14:21 says, "He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me." etc. In Hebrews 5:9 we read, "he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him."

The Spirit of Christ is a spirit of humility. Philippians 2:5-8 says, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." In Matthew 11:29 Jesus said, "...I am meek and lowly in heart..."

But we are instructed in Philippians 2:5 to let this mind, or disposition, or nature, or characteristic be in us. Jesus said in Matthew 5:3, "Blessed are the poor in spirit: (humble spirit) for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Again Peter says, "But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price." I Peter 3:4.

Christ's spirit is a spirit of mercy. Matthew 12:20 says, "A bruised reed shall he not break, and smoking flax shall he not quench, till he send forth judgment unto victory." This same spirit is to dwell in them who are joined to Him. In Matthew 5:7 Jesus said, "Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy." Again in Luke 6:36 Jesus said, "Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful." This comes in line with the very same thought as is dealt with in the fifth chapter of Matthew which concluded in verse 48 with these words of Jesus: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect." It is the same thought and sums up to being perfect in mercy, and in our attitude toward our fellowmen. Read Luke 6:35 and Matthew 5:43-48. Jesus forgave His enemies and died to save them, praying, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do."

In Malachi 4:5 there is a prophecy concerning John the Baptist, which comes in good place here. It says, "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord." To prove that this was John the Baptist, we refer you to Matthew 11:10-14. "For this is he, of whom it is written, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare the way before thee. Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist: notwithstanding he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force. For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John. And if ye will receive it, this is Elias, which was for to come."

Now someone may say, "How could John the Baptist be Elijah or Elias?" But this is clarified in the statement of the angel to Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist in Luke 1:17, "And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children..."

This makes the point clear and throws some light on the text in Romans 8:9. John came at a time of deep apostasy and great spiritual darkness such as Elijah, the most outstanding of all the prophets, came to Israel. John turned the hearts of the people to God as Elijah had done in his day, and he manifested the same vehemence against error, and the same zeal and boldness for truth that Elijah had shown in his day. It brought a great spiritual awakening the same as Elijah's work had brought, so it is said he went in the spirit and power of Elijah in so much that he was called Elias.

This is the way I see our having the Spirit of Christ. It is in our possessing within ourselves that same vehemence and righteous indignation against sin and error; the same zeal and boldness for truth and righteousness, the same humility, meekness, gentleness, mercy, obedience, behavior and every other characteristic of Christ Himself, and doing His work. Colossians 1:27 says, "...Christ in you, the hope of glory." Ephesians 3:17 says, "That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith..." John 6:56 says, "He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him."

The way, then, that I interpret having the Spirit of Christ is to have Christ living within us, and the Christ-life predominant in all our behavior because the Lord is that spirit.

A True Experience

It was late afternoon when the Greyhound bus rolled to a stop in a large midwestern city. I hurried to the ticket office to check my departing bus, only to learn I'd just missed it, and would have to wait two hours for another. I checked my luggage, walked about the place a little, saw small groups of men loitering here and there, but I don't recall seeing any women travelers. This gave me a very uneasy feeling, when I realized I must spend two hours there. I decided to go for a walk and talk to the Lord about the matter. I said, "Lord, you know it was not my fault I missed the bus. Surely you have a purpose in this." I had not gone very many blocks when a strange feeling and heavy burden came over me. I felt deeply constrained to return to the station, which I did, and, glancing at the clock, realized I had been gone only fifteen minutes.

There were now about a dozen people sparsely seated on the long benches, and a lively conversation was going on. I noticed a few women folk among the group which made me feel less ill at ease, especially since one woman held an open Bible on her lap. I listened intently until I felt I could discern the theme of their controversy. As I drew closer, the man sitting opposite the woman with the Bible said, "Arise and be baptized and wash away thy sins." She answered and said, "I thought there was more to it than that." "Read it yourself," the man said. "Acts 22:16," and so saying, he turned and read that portion of the text from his Bible.

By this time I could plainly see the leadings of the Lord in the whole thing. Jesus said, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled," and here was a soul hungry for God. I walked around to where she was sitting and seated myself beside her, asked her pardon for interrupting but added: "I've been listening to your conversation and maybe I can help you." She smiled, yet looked very sincere as she soberly stated her question. "What I want to know is what preparation should one make in life to be able to go to heaven when he dies, or just what to do to be saved. Now this man, [indicating the one seated opposite us] says, 'Be baptized and wash away your sins,' but it seems to me that isn't enough."

"Well," I said, " 'God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life' (John 3:16). Now turn to the 8th chapter of John." But she, being so unfamiliar with the Bible, said as she placed it on my lap, "You find it." "Oh, here it is," I said, as we read together several verses dealing with the thought, "If you die in your sins, whither I go ye cannot come." Jesus was teaching the people here that SIN would keep them out of heaven, so we must get rid of SIN in our lives or we cannot go to heaven.

"That's what I want to know," she said. The man on the opposite seat interrupted by saying, "Acts 22:16 plainly tells us . . ." But I answered, "Let us see a little further here. God hath said, 'that the world through Him [Jesus] might be saved,' therefore we need to learn more about Jesus, for it is through Him and by Him that the plan of salvation was made. In Matthew 26:26-28 it says, 'And he [Jesus] took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, [His disciples] saying, Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of SINS.' Here again in Heb. 9:22, 'without shedding of blood is no remission [of sins].' Again we read in 1 John 1:7-9, '...and the BLOOD of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from ALL SIN If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins.' Here in Col. 1:13, 14, we find some folks who had obtained salvation by obedience to His Word. 'Who hath [or has] delivered us FROM the power of darkness, and hath [or has] translated us into the kingdom of his dear SON: in whom we have redemption through HIS BLOOD, even the forgiveness of SINS.' Dropping down to the 20th verse we read in part, '. . . having made peace through the blood of His cross.' Notice in these scriptures nothing is mentioned of water baptism to take away sins."

"But why don't you read Acts 22:16?" queried the male voice.

"Oh, yes, Sir," I nodded, "if you will please be patient we shall indeed read your text." Directing my explanation to the woman again I explained, "You see, we are dealing with **spiritual** things, not **literal.** You know there were oceans, lakes, and rivers of water before Jesus came into the world, and there still are. If water baptism could wash away sins, there would have been no need for God to send His Son into the world to suffer, bleed and die to make the plan of salvation. He is often referred to as 'the LAMB of GOD,' and in Rev. 13:8, '**the lamb**

slain from the foundation of the world.' Praise the Lord!"

We read in the second chapter of Acts of some folks who asked the question of how to be saved. We read most of the chapter and explained that this was at Jerusalem at the Jewish feast of Pentecost, and the Holy Ghost had recently descended from heaven into the hearts of the hundred and twenty souls. The Apostle Peter, being filled with the Holy Ghost, spake the word with great boldness and power. Among other things he told these wicked people that they crucified the Lord. Reading the 37th verse, "Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do [to be saved] ?" Peter tells them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins...." Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and there were added unto them about three thousand souls." Notice here, "they that gladly received his word," and His word was first of all, "REPENT." Baptism came later. Before

length in chapters 21 and 22 and explained that Paul was a prisoner at this time, and was being carried into the castle for security from the angry mob who sought his life. He asked permission to speak to the people, which was granted, and he was quoting what Ananias said when he had visited him in Damascus more than twenty-five years before. Now let us read in Acts the 9th chapter the original account of this matter. Saul of Tarsus, being zealous for his Pharisee religion, had authority from the high priests to persecute the Christians. On the way to Damascus he was stricken down by a light from heaven above the brightness of the noonday sun, fell to the ground and was blind. This great educated man humbled his heart, had a conversation with the Lord, and trembling with astonishment, asked, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" He was told to go into the city, etc. We also find he was blind three days, did neither eat nor drink, and God, speaking to Ananias, said of him, "Behold, he prayeth." Now the 17th verse, "And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands

Jesus made His ascension back to His Father He gave this commission to His disciples, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" Mark 16:15,16. "For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Rom. 10:10, 13).

These Scriptures teach us how to be saved. First, we must believe God and repent, confess to God we are sinners, and ask Him for mercy and forgiveness. We must pray and call upon His name with a sincere and humble heart, until He lifts our burden of sin and satisfies our hearts with the joys of salvation, so we can "live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world." (Titus 2:12.)

Now, let us read Acts 22:16.

"That's what I'm waiting for," said the male voice.

"And now why tarriest thou? arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord." At this point we read at on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord, even JESUS, that appeared unto thee in the way as thou camest, hath sent me, that thou mightest receive thy sight, and be filled with the Holy Ghost." Ananias did not mention, "Be baptized and wash away your sins." This man Saul, who had met GOD in such a miraculous way, had humbled his heart, submitted to God's will, been fasting and praying, lo, these three days, had no sins to be washed away. Furthermore, if Saul were yet a sinner, God would not have sent Ananias to him that he might be filled with the Holy Ghost. God's Word definitely proves that the Holy Ghost is not given to sinners. Moreover, Ananias addressed him as "Brother Saul" (both men were saved). In all the Apostle Paul's teaching, never does he teach or advocate water baptism to save from sin. But the Word teaches us that, following an experience of salvation, we should follow the Lord in water baptism. It's an ordinance of the church, signifying to the world that a personal experience with God has taken place in the heart. Paul writes in Romans the sixth chapter, "Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein? Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Before Ananias left, Saul received water baptism.


In "rightly dividing" the Word of truth we must interpret the phrasing in Acts 22:16 in harmony with the tenor of all the other Scriptures on the plan of salvation. Jesus was baptized, being our example, but rest assured, NO SINS went down the Jordan.

By this time the man had quietly slipped away. He had asked questions and so had the woman during this discussion which lasted more than an hour and a half. God gave liberty and helped to answer each one according to His Word. The woman thanked me and said, "I believe I know how to be saved now." As I arose to leave there were perhaps twenty-five or thirty persons gathered around, listening. One elderly man put forth his hand and said, "Little lady, you got it right, you got it right!" "Are you saved?" I asked. "No," he said, "Not now, but I was saved when I was young, and I got it just like you said." "Well," I said, "God will save you again if you will come to Him the Bible way." "I know it," he said, "Will you please pray for me?"

I hurried for my luggage and was the last one to board the bus. As I took the only vacant seat, I looked across the aisle, and there sat our opposer. Several hours later and 150 miles further south, he made his exit. The bus driver laughingly said to the patron behind him, "There goes the preacher, and some preacher he is. Usually he is wide awake and talks a great deal. Surely he wasn't feeling well tonight—he was so quiet."

During a recent illness, I inquired of the Lord if there was anything I could do that would be to the glory of God and prove a blessing to souls. The Lord brought the above experience so vividly to my mind, although it happened several years previous. He impressed me to write it and send it forth. So we trust it will accomplish the purpose for which it is sent.
