THE USE AND ABUSE OF OUR AUTHORITY

No doubt all who are sincerely laboring as gospel ministers are interested in this matter. At the first thought, it might appear useless to write in a general way on this point; but truth will always bear repetition. Peter stirred up the Christian church in regard to things which he was aware they already knew. (II Pet. 1:12.) It is one

thing to be vested with authority, and it is quite another thing to properly use such authority. God's sheep are taught to recognize the authority with which He vests His ministry and to submit themselves; but He also instructs the ministry to be careful how they use the authority He has given them. "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood." Acts 20:28.

"Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock." I Pet. 5:2-3. I wish all who profess to be, or think they are gospel ministers, would pray for a better and clearer understanding of what is contained in the above scripture. There is no doubt that many could become more efficient as ministers of the Word of God by a further, careful study of these and similar instructions given in the New Testament. I know of no better way to become a useful and good minister of Jesus Christ than by following the example of Jesus, observing His teaching and that of His holy apostles, and waiting much upon God for grace to manifest His spirit in the way He did.

Feeding the flock. It is hard to feed some-

thing or somebody if it or he is not hungry; so I sympathize with anyone who is laboring to feed people who do not seem to relish the food placed before them. Perhaps if we would get at it right, we could make the food more palatable. Unpalatable food may be swallowed; but it does not afford enjoyment and little, if any, nourishment. It would not prove very profitable to keep feed-

ing such food as in its nature or preparation is unpalatable to the ones being fed.

Sometimes the flock may not be in a good spiritual condition to enjoy or profit by the food we might think they need, or perhaps the food is not properly prepared before being placed before them. If we do not understand the principles of feeding and the laws governing the same, there is a possibility that we may begin to feed them from a big table filled with judgment. Of course, where it is necessary, the desired effect will follow, but it is generally better to try to have our speech with more grace and seasoned with salt. In other words, make the food more palatable and pleasant. I am sure God can help us to understand the needs of His flock and with the help of His Holy Spirit, prepare food which will be both pleasant and profitable to the partakers. We must give milk to babes, and not give them strong meat. Full-grown folks may drink milk with profit, and relish it too, but babes cannot use or digest strong meat.

Taking the oversight. While obligation is placed upon us, we are to be willing to take the oversight, not for money which, in such a case, is filthy lucre. It is not right to take the oversight merely to make a living. The only consideration to be allowed is to serve God and to do His bidding for the love we bear Him. Of course, we all have to live, and we must, of necessity, use temporal things; but God does not ordain that we should enter into the sacred calling of a minister of His Word because it suits us as a means of making a living. The one who enters into gospel work with such a motive will soon find out that he has made a mistake. Christ is God's free gift to man. We have no right to set a price on the gospel of Christ. He said to the apostles, "...Freely ye have received, freely give." Matt. 10:8.

Not as being lords. Jesus has told us that His yoke is easy and His burden is light. When we exercise our ministerial authority in the way we should, no one will notice in us any appearance of an air of superiority. No such thing was manifested in the life or the ministry of Jesus. In this respect we can just be like our Lord and Master. Jesus settled that question shortly before His death. "...Ye know that the princes of the Gentiles exercise dominion over them, and they that are great exercise authority upon them. But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister: And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant." Matt. 20:25-27.

From the foregoing we learn that ministerial authority among God's saints is vastly different from the authority among the people of the world. It is to be exercised in a much different manner. Instead of the one vested with authority making the brethren feel that he is in any wise superior or impressing them with an idea of his being master and lord, he is to take the humble attitude of a servant and to act just as a servant should act while serving those whom he is hired to serve. If the above instructions given by Jesus are observed and followed in a humble way, there will be no difficulty in making others feel that we are humble. If those who act as ministers of Christ would always keep clear of the "lording" spirit and humbly deal as Jesus would have them deal, fewer souls would be crushed and accused, and shut up in places where they are unable to get free. If we are "clothed with humility," no hold-down, beast power, or human authority will be manifested in our dealings, but Christ will be all and in all.

There is such a thing as being dead and having our life hid with Christ in God. The ministers are to be examples to the flock in all things; and, if we expect God to raise up young ministers who are humble, the older ministers will have to be examples and be so clothed with humility that they will be hid and only Christ will be seen. One can be humble just as well as another. We may have different natural dispositions and temperaments, but the Holy Spirit in one will manifest Christ just as in another. We all have but one pattern to follow.

Take heed unto yourselves. A failure to do this at all times and to be diligent in the same. has been the cause of many a slip and not a few downfalls. I have heard some ministers tell a congregation that they did not pray enough and that more time should be spent in prayer and waiting on God, and yet these ministers have failed to be proper examples in this respect. Shepherds are to lead the flock by precept and example, instead of driving them. If we are desirous of having the flock to be more spiritual. we need to take the lead. When we preach that more time should be spent in secret prayer, let us not neglect to spend as much time in secret devotion to God as we teach the flock to spend. May God bless all the dear ministers and make us more able as servants of Christ to fill our -J. C. B. place in the body. Amen.

OKLAHOMA STATE ASSEMBLY MEETING



AZ—Dear Bro. Murphey: From the Lord to me to you; grace, mercy and peace.



We have the pleasure to remind all the saints, by way of comforting ourselves, that a period of seven years, i.e., from September 26, 1989, to September 26, 1996, has elapsed since my predecessor, our dearly beloved pastor, Bro. From Mexico...

November 20, 1996-The semi-tropical sun shines brightly this Sunday morning in the state of Sinaloa. Over a maze of ropes and wires suspending electric light sockets, pieces of black plastic tarp and an old blanket are tied to shield the arriving congregation from the sun. Wooden benches, plastic chairs, a pulpit and a P.A. system are retrieved from a tar-paper shack and set in place. The children have Sunday school in this little storage shack. The young people's class goes across the street to a member's small tar-paper house for their lesson. I was asked to teach the adult class under the shade of these tarps. The Lord blessed with a lesson on spiritual maturity and sanctification, which was received very well.

Every Sunday each of the congregation walks or comes on the bus that runs every half-hour during the day. At night it is very difficult to walk long distances over the rough streets, so each evening while here, I have made two and sometimes three loads in my little pick-up, bringing people to the night services and then taking them home. Sometimes when I was really loaded down, we went dragging the bumper over the rocks and slipping the clutch to climb the hills.

After the first service that I was here I bought a 45 watt P.A. system and hooked it up to an old metal horn speaker that Bro. Gonzalez has had for a long time. Using this system, the hymns, sung with quartet harmony and recorded by my daughter, Patricia Bell, and our announcements of the service could be heard for several blocks. The evangelist's messages could also be heard a great distance away.

Seekers came forward each night. The last night of the three-day meeting I was working at the altar with another person, when Sister Lola came with a burdened heart and knelt beside me. As she knelt there her little Danny came to see what was going on, and I put my arm around him. They live across the block in a one-room tar-paper shack. The authorities have threatened to take the boys away from Lola because they run the streets and sometimes get into trouble with the police.

Sister Regina, who got saved last year is still coming to church with her three little girls. At times she works and leaves the children in the house alone. Her husband does not support them. Help could be administered by Pastor Adelfo and his wife, if someone would like to sponsor these children by providing such things as school supplies and clothes. But what these children really need is supervision and an opportunity to learn better things. Maybe the Lord will put a burden upon someone to fill this need. Investigations are being made into the availability of a suitable place to shelter neglected children there in Culiacan. Property can be bought for \$500.00 a lot.

Men of the congregation are working on Saturdays preparing to pour the floor and finish the fourth wall of the chapel as funds for the materials are available. After this is done I would like to have a group of willing workers go with me to put the roof on the chapel. It is sunny and dry there during the winter.

The evangelist the Lord provided for this trip was Polo Villagrama, who was my Bible student three years ago. From Culiacan, we traveled south to Mazatlan, where we stopped at Polo's sister's home to eat "mole" that she had prepared for us. Then we traveled east up into the mountains to his home village which is located where the highway crosses a river.

We set up the P.A. system and played the cassettes of Church of God hymns to attract the people and we announced services for that evening. Just after the sun went down about thirty people came and stood or sat under a large tree. Polo wanted me to preach and lead the service. Polo's little niece had learned many hymns while living in Sonora, so I asked her to sing "Jesus Loves Me" into the microphone. Then she sang a long ballad about Daniel. So she became our singer for the three nights of evangelistic services.

Tuesday, Polo and I walked up through the tropical forest on a path by a stream to pray. A fellow came by on a burro and was startled to see us. He demanded to know what we were doing there. Polo gave names of places and people to let the man know that he was of that area. The man said his name was Juan and that he was going up the mountain to cultivate his corn. Polo knows that there are also "other crops" hidden in the corn fields.

I sat down and wrote: "I see many vines in the trees. Some are flowering but I don't see any wild orchids as I have seen in other forests in Mexico. I heard and saw a flock of wild parrots and some long-tailed black and white tropical birds. I tried to get a picture of a hummingbird but it was too fast, so I settled upon a bunch of butterflies."

In a dry creek bed, we prayed for the night services and the people of the town. On the way back down, we stopped at a typical adobe ranch house with a large porch where we visited for awhile. A girl was sitting in a rocking chair doing some needlework. A hen and chicks were going in and out of the kitchen. Pigs and a burro were also fairly close by. Sounds like a beautiful, peaceful place, doesn't it? And it could be if the people knew the Prince of Peace. But here we were told stories of drunkenness, brothers fighting against each other, drug deals and immorality.

We had services the second night 5 kilometers down in another village, where I read from Matthew 11:28 and related to these people of the "rancho" about farming with oxen. They understood very well what I was talking about as they have had experiences with oxen. A wild ox is tamed by yoking the rebellious one with the strong, meek one. The fighting one will finally rest when he quits kicking. Christ said, "Learn of me and you will find rest."

The last night the Lord gave Polo much liberty in testifying and preaching, and six of these dear people came forward. Those that gave their hearts to the Lord asked us to come back as soon as we could. They need Bibles, encouragement and our prayers.

We rejoice that the Lord has provided efficient workers here in Ensenada. Brother Jaime Morfin helps with the translating. We hope to soon print some issues of the *Beautiful Way* in Spanish. Sis. Jennifer Cole arrived a few days ago and Sis. Annette Porter has been with us for two months. All of us worked together to produce 50 booklets and some posters for a study that Charlotte gave on "Training Children to be Godly," at a two-day women's gathering.

Thank you for your prayers. We are in a war against evil. Now is the time to publish the truth as the devil is getting so bold with all kinds of false doctrines about the Holy Spirit and endtime events. —James and Charlotte Huskey

October 10, 1996—Dear Brother Wayne Murphey: I greet you in the holy and precious name of our beloved Saviour, Jesus Christ. I hope this finds you doing well in health and very encouraged to live for the Lord.

That Glorious Guest, The Holy Spirit

"Joys are flowing like a river,

Since the Comforter has come;

I would like to share some precious thoughts about the Holy Spirit. They came to me upon awakening and seemed to go like this:

The Spirit said quietly, "I am with you."

"Lord, do You just stay with me, night and day?" I asked.

"Yes, I live and abide in you. I will never go away, unless---"

"Unless what, Lord?"

And then He began to talk with me and remind me of all the things that Jesus has told us about the Holy Spirit, and share with me the knowledge that Paul and the other apostles have given us concerning the Holy Spirit.

To begin with, I thought of how Jesus was sent to earth to do His Father's will. (Hebrews 10:5-10.) After He had accomplished and finished His Father's work, He returned to heaven to sit at His Father's right hand—the right hand of power, authority, intercession and distribution. (Mark 16:19, Ephesians 1:20-23, 4:8-11, Philippians 2:5-11, Hebrews 1:3, 4:14-16, 9:24, 10:24.)

The next step was that God the Father, in fulfillment of His promise (Joel 2:28), sent the Holy Spirit, by His Son, Jesus, and in Jesus' name (John 14:26), to indwell and empower the believers on earth to do the work *they* would thus be sent forth to do. Jesus was **sent**, the Holy Ghost was **sent**, and we are **sent**.

Jesus did nothing of His own (John 5:19-20, 8:28-29), and as the Father spoke, moved, worked and instructed Him, so Jesus spoke, their knees in one accord in the upper room, until He had come. For ten days (Jesus ascended forty days after Passover; Pentecost was fifty days after Passover—this leaves ten days) they fasted, prayed and tarried, entreating, supplicating, no doubt humbling themselves, becoming of one mind, laying down SELF and personal ambitions, dying to *every* desire except for that one all-consuming thirst and passion for the LIVING WATER.

Oh! What would happen if every soul sought for the Holy Ghost in this manner! If we casually, idly, half-in and half-out, every now and then, make a flimsy show of seeking for sanctification, as we call it, as if it were a *thing* to be had—when in truth He is a PERSON, our Master, our Life—is it any wonder that we sometimes go for months or even years and never see any answer or change or movement, and no infilling by the Holy Spirit? Is it any wonder why we then begin to doubt the whole thing?

We need to keep an earnest, seeking heart for this precious heavenly Guest to come and dwell in us, and when we reach the point of a perfect consecration, where we know and <u>God</u>

moved and worked. The Holy Spirit, as the very essence and fullness of Jesus Himself, does not act on His own. (John 16:13.) Whatever He hears from Jesus, the Great Searcher of all hearts, (Romans 8:27, Revelation 1:14), and the Head of the Church (Ephesians 5:23), all authority and power having been given unto Him by His Father (Matthew 28:18); so the Holy Ghost speaks, moves and directs. As believers, we can do nothing on our own. (John 15:5.) Our work is fruitless, our labors are vain, and nothing good can come from our efforts without the direction, leadership and power of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

The apostles watched Jesus until He was out of sight, and then remembered that He had said, "Tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high." (Luke 24:49.) They could not go another step in the work of God *until He came*. They had no power. No doubt the void left in their lives by the departure of Jesus left them so earnestly longing, seeking and desiring for this One who would come and fill them with the very spirit and power of their dear Master, that they fell on knows that we are fully and totally His, He will put that sacred seal upon what is now completely His—that seal, the Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 1:13-14, II Timothy 2:19, 21.) Only then can we have the faith to grasp the promise and believe and receive the Holy Spirit.

Who is He and what does He do in our lives? **He is the Comforter.** (John 14:15, 15:26, 16:7.) The Greek word for Comforter, *parakletos*, means intercessor, advocate and consoler. Only as Jesus had suffered as humans suffer, could He become the High Priest, and our Intercessor to the Father; even so the Holy Spirit, coming by Jesus and through Jesus, could only now be, because of the sufferings of Calvary, that Comforter and Advocate. Now He could know what we feel; now He could identify with humanity. (Hebrews 2:16-18.)

In His office as Comforter and Intercessor, **He is the Helper.** He helps our weaknesses and infirmities. (Romans 8:26.) The Holy Spirit, coming to our aid at this time of prayer, knows us in our deepest needs and He knows how to express those needs, when we can't, to our High Priest, Jesus. Jesus, thus communicating with us by the Holy Spirit, communicates and pleads for us to His Father. The Holy Spirit also expresses the will of the Father to us and causes us to pray an inspired prayer in accordance with the very mind of God. As the Holy Spirit inspires us to pray the very mind and will of God, God is then able to answer that prayer and work that will in our everyday lives. (Romans 8:26-27, John 15:7, I John 14-15, Philippians 2:13.) It is an unbroken circuit of Divine communication between us, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit; for our good and in our behalf, for the Father's glory and purpose, and for the further completion of His will.

Cain's Sacrifice

"And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the Lord. And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the Lord had respect unto Abel and to his offering. But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell." Genesis 4:3-5.

Those who have heard the story of Cain and Abel, know how that God accepted one sacrifice, and not the other. How many, though, have assumed that Cain did not offer a sacrifice? It is too easy to say, "Well, he didn't offer anything that was much of a sacrifice," or "His heart wasn't right." Some may say that God would have accepted it if Cain had been sincere, and if it had been a "real" sacrifice.

It must be pointed out that Cain did make a sacrifice. It was one in which he had put much effort. Only one thing was wrong with his sacrifice: it wasn't the one God wanted. No matter how much it meant to Cain, it meant nothing to God. His effort meant something to God, but God wanted more; He wanted a particular kind of sacrifice. In the end, it was not the lack of a sacrifice that caused Cain to fall, but it was a lack of obedience to God's wishes.

How many of us today make the same sort of sacrifice? How many of us assume, that if we just make a sacrifice to God, He will accept it and bless us for it? If we can say, "I am doing this for God," then we "score points" somehow. We can be totally sincere about the sacrifice, but if it is not what God wants, we will be in mortal danger.

"Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in that name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity." Matthew 7:21-23.

Here we see an awful trap. There will be people on the Judgment Day who think their good works and their sacrifices guarantee them a place in heaven. They will find differently. I pray it doesn't happen to any of us.

Too many think that God on His throne will be some sort of Santa Clause asking, "Have you been a good little boy or girl?" In truth, He will be a Father, asking, "Did you do what I told you to?" Let us earnestly seek God in our lives so that we can make a sacrifice which is more than just the sacrifice of Cain. Let it be the obedient sacrifice of Abel.

Wisdom and Understanding



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Excerpts Taken From Dec., 1946 Faith and Victory

The National Minister's Meeting is now a thing of the past, and will be recorded in the minds of those who attended as one of the forward moves in the Church of the living God, and sweet memories will linger in our hearts and minds of this time when more than sixty ministers met in heavenly counsel with God and one another.

Some of the subjects brought before the ministers were: "The qualifications of a minister," "A pastor's duty in a congregation," "The duty of a congregation toward a pastor," "Where there is a number of ministers in a congregation, should all be pastors or one be recognized as a pastor with authority and responsibility?" "The need of congregations being set in order with deacons and deaconesses, and their duties and qualifications," "Marriage and divorce," "Child training," and many different other subjects of minor importance.

While discussing these subjects, we noticed that some had very lenient views that would soon drift into compromise and others had legalistic views that would soon hobble the Holy Spirit and cause deadness in members. But the ministers as a body were so directed by the Spirit, with firmness backed up by the Scriptures, that most of the questions which were brought up were brought to a satisfactory agreement and left in such a way that almost all could understand what the Bible teaches as sound doctrine on each particular subject. —Fred Pruitt
