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DEAD TO SIN, ALIVE TO GOD

"Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 6:11. Two parts/points stand out in this verse. Being dead to sin and being alive to God. They are not necessarily one and the same. Remember the story of the man who was likened unto a house that was swept and garnished (decorated) in which no one lived (Matthew 12:43-45 and Luke 11:24-26). When the unclean spirit that had left it came back again he noticed that it was vacant. Then he went and got a bunch of his buddies to come live in it again. The last state of this man was worse than the first. Therefore it is not enough just to have our house cleaned. We need someone to inhabit it. Dead to sin, but alive to God.

First comes death. There is a reason for this. "For he that is dead is freed from sin." Romans

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6:7. "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned." Romans 5:12. "For the wages of sin is death;..." Romans 6:23. In the first verse the word dead is a combination of two Greek words which together mean to die off. Death in the other two verses comes from a single Greek word meaning death. If I want to escape death, the punishment that sin carries with it, if I want to be from it "freed," then I must be willing to die off. So what is it to which I must be willing to die? "And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts." Galatians 5:24. Why? Because it is the flesh that leads you into sin. (See James 1:13-16.) The last verse of that reading states, "Do not err, my beloved brethren." If we allow ourselves to give into what our flesh wants, in terms of the lusts of the flesh. then there awaits nothing but this ominous death that sin brings. That is because the flesh will lead us right back into sin every time. That is the only thing it knows. Paul confirms this in Romans 7:14-24. The last verse of that reading states. "O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" The answer,— "I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord...." Romans 7:25.

There is deliverance. No, I do NOT have to continue on in sin, in my helpless estate. There is deliverance. Christ is more than able. There is but one thing that stands in the way of His deliverance in our lives. "...So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the

flesh the law of sin." Romans 7:25. We must die to the desires of our flesh. They are utterly corrupt. "So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God." Romans 8:8. This is not a literal death of the body, this is a dying to the pull the flesh has upon us. A turning away from the path it tries so strongly to pull us down. If we want to walk with Jesus, we will have to die in this manner to the flesh. But this is just the first part.

"Likewise reckon ye also yourselves...alive unto God...." Romans 6:11. God's children are not just to be impassionate corpses walking around until the day we leave this earth. We are to be ALIVE. Jesus said "...I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10. Not just have it, but have it "more abundantly." The word translated here as more abundantly means superabundant, superior and excessive, among other things. The message here is that Jesus did not just come to provide an example of dying to the flesh, but He also demonstrated that we are to be alive and brought that life to us. "For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of His resurrection." Romans 6:5. This is why it says.

"...but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord." He is our pathway into this life. Jesus said, "...If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him." John 14:23 The God of heaven and earth, the Almighty Creator of this universe and His Son Jesus Christ, by whom He made the heavens and the earth, have agreed to come and make Their abode with me. That means They are planning to take up residence, to live within me, to bring me into a place where I am alive to God.

"For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.... That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God." Ephesian 3:14-19. There is so much to discover. Our God is immeasurable. His goodness is without end, His power is without limits and He will extend both to each soul that will diligently seek and obey Him. God bless His saints.

It was with a degree of sadness that with the publication of the *Bible Lessons* we used almost all of the surplus paper that we had previously obtained in Idaho. There is only enough remaining to print a small book. Our purchase and use of that paper saved us several thousand dollars

for which we are grateful to the Lord. Upon checking with our normal supplier to obtain more paper we found that the price was going to be approximately \$500 more per skid. We thank the Lord that through the efforts of Bro. Earl Benson a connection was established to obtain some paper for approximately the price our original supplier had been selling it to us. We have contracted for approximately \$3500 of paper to begin publications this New Year. You will notice that this issue of the Faith and Victory is being printed on an acid free paper that is slightly more cream color. It has a smooth finish and is more opaque than what we had been using.

The Lord blessed the services of the Oklahoma State Assembly meeting by sending forth many encouraging and soul-searching messages. The songs of Zion were sung with heartfelt enthusiasm and the presence of the Lord was very near warming the hearts of His people with thanksgiving and praise. The spirit of conviction was greatly felt in the services but there was only a moderate amount of altar work until the final service of the meeting.

On the last Sunday evening of the meeting, January 2nd, there was planned to be a baptismal service following the evening service. There were two who planned to follow the Lord in baptism that evening. But the Lord had other plans. Tim Huskey invited everyone over to his home and the singing and rejoicing continued until about 2 a.m. when we had prayer and retired to our homes thankful for the grace of God. I was telling someone a few days ago that it seems that I've been trying to die for the last five years but God has seen fit to raise me up each time. Sometime back this was weighing heavy on my mind and I was thinking how things would go with Dora after I was gone. One day I decided to make sure that she understood how to handle the little business matters so I went over the finances, which didn't take very long, and the expenses and bills and so forth, which took a little longer. But still, even at that, I was rather anxious about it all.

Dora was so afflicted with arthritis, suffering very much. Her joints had become very stiff; she could only sleep in a recliner and it bothered her very much that her memory seemed to be slipping badly. Both of us got to the point that we just couldn't walk and we had a real problem loading our wheelchairs when we went anywhere. But now, as I look back, I can see how God was looking on and making arrangements for us ahead of time. Many times our timing isn't the same as God's. Sometimes we feel that God is slow and that He should hurry up and work things out but we've found that God's timing is always perfect and He does it right.

About a year ago the Lord worked it out that I found a van that had a loading ramp in the side door so I could load my wheelchair and could ride it up to the steering wheel and drive. Of course if some of you saw how I did it you might decide to drive behind me rather than ahead but it does work real well. Also Dora was able to

travel some. We enjoyed going to the Pacoima camp meeting each year but this year Dora insisted that we go and let her stay home. I didn't want to leave her alone so made arrangements for some children and grandchildren to stay with her at night. One day she went to get the mail and on returning she had to stand up to open the front door and somehow in sitting down she flipped off the buggy seat and fell and broke her hip. She could have lain there for quite awhile but the Lord worked it out that Bro. Delmar Wilkins and one of his workers came by in just a few minutes and helped her up and into the house.

She suffered much pain for the next few days but the Lord was always on the scene to comfort and relieve her. She had such a good attitude through it all. We could just see the Lord ripening her up for heaven. The last day she seemed to know that the end was near so she called for all the children and grandchildren. The Lord cleared her mind and she was able to encourage all of them to meet her in heaven. It wasn't very long until she went into a coma. We watched as every breath seemed to get shallower and shallower. It was so precious. I really expected to hear a flutter of angel wings as they came and got her.

Don't let anything get between the Lord and us. I was troubled about me leaving her here by herself but the Lord had that all taken care of. I haven't yet figured out how to make the kitchen smell as good at meal time as she did and when she was around it seemed like the house automatically stayed clean but now I find that when I drop something on the floor it just stays there until I pick it up. I'm learning how to cope with the lonely times and the dear saints have been so kind with phone calls, visits and letters. God bless you all.

MISSION REPORTS

2004 AFRICA MISSION UPDATE

Greetings to all the saints at home and abroad. I am thankful for the blessings of God this year on the gospel work in Africa. We thank each one that has carried a burden for the various gospel efforts. Your prayers and financial support have been a great blessing to the recipients in Africa. Souls have been saved from the curse of sin, cold children have been warmed and the Kingdom has been furthered.

I had purchased a ticket to fly to Ghana in November but, due to an injury, I was unable to make the planned trip. I have been hindered from traveling and working for a number of months but I am still encouraged and am continuing to look to the Lord for a complete healing. The Lord answered prayer and Northwest/KLM refunded 100% of my ticket. We give God all praise. What a blessing we have as children of God to know that we are in the Lord's hands and that He is in control of all things that touch our lives.

I will here give a brief account of some of the highlights of this last year concerning the gospel work in Africa.

Malawi/Mozambique

Last year we established a "blanket fund" in order to buy blankets for orphans and impoverished children in Malawi and Mozambique. Since this fund was established many children have received blankets and now have something to help protect them from the cold in wintertime. Bibles are being purchased and placed in the hands of souls hungry for the Word of God. Two young men from the village, one of whom translates for me when I am there, have finished another year of education due to the support of the saints.

Many congregations have been established in both Malawi and Mozambique. Here is a quote from a letter I received from Bro. Failos in Malawi (edited slightly for clarity): "Most of the congregations come from Roman Catholicism. So according to our rules and teaching of baptism as you know. Roman Catholics do not baptize with water—see Hebrews 6 verse 2. The second reason is that your first teaching with the late Bro. Bob people understand very well. This is why many congregations join us. The second witness is that last year you traveled to Mozambique and you teach different congregations. After we left there we opened three new congregations, which means your teaching is very profitable because people did not know what the Word of God was telling us. That is why we have different congregations. Most of them come to us to get the understanding of the Word.... What you can know is that if God wants something to happen, no man can control that. It is the will of God to spread Christianity."

What a blessing to know that people are still being drawn to Christ and holiness by the power of the Word of God. There have been various meetings held in villages throughout Malawi and Mozambique this year.

Quoting from another letter from Bro. Failos: "Here in Malawi all the saints send greetings to you and all the saints there...."

Ghana

The saints in Ghana are encouraged and continuing to press the battle on. There are three primary ministers that we are supporting monthly to enable them to spread the gospel. Bro. Maxwell, in Akumadan, is continuing to pastor the flock there. A new congregation has been established this year in the village of Nkenleasu. Bro. Atobrah is laboring there while Bro. Badu is continuing to labor with a congregation in the village of Tanoso. These young brothers have a burden to spread the gospel throughout Ghana as they have means and opportunity. Here is a quote from one of their letters concerning their burden: "I am praying for the Lord to help the watering (of the congregations) because my vision is to plant the Church of God throughout the country."

The congregation in Akumadan has undertaken a big venture in the last couple of months in starting a school. At present they have 63 young children enrolled. They have had a burden to have a school for many years and have just recently stepped out with faith and little else to begin this project. They are in need of a sundry of school supplies and books. They are

interested in bettering the education of their children as well as taking this as an opportunity to more adequately teach their children about the Lord.

Nigeria

The month of December has concluded two national camp meetings in Nigeria. As yet we have no report but are trusting that God blessed richly in these meetings. There are brethren in Nigeria, in whom we have confidence, that have a strong grasp of the Word of God. There have been splinters and divisions among "Church of God" groups the world over and Nigeria is no different. Some of the brethren have a burden to reach out and see if there is a place for reuniting without compromising Spirit and Truth. Please pray that God would lead and direct in a very plain and clear path.

After much time and prayers I am thankful to report that we were finally able to send enough funds over to Nigeria to purchase a vehicle for the gospel work. This has been a long-time need and we praise God for providing for this worthwhile cause this year. The brethren safely received \$9000 and an 18-seater Japanese made Urvan Nissan bus was purchased. They plan to equip it with a public address system to use in evangelistic work. I have entrusted the vehicle to Bro. F. Naths-Igbanibo's oversight. May God bless each one who contributed to this needful effort.

We need not look very far to be reminded of the extensiveness of the work of God. The fields are white and ready to harvest but the laborers are few. The needs are great but God is greater still. May the Lord help us, as some of His people, to be faithful to fulfill the great commission at home and in foreign lands. May we do all within our power and ability to help spread the gospel of salvation to a lost world.

I have been working on a website that contains facts, mission history and photo galleries depicting the culture, scenery and gospel work from various African countries. I hope to have this site accessible to the public within a couple of months. Please continue to remember the gospel efforts in Africa. We have brothers and sisters in this foreign land that are worthy of our prayer and support

The couple who cared for her, Sharon and Tom Housh, several nieces, nephews, cousins and friends survive her.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, December 21, 2004 in the Benjamin Funeral Chapel in Nowata. Internment was in the Memorial Park Cemetery.

Scriptures used for the service were St. John 4:21-24, St. John 5:24-20 and I Corinthians 15:16-26.

Here I would like to compare Sister Beisly's home going to a ship sailing on the ocean of life.

Let us pretend we are standing at the seashore. We see the ship spread her sails to the morning breeze and start across the blue ocean. She is an object of strength and beauty. We watch as she becomes only a speck of white where the sea and sky meet, each other. Then someone says: "She's gone!"

Gone where? Just gone from our view; that is all. Her diminished size is not her and as someone says; "She's gone," there are other eyes watching her coming and other voices from eternity shouting, "Here she comes!"

She has taken her bright candle and gone into another room which we cannot see but anyone can tell where she has been by the little light she left behind.

Memorial services were officiated by Bro. V. E. Koch.

Bertha LaVeau, 92, of Shell Lake WI, died Thursday, October 21, 2004 at Terrace View Living Center in Shell Lake. She was born in Wisconsin April 21, 1912 to Will and Gertie (Sinclair) Coleman, growing up in a family of 13 brothers and sisters. Memorial services were held Monday, October 25th in Shell Lake, WI, with burial beside her husband in the Sarona Wisconsin cemetery.

Bertha was born into the Church of God by virtue of the new birth as a teenager. She repented of her sins and accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Master of her life, loving the truth from her youth. She was consistent in her commitment to her Lord throughout life and was highly respected and loved by those who were privileged to know her.

Bertha married John LaVeau in Rice Lake on September 25, 1935. Three sons Donald, Gary and Duane were born to this union and Bertha was a faithful wife and mother who loved her family. She became a surrogate mother to several children who stayed in their home and often reminded me, after my mother's death, that I was one of her other sons.

In 1990, Bertha's husband Johnnie and her son Donald preceded her in death. A sister, Vera Toth, of Cameron, WI; two sons, Gary and Duane, 16 grandchildren and 27 great-grandchildren remain at her passing.

Bertha's mother-in-law, Sis Ella (Marberger) LaVeau, was an early pioneer worker in the Church of God serving as a spiritual leader at Rice Lake, WI. Bertha's mother in-law along with the John and Charles Shrock families,

were a few of the pioneer saints that helped establish the reformation truths in Wisconsin in the late 1800's and early 1900's. They were still members of the congregation at the time Bro Herbert Probst assumed pastoral leadership in the late 1940's.

Recently in reading a bound annual copy of the 1899 Gospel Trumpet, the Rice Lake congregation was referenced, and some of these very saints had authored articles in those issues.

As a young pastor's son, it fell my lot to mow yards, weed gardens, or carry coal for some of these older saints, and often when I arrived to knock on the door to get a key to the tool shed I would have to wait until I heard them finish prayer. I often heard them pleading with God for the Church of God, asking God's blessing on Bro. Probst and family, and over fifty-five years later those prayers still leave a lasting imprint on my mind and life!

Although it was a privilege and blessing to have personally known these early saints, I am reminded that to have known them means little unless we seek diligently after Truth and learn to walk humbly and prayerfully with God as they did.

Johnnie and Bertha LaVeau, along with other members of the LaVeau family, attended the Rice Lake congregation and became close friends of the Probst family during this time. Sis. Bertha loved the Church of God, dedicating her time and talent to the cause of truth. She willingly served the Lord as opportunity was presented and loved to attend services and share her faith and love for the Lord.

Bertha especially loved doctrinal truths of the Church of God and once remarked that if she had been called to preach she would have been a doctrinal preacher. At about 40 years of age Bertha was diagnosed with cancer and given little hope of life without major medical intervention and surgery. She chose instead to obey the Scripture and call for the elders of the church. After being anointed with oil, she was permanently healed in less than two weeks in answer to the prayer of faith! Outside of injuries sustained in a serious automobile accident several years ago, Bertha enjoyed good health until her death at age 92. When the choice was hers, she always chose to trust God as her Healer.

When Bro. Herbert Probst recognized the apostasy and worldly compromise that was

captivating the general movement known as the First Church of God, he chose to resign the pastorate and search for the old paths wherein is the good way. Johnnie and Bertha LaVeau, along with others in the congregation, who shared a mutual desire to return to the standards of godliness and holiness, willingly took their stand alongside Bro. Probst. In the early 50's, some of the LaVeau family assisted and accompanied the Probst family on their first visit to Monark Springs.

In later years, Johnnie and Bertha LaVeau made a trip with Bro. Herbert and Sis. Eva Probst to California, attending meetings in Pacoima and Pomona, and visiting Johnnie's brother who had moved to California from Wisconsin.

In April 1968, Bro. Willie C. Murphey and daughter Kathleen traveled to Wisconsin to be with Bro. and Sis. Dietrich and the congregation over Easter. The LaVeau's were among the number in attendance and the April 19, 1968 issue of the *Mission Trail* publication has a picture of Sis. Bertha LaVeau and family along with others from the area.

Sis. Bertha always had a testimony of victory and joy in the Lord, remarking often that she was just waiting for the Lord to take her home. Last year, during the Thanksgiving holidays, I made a trip to visit and encourage her and Bertha was very alert as she enjoyed the scriptures we shared and loved visiting on spiritual matters. She sang with us her favorite hymns from the *Evening Light Songs* hymnal. Her last comment before we left was that she was just waiting for the Lord to take her home and couldn't understand why He had not already done so.

When the family called to let us know that it didn't look like she would make it to Thanksgiving for our next visit, they mentioned that she had requested the song "When We Get Home" be sung at her memorial service. She always enjoyed singing the songs of Zion and somehow it seemed she joined the grandchildren and family as they and the congregation sang her favorite songs in her memory. The songs she loved spoke of victory and anticipation of the life beyond the grave and the family and friends are comforted knowing that she now helps "make those heavenly arches ring with songs of Home Sweet Home" as she joins the saints in heaven, singing one celestial song.

The congregation was reminded of times past when the only deterrent to God's judgment

and extension of mercy was the presence of a few godly people. The memorial service presented a challenge to the younger generation to fill the gap left by the departure of godly men and women from the earth.

Though Sis. Bertha will be missed by family and friends who enjoyed her in this life, our loss is her gain and the angels and heavenly hosts rejoice at her coming.

She fought a good fight, she finished her course, she kept the faith, and now has gone to receive the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, has prepared for those who love His appearing. (II Tim 4:7-8.)


