Ezekiel 14:12-14, "The word of the Lord came unto me, saying, Son of man, when the land sinneth against me by trespassing grievously, then will I stretch out mine hand upon it, and will break the staff of the bread thereof, and will send famine upon it, and will cut off man and beast from it. Though these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, they should deliver but their own souls by their righteousness, saith the Lord God."

Very few, if anyone, reading this has lived during a famine. Our stores and warehouses are filled with food. Most of our pantries and refrigerators have food in them and could have much more if buyers would spend their money for bulk grains instead of quick fix foods. What do people do when there is no food anywhere in

the land? They do whatever it takes to get food. What did the people in Israel do? They ate the leaves and bark off the trees. They ate animal hide and boiled bones and drank the broth. They bought animal dung and ate that. They fought over a few bites of food, sometimes taking it out of another's mouth. During some famines, women have roasted their babies and eaten them. What do countries do when famine leaves the people nothing but walking skeletons? They do whatever they can to get food. Even to becoming slaves to oppressive leaders. We Americans think we are starving after we have missed a few meals. What do you think we would do after a month without a bite of food and not another bite in sight? Are we any different than others? We also have a body which demands food daily.

What were the grievous sins that caused God to allow destruction to come on the Israelites? The predominate sin was idolatry. Did God abhor idolatry only because He is a jealous God? No! He also abhorred the sexual sins that were a part of idol worship. God loves people, and these sins cause men, women and children sickness, heartache and many other miseries. He created man so He could love and commune with people. God had already created all the beautiful things of nature and the animals. However, this did not totally satisfy God's heart. He created man and then He was satisfied, so He rested. But He is not satisfied when men are surrendering to their passions, causing heartache and misery for those around them.

Many kings of Israel allowed idol worship. King Solomon allowed his wives to bring it in. His son, Rehoboam, "built high places, and images and groves on every high hill and under every green tree" and he allowed sodomy in the land (I Kings 14:23) Asa, his son, "took away the sodomites and removed all the idols that his fathers had made" (I Kings 15:12.) Jehoshaphat also removed sodomy (homosexuality), (I Kings 22:46.) God blessed the people during those years, but there was much suffering when these sins were allowed. We all know that Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed because they were given over to this ungodly passion. They were also cities of suffering. God said, "The cry is great...because their sin is very grievous." Strangers could not even visit the city without being molested. (Genesis 18:20;19:1-5.)

For fear of losing his people, King Jeroboam built two golden calves for worship so the people would not go to the temple in Jerusalem for worship. Then he made priests (leaders) of the lowest of the people. God sent a prophet to warn Jeroboam, and he rent the altar on which sacrifices to the calves were made. When Jeroboam reached out to catch the prophet and punish him, Jeroboam's arm stiffened until the prophet prayed for him. All this was to show the king that he was doing evil, but he paid no attention. Later God destroyed his family from the earth. (I Kings 13:33.)

Americans have many idols: beauty, wealth, fame, sports, religion, the green earth and its creatures, etc. A great percentage of people are worshiping a golden calf. Of course it is not shaped like a calf. But many are so possessed with the covetous spirit that they will do almost anything for money; kill defenseless babies, sell their own bodies, influence innocent children to buy drugs, steal from the senile, and cheat in countless ways just to get another dollar. This list could be almost endless. All these things are being done because prople are grasping for money. This and all other idols are in people's hearts as spoken of in Ezekiel 14. is however idolatry, just as worshipping images of sticks or stones. To every person who has an idol in his heart, God says, "I will set my face against that man... and I will cut him off... and ye shall know that I am the Lord." Verse 8.

Jeremiah 14:15-18, "Therefore thus saith

the Lord concerning the prophets that prophesy in my name and I sent them not, yea they say, Sword and famine shall not be in this land; By sword and famine shall those prophets be consumed. And the people to whom they prophesy shall be cast out...I will pour their wickedness upon them. Therefore thou shalt say this word unto them. Let mine eyes run down with tears night and day, and let them not cease: for the virgin daughter of my people is broken with a great breach...If I go forth into the field, than behold the slain with the sword! and if I enter into the city, then behold them that are sick with famine! Yea, both the prophet and the priest go about into a land that they know not."

Many preachers and leaders are trying to assure us that conditions in our country will soon be fine again. However, according to God's Word, America is headed for trouble because of our grievous sins; homosexuality, abortion, idolatry, greed, blasphemy, disrespect for authority, etc. We hear many voices crying "Change! Change! We will change things in America and everyone will have plenty. There will be homes for the homeless, food and clothing for the poor, free education for the ambitious, medicine for the sick, peace with other nations, and freedom to live in homosexuality and kill the defenseless." But God says in I Thessalonians 5:3, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety, then sudden destruction will come upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape."

Sin has been in the world since the beginning. However God has always blessed those nations which respected Him and His precepts and brought to punishment those who dared to disobey His laws. He has allowed destruction to come on those nations that had leaders who permitted sinning grievously against God.

What can we Christians do? We can do as Jeremiah did. He said, "Let mine eyes run down with tears night and day, and let them not cease." Daniel could not stop the Medians from taking over Babylon. Neither could Job stop whatever the men of his time had brought on themselves. So let us pray that our leaders will not allow homosexuality, abortion and other grievous sins which will bring destruction on America. Do we in America want God to allow a famine or other destruction? There is only one way to keep that from happening. Stop the grievous sins in our nation!



The box arrived in the morning mail with a label, "Fragile, Handle With Editorials Care," clearly indicating the delicate nature of the contents. However, when the recipient opened the pack-

age it was evident that the warning had not been regarded, for the contents were severely damaged in transit due to rough handling. For those

who receive a moderate volume of parcels through the various mail couriers it is quite likely some of your packages have also been damaged.

Sometimes the damage to the merchandise is due to insufficient packaging materials being placed around the article to cushion it from the normal bumps it may be expected to encounter in route to its destination. For a fragile parcel to arrive safely, it requires more than a warning label conspicuously stuck on the box-care on the part of the person packaging the item, and proper handling by the company who transports it are both essential. When both parties fulfill their responsibilities the number of damaged parcels can be greatly reduced.

There are things in our lives that are also fragile and should be handled with care. Obviously, those things that have the greatest value should be handled with the greatest care. In Matthew 16:26 Jesus placed the value of a man's soul above the wealth of the whole world when He asked the question, "For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?" A warning sticker on our soul, to remind us to be careful with it, would not be misplaced. As Jesus pointed out, there is nothing we can give in exchange for our soul.
