JEHOVAH – JIREH

Abraham stretched forth his hand to slay his son Isaac, the angel of

the Lord stopped him. Abraham lifted up his eyes and saw a ram caught in the thicket. He offered the ram as a burnt offering in the stead of his son. "And Abraham called the name of that place *Jehovahjireh*: as it is said to this day, In the mount of the LORD it shall be seen" (Genesis 22:14).

Jehovah is the personal name of the one true, living, eternal, self-existent God. "Jireh" translates into "provide," which has wonderful Latin roots. *Pro* means "before" and *vide* means "to see." So it means that God saw in advance. Jehovah-Jireh, the Lord who provides, is the God who sees the need of His people before they even know there is a need.

In the deepest trial and problem, the power of God will be revealed at the right time and He, Jehovah-Jireh, will provide. God sees the questions, financial difficulties, health problems, relationship stresses, personal struggles and failures, temptations, emotional needs, spiritual weaknesses, and the obstacles of life. He not only sees but has provided a "ram in the thicket."

God sent His son, Jesus Christ, to provide a way out of sin and despair and to minister to every need that we have in life. Through Christ,

He has provided us with peace in the time of trouble. He has made provision for physical, emotional, and spiritual healing. "With His stripes we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). God is the provider of temporal things. "Your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things" (Matthew 6:32). God not only will but has already provided a way, an answer, rest and comfort. He is the provider of courage, strength, forgiveness and love. He dispenses sufficient grace that will help in the time of need (Hebrews 4:16).

Abraham was obedient to God even when he did not know the consequences and final outcomes of his decision. His faith in God transcended the personal questions and difficulty of God's call. His faith was evidenced by his instruction to the servants: "Abide ye here....I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and come again to you" (Genesis 22:5). Abraham further told Isaac that "God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering" (Genesis 22:8). Clearly, Abraham trusted that the Lord would provide, but he did not allow his hope to curtail his obedience. We will find the fullness of Jehovah-Jireh when we have a similar faith and obedience.



This past summer marked the 75th year of the National Campmeeting at Monark Springs, Missouri--a place many people have found themselves drawn back to through the years. The nostalgic element is there: the wood benches, the open-air tabernacle, the ringing of the early morning bell, the background noise of the locusts during the quieter parts of the service, that "certain smell" after a good rain, the friends, the harmonious blending of voices in song, the word of God preached from the pulpit bringing encouragement or challenge. Maybe you haven't visited Monark Springs, but is there another place you visit--a

Hide Behind the Cross



"He must increase, but I must decrease."

What a powerful and profound statement! Those were the words of John the Baptist, and they should give us all pause.

To me my father was a great man; and it would be hard to find anyone who ever knew him to argue against that statement. He was a minister, a missionary, a Sunday school teacher, and a personal worker extraordinaire. And he excelled in them all. But why was he great?

His message to me was, "Son, stay hid behind the cross of Christ. Don't put yourself on display in any

way. This is about the Gospel, not us." And that is what he did. And that is how he lived. He put Christ in the forefront. He was not self-focused. He did not have an exaggerated sense of his importance or place in the body of Christ. He neither sought nor asked for recognition. He sought only to magnify the Lord in all that he did. He was a humble man who stayed hid behind the cross of Christ. Let us do that, too.

We live in such a narcissistic society. How easy it is for us to be self-focused. It's so very human. "Helloooo! this is ME"! I remember taking a business course in college. The professor assigned us to write a business letter to be turned in at the next class. I was pretty satisfied with my letter and pumped up to get it turned in, thinking, "Smith, you've done a pretty good piece of work here...you're bound to get a good grade" (youthful pride). But instead, he told us to pull out our letters and

circle every "I", "me", and "my." As we looked over our letters, I kind of hunkered down in the seat and cast a furtive look around the room (hope he doesn't have us read our letters). I was ashamed and did not want to turn that letter in....too many I's, me's, and my's! We all saw the point of the assignment. He then asked us to rewrite our letters, de-emphasizing the "I" and emphasizing the "message" and the "you." Whether he knew it or not, that professor was teaching a basic tenant of the Christian faith! Let us die to ourselves and focus on others and on presenting only the message of Christ to a lost world.
